SOLUTION：Special Events Calander，page 2 of each month＇s PROMENADER．

USE
1．Before scheduling any dance，even a regular club dance，check the Special Events Calander for conflicts on that date．
2．As soon as your Special Dance is scheduled，send it into the PROMENADER so it can be included in the next month＇s Special Events Calander．（Submit each dance on a seperate $3 \times 5$ index card with＂Special Events＂writ－ ten on it．Be sure to include all info．）
3．Submit these Special Dances as far in advance as possible．Let other clubs know of your Special Dance so they can make up their schedules．Submit your special Dance a year or so before the dance．
ABUSE
1．Not listing a Special Dance．In order to have your Special Dance listed on the Special Events Calander，it must be su：mitted to the PROMENADER！（Preferably on a $3 \times 5$ index card with＂Special Events＂written on it．） 2．Not checking the Special Events Calander before scheduling a dance．How do you know that date isn＇t taken if you don＇t check？
3．Don＇t use the Special Events Calander for advertis－ ing．Truly，a club would not have more than three Special Dances a year！When lesser events are entered into the Special Events Calander the calander looses its effect．It becomes long，costly and meaningless． 4．A listing in the Special Evenss Całander does not guarantee you exclusive rights to that date．Another club is free to use that date，but that club knows it is competing with your Special Dance．（l find most clubs won＇t compete，but are glad to cooperate！）

## RAF PUBLICITY COMMITTEE

As announced in last month＇s PROMENADER，the Fed－ eration established a Publicity Committee whose objec－ tive this year is to produce a TV commercial to help promote Square Dancing in the Greater Rochester Area． The commercial would run during August to supplement new dancer recruiting efforts．

The cost to produce a $30-$ second video tape com－ ercial is approximately $\$ 350$ ．Air time must be purc－ hased as well．Costs for air times vary depending on the time of day，programming，ets．Although air time is less expensive in August，we must purchase as many sep－ arate time slots as possible for maximum effectiveness．

We have been encouraged by the positive reaction this proposal has received from the Square Dance com－ munity．Dancers were first made aware of this goal at the March 13th PROMENADER Benefit Dance，and $\$ 182$ was donated that day．Since then，announcements have been made at some area clubs，and dancers have donated to support this proposal．To everyone who has contributed， THANK YOU．To those who have not yet done so，please consider the impact this project could have，and donate． We ask every club in the area to collect money at one of their dances during May if they have not already done so．If everyone donated one dollar，we could finance this project．This is a＇Dollar a dancer＇effort．Do． nations may be sent to the RAF Publicity Committee，C／o The Shaws， 19 DaVinci Drive，Rochester，New York 14624.

In addition to producing and airing a TV commer－ cial，the Publicity Committee will utilize as many forms of free advertising as possible．We plan to do whatever we can to promote the activity and make the public aware of it ．

Please help．Many dance programs will be ending in a few weeks．If we are to help increase class sizes In September，we must have funds to act on this pro－ posal．

## SQuare-dance levels and callerlab

Callerlab is an organization that was formed in 1971 by a very small group of nationally-known and respected callers. It grew rapidly, and held its first International Convention in 1974. Its main purposes are to improve communications among square-dance callers and to correct what they saw to be harmful tendencies in square dancing. One of the problems was that every caller and his brother was writing new calls at a great rate, and teaching them to his dancers as "the latest thing" in dancing. By December 1972 there were 1540 (thats right, one thousand, five hundred and forty!) calls listed, and by December 1982 there were 3835. That's an increase of close to 130 calls each year, and all the Mainstream vocabulary is listed under 68 calls!

Callerlab's biggest job to date has been to try to make some sense out of this tremendous flood of "new" calls. They sorted out the calls, particularly the old and time-proven ones, into groups, and arranged the most usable of them in the order that they might best be taught. The first three of these groups are labeled Starting Basics, Extended Basics, and Mainstream. The calls up through the Mainstream list are what most new dancers in this area are supposed to learn before going to the regular club dances. After Mainstream comes the Plus series of calls, which was known as plus One and Plus Tyn before 1082. For those who want to learn more calls there come next the Advanced-1 and Advanced-2 calls, and then Challenge-1, Challenge-2, and Challenge3. Any dancer who wants to get into the Advanced and Challenge calls must figure on spending more than one or two nights a week on workshopping. Callerlab also periodically picks out a few "QS" or Quarterly Selection calls that a caller may try out on his dancers and find out how well they are liked.

The big advantage of having a standardized grouping of calls is that people from all over the square-dance world can dance together, with confidence that if a particular dance or club is labeled as Mainstream for instance, they all know the same calls and can dance together with minimum difficulty. At least they can if they have similar styling habits, which is another whole story by itself. The same thing holds for beginners' clubs or classes: if their teachers are teaching the calls in the same order and at the same rate, members of several classes can dance together at any time and all be familiar with the same set of calls.

