




We were happy to welcome Walt ϵ Mertle Pound to our celebration of Christmas. The New Year will be welcomed early at the Dec. 27 dance.






Victor Swing-A-Longs





The IRISH CHILDREN'S PROGRAM (ICP) is an ecumenical, non-political, and tax-deductible charity [501(c)(3)]. This organization brings children aged 9-12 from Belfast, Northern Ireland to the US for a six week period during each summer.

Seventy children (35 Catholic, 35 Protestant) have been placed with families in the Rochester area over the past three summers. The ICP provides the funds for the children's travel expenses and insurance. The host families provide "love, room, and board".

There are programs in several cities, however we operate as an independent unit, both financially and administratively. We do not support any Irish organization and as a rule do not send money to Northern Ireland. We pay for the travel expenses and insurance which are purchased through local agencies. The one exception...we have sent \$75 to support a "reunion" Christmas party in Belfast, and have been told by Americans attending that it is money well-spent.

There will be trophies for the class/club with the most members in attendance and also for the couple traveling the greatest distance.






