## 'E GOT 'EM! ARE WE GOING TO KEEP 'EM??

It's hard to tell just how much good our TV advertising campaign did, but a recent phone survey showed over 430 new dancers in various classes this year. One club has 70 people, several have over 30. This is a great start for the year. The big question is: from the 430, how many will be dancing in 1985?
This perennial question was the subject of Jerry Carmen's column in October, and we discussed it in the October Federation meeting. Our conclusion: the loss of new dancers in their first year after graduation is probably the most critical problem facing square dancing today, nationwide and locally.

Perhaps Jerry's statement that this must be solved by the individual clubs is correct, but the Federation as a coordinating group would not be doing its job if it did not study the problem and look for solutions. We concluded that it was too complex a question to be addressed in the Federation meeting, and a special committee should be formed. Two or three volunteered, but we need several more who are interested in this question and may have ideas to contribute. Present and former club officers, callers. long-term dancers, new dancers, dancers who have quit: all of these are good candidates. Are you one of these? Do you know one that ought to be included? Probably the comittee will meet 4 or 5 times over as many months.

If you are interested in the future health of the square dancing hobby, you should be concerned with this issue. Please let us know of your interest or the name of anyone you think should be involved. GOOD angel!! Is there any other kind?? Well, the kind of angels in Heaven are perfect, but the angels that help us so much with our square-dance classes are still here on earth, and being human, they are still subject to error. And the message of this notice is how to help the class members without passing your errors on to them, who don't yet know nearly as much about square dancing as you do.

Let's start off by setting down the Golden Rule for angels, and then seeing some of the different ways to follow that rule. It may involve some angles (Angles on Angels?) that you never thought of. The rule is:

## IN ANY CLASS, THERE IS ONLY ONE TEACHER!

Unless he himself asks for assistance, that teacher should always be the person that your club is paying to come and conduct the class. He not only knows what to teach, but he has in all probability had a lot of experience in how to teach.

Do...be quiet while the teacher is talking or calling; don't drown him out, don't say or do anything that will distract the student from what the caller is saying. Especially don't try to add helpful comments, because you will only confuse the poor student who is trying to listen to two sets of instructions at the same time.
Do...listen carefully while the teacher is talking or calling: show the students by example that the teacher needs and deserves their full attention. Who knows?maybe you will learn something about the basic calls that slipped past you the first time around.
Do...listen carefully to what the teacher is saying: be sure you understand what he wants the students to do and exactly how he wants them to do it. And do it that way yourself. Don't introduce twirls and other flourishes to the class, and especially don't substitute a "Hungarian Swing" for a proper Dos-A-Dos;-- they'll learn bad habits soon enough without your help.

DO...help the students by being exactly where you are supposed to be at all times. Be guideposts to help the students locate themselves, and teach them by example how important is precise positioning.

Do...by your example, help teach the dancers to take hands whenever possible. Among several other advantages, this is a great source of guidance and assurance to the students. But your guidance should be confined to gentle hints; don't try to push or pull them around. They will learn much faster and better when they are allowed to make their own mistakes. Pointing or some other hand gesture will often be enough. Verbal comments should be limited to a quick "Turn left," "Stand still," etc. said in a low voice to someone who is right next to you, if you see they are confused in the middle of a movement.

DO...after the end of a tip, tell the teacher about anyone who seems to be having special difficulty with a movement. Don't try to straighten him/her/them out by yourself. Send them to the teacher for extra help, even if they ask you questions about the square-dance movements. Besides giving the students an answer straight from the horse's mouth, it will also help the teacher to keep in touch with the progress of his class. (next col 4

QUARTERLY STATUS REPORT

As the United Dancers of America, Inc. begins it's third year, growth of the Square Dance activity continues to be the emphas is of the newly elected officers. With the growth of the movement comes the need for communication and interaction of the various groups which make-up the activity. These needs are the keys which bring about organization.

While most of the frontiers have been developed, there are still regions within the Country which have only recently joined together to represent the Square Dancers within their area.

As a result of the widespread acceptance of the United Square Dancers of America's outstanding economical medical and liability insurance program, it is being offered again for the 1984 calendar year at an even greater savings. Due to the large numbers who participated in 1983 the premi um for this fine coverage has been reduced to $\$ 1.00$ per dancer for the entire year. Included with this dancer medical policy is $\$ 1,000,000$ of public liability protection for their participating clubs, area associations and regional organizations.

