# LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE 

Dancers from twenty-five clubs and representatives from Buffalo and Syracuse attended the Leadership Conference on Feb. 5. Attendees recieved information on new clubs, caller changes, location changes, classes, associate membership, and round dancing from a panel of experienced club officers and leaders. The Pubiicity Committee summerized its 183 Campaign and is awaiting direction from the square dance community on its future efforts.

Bruce Shaw presented a new Proposal on dancer retension. The focus of this proposal is the recommendation that Plus Work Shops be postponed until the fall dance season to give our new graduates time to enjoy a and experience what they have learned in classes. The intention is to reduce pressure on the new dancer to move quicklyto the Plus Program. The chart below indicates how the proposal would work.

A follow up meeting will be held on March 4 , 3:00 pm, at The Covenant Methodist Church, 1124 Culver Road, to discuss this proposal and other topics. All interested dancers are welcome.

## Rules for

 Banner Stealing1. Clubs wishing to take part in Banner Stealing, must register with the local Banner Stealing Association. (Rochester Federation)
2. Those clubs Registering with the Association, must have a minature Banner (Traveling) that will be used for stealing.
3. In order to steal a member club's banner, the visiting (Stealing Club) Club, must have no less than Four (4) couples (One Square), who have paid the guest fee at the host club. A Representative of the stealing club, must then make it known to the President of the host Club that, they are attending the, dance for the Purpose of Stealing the host clubs Banner. it In the event that more than one club is in attendance for the purpose of stealing the host club's Banner, then it will be the duty of the President of the Host Club to determine some fair way in which to determine which of the visiting (stealing) club's will be awarded the banner.
4. Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve said banner by sending no less than four couples to the stealing club's dance and then they can take their banner back home. If a retrieving club also wishes to be eligible to steal the banner of their hosts, they must then have a second four (4) couples in order to be eligible.

## Letter

to the

SNOOTY DANCERS


Jerry Carmen had a "snooty dancer" test in the February issue, and 1 took it. Most of the questions have got a good point, but most of the questions have also got more angles than just black or white. Here are my answers to the same questions.

Q: Do you get annoyed at those who make mistakes?
A: No, I don't get annoyed at people just for making mistakes. I get annoyed at people who are making mistakes all the time and don't even know or care that they are making mistakes. I also get annoyed with people who are always bugging the caller to call the latest fancy calls, and can't do the simple basics.

Q: Have you ever walked by a square that wasn't full?
A: Yes, when I have already waved and started to a square across the hall that needs a couple, and some others get up off their chairs and try to intercept me halfway across. I also sometimes make detours to avoid the people in the first question.

Q: Have you ever danced in set-up squares more than twice?
A: No, but sometimes I like to be sure of dancing with some special friends, and I don't think once or twice in an evening is too often.

Q: Have you ever danced while guests sat out because they couldn't get into a square?
A: This one's got more angles to it than a lawyer. In the first place, are you talking about guests who are invited to the dance and don't pay to get in, or paying visitors? In a large club anybody who wants to can practically always get into a square if they'll jump up and get in as soon as the music starts, and if they just sit until everybody else is squared up should somebody else be responsible for it? Besides, in a large club, if somebody is supposed to be responsible, the responsibility should be passed around.

Q: Did you ever avoid a square because it was all beginners?
A: Yes, after l've been in one a couple of times. I also try to break them up and get them spread around with older dancers.

Q: Do you stay away from "low level" clubs?
A: What do you mean by "low level"? If you mean they don't know a lot of calls, a good caller can take almost any old bunch of calls and give everybody a real fun dance. If you mean a low level of dancing ability, the answer to the first question still goes.

Q: Have you ever walked out of a square?
A: No, and I wouldn't do it except in the worst circumstances, like some guy using really crude language to my wife.

Q: Do you stay home or go to another dance when your club has an open house?
A: Yes. After several years 1 feel like we've paid our dues, and it's time for the newer members to take over. Besides, we don't have as much spare energy as we used to, and it's more tiring to help out in an open house or class than to go to a good dance. We would go to an open house if we were taking some recruits with us.

Q: Do you feel because you paid you can dance with anyone you want to?
A: I don't get this one. Do you mean about staying out of squares with all beginners, or do you mean I go to a club where they dance a lot of calls 1 don't know, and try to get into a square with their best dancers so they can pull me through?

Q: Do you stay away when your club has a class-level dance?
A: I guess you mean that "level" is how many calls they know. Like I said, a good caller can take some basic calls, like for instance the calls the class has already learned, and give everybody a fun dance.

Q: Have you ever been so upset that you walked away at the end of a tip without saying thank you?
A: No. You only get upset if you don't get something you think you ought to. I dance to have fun, and sometimes a set can get into such a mess that it's a real gasser. If somebody else gets upset because he didn't have any fun, 1 can at least thank him for putting up with me till the end of the tip.

Q: Do you dance only in the plus or higher level halls at a festival?
A: No. I already said it twice, that a good caller can put on a real fun dance without using a lot of "high levelי" calls, and when we go to a festival we expect there'll be some good callers in the Mainstream hall.

Q: Have you ever danced a whole evening in squares without any guests, if any were present?
A: Yes. If there are 10 or 12 squares on the floor, and only 3 or 4 guest or visitor couples, it's real easy.

Q: Do you leave early if the level is too low?
A: There's that word "level" again. If we leave early it's because we're not having much fun, for one reason or another, or because we're too tired out to dance any more.

Q: Have you ever told someone if they can't dance the level they shouldn't be there?
A: Sure, when it was somebody else's club 1 was talking about. No for my own club, but if 1 ever felt it would be good for that someone to be wised up, IId say something like this: "The caller seems to be giving you a hard time. Did you ever think of trying someone else? Clubs aren't all alike, you know. You might really enjoy Sam Singalong at the Cozy
Squares." What really pulls my cork is for a club to recruit a class and tell them that 25 or 30 lessons are going to make them real square dancers, and then pull that line on them after they graduate. It's even worse if they just dump them, and don't even bother to tell them that there are other clubs around that might be glad to have them.

RULES FOR BANNER STEALING .. Cont. from pg. 3.
6. At no time can a member club allow any other club to take a banner belonging to another club. Also, when a club steals a banner from a club, it is the receiving club's duty to safeguard at all times the banner they have stolen. If said banner has not been retrieved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (Three months), the banner should be returned to the owning club.
7. Banner Stealing shall be restricted to regular club dances only, and does not include any special dances a club might hold and so desianate. In addition to those dances so designated, any dance which has a caller other than the regular club caller shall be a special dance. If a club does not have a regular caller, all dances shall be regular club dances unless so designated.
