## PRESIDENTS*

## CORNER



The Federation meeting for September was a busy one. A number of changes in the By-Laws had been proposed in June, and a decision on each one was required.
The most important change was in the definition of a quorum of the members which can legally do business at a meeting. The old requirement was so large that it was almost never attained, and we greatly appreciate the cooperation of all the people who made a special effort to attend this meeting to approve the new rule.
A slight change was made to the conditions under which a calleroperated club can become affiliated with the Federation, intended to ensure that the delegates represent the dancers rather than the caller. (Callers are represented in the Federation by delegates from the Callers' Co.op.)

In the past, a club whose delegates could not attend a given meeting could be represented only by its two principal officers. This was changed to allow any member of the club to be appointed to attend and vote. It was separately ruled that minutes of the meeting would be sent only to the regular delegate, not to the substitute. Attendance by regutar delegates is important to the continuity of Federation work, but in their necessary absence substitute delegates are helpful.
The Publicity Committee reported on the TV commercial activity and were warmly applauded for their good work on this important activity. We hope you all saw both the 10 -second and the 30 -second versions during the campaign and that the effort helped bring recruits into your classes. (We have noted with appreciation that several club Open Houses have been listed in newspaper calendars. Nice work, club officers.)

In our last column we asked for your comments on Federation and related activities. We got no response at all. No problems? No interest? Poor season to ask, what with Labor Day etc.? We still want your ideas: just drop us a line at 225 Cobb Terrace, 14620, call us at 473-7672, or leave a message on Jim's answering machine, day or night, at 422-9075.

While persuing the 1983 National Square Dance Directory, I noticed that the Dallas-Ft. Worth area has seven singles clubs, while the Kansas City area also seven, and the Tulsa area has six. The single Square Dance dynamism in these cities is part of an accelerating national trend.

Considering that Tulsa is a city of equal magnitude to Rochester it is valid to assume that Rochester also has the potential to house six or more single Square Dance Clubs. In Rochester, Mike Harris, Mike Callahan and Jerry Carmen have pioneered in singles club calling.

I believe these three callers can be pivotal in fetermining whether Rochester single square dancing can _. grow to six or more clubs in the next couple of years. Toward this end it would be very desirable for these three callers and other dedicated square dance activists to establish some kind of committee of the Federation charged with coordinating single square dance development.

For sound and not haphazard single square dance growth in its present embryonic stage, is is important for such a committee to systematically organize the entire annual calendar and schedule of single square dance activities so that each single square dancer is afforded the maximum number of conveniently timed square and round classes as well as dances. This, of course, means eliminating conflicting classes and dances, which needlessly pit singles clubs aginst each other vying for the same pool of dancers. But the committee ought to go far beyond simply eliminating conflicts.

My case is illustrative of the present amorphousness of single square dancing in Rochester and of how the above committee could instill planned scheduling here enabling the vigorus growth of clubs seen in Tulsa, etc.

Living, as many singles, an hour from Rochester, I am realistically able to commute to Rochester singles dancing once a week, on Saturday or Sunday. By combing the PROMENADER, I learned that my best option to pack the most single dancing into one day, was to attend the Libertis' round lessons Sunday afternoon and the Cloverleaf Sunday night square dancing, both in Greece.

This option does not give me what I need for maximum personal advancement, but it is the best compromise. If the above type committee were to organize the Rochester singles dance calendar, $I$ and other singles would advance our skills much faster.

I have graduated from mainstream classes, but $\mid$ lack plus. I go to Cloverleaf and guess through the plus calls. This isn't my fault. Plus singles classes are presently taught in Rochester May-October. Here I am in the October-May cycle stranded with other singles who need plus now.

The aspiration of myself and many Rochester singles is to eventually graduate into advanced single square dancing. Rochester is ripening for an advanced single club, which would logically be Rochester's fourth, bringing us closer to Kansas City, Tulsa, and the big league cities. But to make Rochester a big leaguer in singles dancing, we need a more organized schedule for our prosently amorphous farm system.

To enable myself and all singles to train and prepare for tommorow's advanced and other clubs that can and should emerge in Rochester, there should be singles mainstream, plus and advanced classes running both cycles May-October and October-May.

Where in the present October-May cycle Rochester has three competing mainstream single classes (yet no plus or advanced classes) the above committee could effect a division of labor. For example, Merry Mixers could run the mainstream class, Cloverleaf could run the plus and Swinging Singles the advanced class.

The above committee's correction of the present inefficient singles scheduling would inspire class and singles dancers in Rochester, as has been achieved in Dallas and Kansas City.

## CARMEN'S COLUMN



Probably you have never thought of learning new calls as an art, but we have all seen some people soak up calls as if they were a sponge, and we have seen others flounder around as if they were trying to follow a Greek auctioneer (yes, there are auctioneers in Greece)! Why do some seem to have a natural ability to retain and build on what is being taught and others seem to have difficulty discerning their right hand from their left? I belleve I have noticed some differences between the 'slow learners' and those who catch on quickly. The two major differences which separate the groups are (1) they are observant and (2) they pay attention - they listen. Plying upon the old addage between the donkey and the two-by-four, 1 believe this is a direct challenge to callers as teachers. Before you can teach anything, you've just got to get their attention. This is the callers most difficult job and one which $i^{1} \mathrm{~m}$ sure most callers are working on to improve.

Specifically, what can we as dancers do to improve in learning? Well, just as one can train to be an artist, we can also train ourselves to learn; that is, to be observant and listen. I find occasionally to direct people into a certain formation l will say things such as, the men should all be holding right hands with a girl, and, invariably, there will be a man holding left hands with a girl who will not budge. He is obviously not listening and this is the most important rule. Always assume the caller is talking to you! Never assume you know what's going to happen next and get ahead of the instruction. Many times you will not only confuse yourself, but seven other people as well. This is also one of the reasons 'experienced dancers break down or make mistakes at a class session.

The next most important rule is to be observant. All calls start from a certain formation such as lines or ocean waves. Notice what the formation is. Notice where you are when you start the call and where you are when you complete it. What! You say you can't remember? Take a small pad with you and write it down You forgot by the time the tip ended? Go ask the caller. He'll be glad to explain it again.

Some people genuinely have difficulty remembering all the moves they are asked to make and, indeed, as the quantity and complexity of the calls grow, this becomes a real problem. At this point, if we use our number one rule of listening, we will find the caller will often describe the call as we do it. There are many other tricks that some experienced dancers have learned, such as walking around with your hands up about shoulder tiigh so someone can guide you, or watching what their opposite person is doing since square dancing is generally symmetrical.

Another very helpjul thing is to train yourself early in the game how to know whether you've done a $1 / 4,1 / 2$, or $3 / 4$ turn. Develope you own system and practice it and you'll find it will be useful all your dancing life.

I hope these thoughts have helped someone. $\mathrm{Re}^{-}$ member, you can either listen or talk. You can't do both. So, while the dance is in progress, keep listening!

Autumn is here with its cool crisp days and nights and our club is getting back into the swing of things. Also a big thank you to the club members for recruiting a fine group for our class.

By the time you read this our 25th Anniversary Party shall be history. A great big thank you to Fran and Hal Abberger and their committee who worked so hard in order that we could have a memorable celebration. The next time you see a club member, look for the new 25 year addition to our club badges.

We are sorry to hear that Ed Haddleton had a relapse and ended up in the hospital again, but last report was that he is now home and on his way to recovery. Ed, we know it is hard to keep a good man down. Also on our sick list are Carolyn Zoller, John Downs and Pat Wallace. We all wish them a speedy recovery.