While the goals of the United Square Dancers of America closely resemble those of numerous other Square Dance organizations, the USDA has the capability of focusing greater attention to these goals through it's large membership - now more than 135,000 dancers. As a result, it is to the benefit of all organizations to cooperate to achieve these goals which we all share - the advancement, growth, development and general betterment of the activity for the mutual benefit of all - Square Dancers and non-dancers alike.

ANGELS - continued
DO...if you think the teacher is overlooking something or is mistaken about something, ask him about it first. If you are still not satisfied with his answer, the next place to go is to one of the club officers. Don't get the students involved in something they are not yet equipped to understand, and especially don't say or do anything that might lessen the students' respect for their teacher. That would be doing a great disservice to the teacher, the class, the club, and eventually to yourself.

Do...remember that you are there to help the class learn. Good Angels on the floor will help them learn faster, but the main reason for having angels is to fill in squares so that no class member has to sit out and miss the practice that they need so much. The class members could get through a lot of material if there were three couples of expert dancers in each set, but remember that the important thing is for them to learn for themselves how to dance when there aren't a lot of angels around.

Do....remember that square dancing is supposed to be fun. Being in a class can be a very enjoyable and satisfying experience, and so can being there as an angel to help them learn, even though the dancing is quite different from what you do at club dances. If you go to classes with that attitude, the students are bound to catch it from you. (Continued on page 9.)

Do...reassure the students when they do something right. Mostly, a smile and a nod are enough.

DO...remember that people learn things at different rates and degrees of ease. Be especially friendly and encouraging to those who learn more slowly than others. Very often these, with help lasting through the class and after graduation too, will become very good dancers and still be supporting the club long after the hotshots have either gone on to "higher" things or have burned themselves out and disappeared.

Do...give the teacher a compliment once in a while for something he's done well. He's human too, and appreciates a kind word just like the rest of us.

Do...sit down and make friends with the class members during the rest perlods, instead of gathering in one corner, in a walled camp of club members.

Do...especially the ladies, be prepared to answer questions about clothing and refer them to local sources, particularly the ones who advertise in the Promenader.

Above all, DO remember that you are not only helping the class members learn to dance, but also playing an important part in forming their attitude toward the square-dance world, and your own club in particular.

## ROCHESTER AREA FEDERATION OF WESTERM <br> HOUND AND SQUARE DAECE CLUES ITC.

PURPOSE: 1. Provide information about and promote interest in Western Style Round and Square Dancing - through such activities as may be expedient to the Executive Conmittee.
2. Operate as a service Organization in co-ordinating club activities, with no voice in the internal affairs of member clubs.

Inorder to execute these goals the Federation has set up various committees and programs.

1. Domonstration Committee: When a community group (shopping malls, scouts, Lilac Festival, etc.) desires an exhibition of Square Dancing, this committee goes into swing to organize and put on a demonstration of square dancing. This committee will coordinate callers and dancers for the Deomonstration.
2. Publicity Committee: This newly formed committee is working to advertise square dancing to the public by means of T.V., radio and newspaper.
3. PROMENADER: This publication was extablished to work as communications for our square dancers.
4.Banner Stealing Program: This program promotes visitation between clubs. When a visiting club brings a square of dancers to another club, the visiting club may "steal" that club's traveling banner. Friendship, cooperation and communication between clubs is promoted by this program.
4. Dance-0-Rama Committee. This committee organizes and holds the yearly dance sponsored by the Federation. Funds recieved from this dance are used to fund the various programs of the Federation and the operation of the Federation itself.
5. The Insurance Committee. This committee has been working hard lately to acquire an insurance slicy to cover clubs and dancers. Many clubs wish to - cearry insurance to protect the club and its members. Some clubs also are required to carry it in order to use various halls. Clubs have found it expedient to join together to carry this insurance through the Federation.
6. Leadership Seminas: Each year, Callers Co- $^{-}$ op of Rochester and the Federation co-sponsor a leadership seminar to help in club leadership and discuss the direction of Square Dancing in this area. ALL square dancers are welcome to attend.

The R.A.F. has as much potential as its volunteers are willing to give. With friendly cooperation and work of $i$ ts members, the Federation has accomplished a lot in the past and holds the seeds for even greater accomplishments in the future. Let's all nurture and care for these seeds, by a spirit of helpfulness, cooperation and volunteerism.