And that brings us to Levels. The groups of calls, from Starting Basics to Mainstream to Challenge, are commonly called Levels of dancing. And the trouble with that is that the very word "level" implies that there are higher and lower levels, and everybody of course-wants to be a "high level" dancer. "Dance Level" becomes confused with "Vocabulary Level," and it is an easy step to the conclusions that the way to become a better dancer is to learn the names of a lot more calls, and that a club labeled Mainstream Plus is a better club than one that is "only" Mainstream. Actually, these labels get abused quite a lot:-- the Callerlab definition of a Mainstream Plus club is one where the members know all of the Mainstream calls, all of the current Quarterly Selections, and all the calls on the Plus list, so a caller can use any and all of these calls without having to workshop any one of them. How many clubs do you know that can dance all of the variations of "And Roll," which is No. 2 on the Plus list?

Callerlab also recommends that new dancers should have 42 weekly sessions to learn the Mainstream vocabulary of calls, and then dance with these calls for a year before trying to learn more vocabulary. With that experience most will be ready to start on a new vocabulary level, if that fits their taste. Many dancers continue to workshop new calls and thoroughly enjoy the process, and there is certainly nothing wrong with that. If that is your thing, you should know that the further you go in vocabulary level, the more important it is to have a thorough understanding of all of the calls that come ahead of the ones you are learning.

If that is really not your dish of tea, neither is there anything to be ashamed of in not wanting to spend a Tot of time in workshopping, but enjoying the dancing at the vocabulary level where you are and getting better acquainted with the calls that you have already learned. After all, isn't the question to be answered on the bottom line "How much fun and real satisfaction are you getting out of your square dancing," and not "How many calls do you know"?

Here is a quote from Jerry Schatzer, a California caller, in an article in Square Dance magazine for January 1982:
"There will always be an element, a segment of our dancing society, who will become primarily square puzzlesolvers, but that percentage of dancers is extremely small. I find that the vast majority of dancers, even at the Advanced and Challenge levels, still want to DANCE in time to the music. It's true that they demand more variety, both formation and basic-name variety, but even challenge dancers tire quickly of 'close-order-drill' type of choreograhy."

CARMEN'S COLUMN


In days gone by the clubs would recruit their classes, nurture them step by step, and occasionally have a party dance at which the class and club would dance the evening together. As a rule, the class would dance only once a week (which many consider a big commitment to make) and there was no pressure to do more. THE LAST GREAT RESOURSE

In recent years, club memberships have generally decreased while the inter-class dances have increased. In the face of declining membership along with increased caller and hall fees, our last great resourse is being tapped for revenues - the classes. Maybe individually, the classes are small, but a dance with them all combined can provide a good portion of the club's annual operating expenses. Can it be there is a push to cash in on the enthusiasm of our newest dancers by clubs and callers alike? Are we creating a monster that will cause dancers burnout before graduation? Practically every big dance now includes the classes. Some clubs openly advertise their classes open to people attending other classes, this must make continuity difficult, but read into this what you will. We often see several class-club dances scheduled the same night. I understand the profit motive, but 1 think most will agree that the uncontrolled way we are rushing dancers into the activity can only be damaging in the long run. ADVANTAGES

The advantages of extra dancing is obvious - it gives them more practice. Visiting other clubs enables them to meet other people, make new friends, and gives them an idea of the scope of the activity in this area. Hearing a different caller use the same material they have learned in a different way also has its advantages. DISADVANTAGES

I used to think, the more dancing and different callers a learner was exposed to, the better it would be for him/her. Perhaps this may still be true, but I can also see a potential for discouragement in an uncontrolled environment. First, there is pressure of increasing their commitment beyond which they intended. Second, there is the potential discouragement of jeing exposed to material which they have not been taught, nor are they ready for. Teaching new material at these dances is depriving the instructor from introducing it in the manner which is intended. Shouldn't the focus of these inter-class dances be to practice the material they have ALREADY learned?

## ADDRESSING THE CALLER

Callers are not blamless. They can and do cause great damage. Many dancers are turned off and some drop out after being exposed to callers who use poor judgement in material selection and workshop calls above mainstream, presumably to show how smart they are.

If one of the purposes of enter-class dances is to provide new dancers more practice, let's do just that and stop teaching calls that are new to them. Leave that task to the instructor. We, who have classes, can also help by sticking as closely as possible to the CALLERLAB recommended teaching order. We can then establish a 10 -week level, 20 -week level, etc. ADDRESSING THE CLUBS

Let's not encourage people to dance with our classes at random. Advertising your class open to anyone at any time only suggests 'pirating' people from other classes. Besides, it must play havoc with class continuity. Keep your classes closed except in special circumstances. Be careful of scheduling. Check out the

date and announce it as early as possible through the "PROMENADER" so as to avoid conflicts. Competing dances in a single night not only reduces attendance at both dances, but creates hard feelings.
A POSSIBLE SOLUTION
Let's let the dancer Federation of clubs (the most logical group) take charge of coordinating inter-class dances. Since nobody wins when we compete - let's cooperate! What about a calander listing all comming inter-class dances in the area distributed to all clubs for the comming season, and only listing one dance on any given night.

This is a good chance for new dencers, or dancers who haven't been coming every week, but would like to get back into dancing and meeting dear friends again, to brush up their dancing toes. Hope to see a lot of new and old friends there.

Chuck Prister (by the time this paper is printed) will have had his triple-by-pass heart surgery. Good luck and hopes that Chuck $\&$ Gerry will be back dancing with us soon, are extended from EKC-O Squares.
