## Carmen's Column

## LABELLING YOUR DANCE

Notice, I have titled this article "Labelling Your Dance" instead of "Labelling Your Club". The intent of CALLERLAB in establishing the different programs was to indicate to people attending an open dance which ca11s they will be expected to know. Such listings are especially helpful in programming large dances where several halls are available for dancers with different levels of experience. So, ideally, we want to label the dance and not the club, for the level of the club changes as the new class graduates progress throughout the dance year.

There is a lot of confusion among clubs on how to identify their regular dances. First, very few want to be known as a mainstream club, so after workshopping a few PLUS calls from standard position, they advertise their club dances as PLUS. This can be confusing both to visitors and guest cailers. The visitor is disappointed on how sparse the PLUS vocabulary is, and the guest caller often has to feel his way in determining which Plus calls the floor knows and which positions they can dance them in.

It seems that since very few (if any) clubs dance only the mainstream program and there are not many that dance the complete Plus program, there ought at least be a way they can indicate a dance with a partial program.

It is typical for a club to graduate its class and reduce the dancing level to that of the class. Throughout the dance year, the caller workshops the remaining calls he would like the club to know and builds the vocabulary (level) of the club. During this time, the club is in reality dancing more than a mainstream program since the dancers are expected to retain the calls that are introduced and eventually to know them without a walkthrough. In effect, the club is conducting a PLUS WORKSHOP, building up the dancers' vocabulary.

I don't mean to imply this is good or bad. I merely think we should let the outside world know what's going on, so when they come to visit your club they know what to expect. The best way to do this is through our dance listings in the PROMENADER. Since most clubs are dancing the Mainstream program with selected Plus calls, why not say it? In your advertising say, "MAINSTREAM PROGRAM WITH SELECTED PLUS CALLS". Perhaps the Promenader 1isting could read " $M+$ " which would read the same on the legend. The same would apply to other programs. "B+" would be Basic with selected Mainstream calls, "Al+" would be $A-1$ with selected $A-2$ calls, etc. When you hire a guest caller, tell him what those selected talls are, and if possible, whether it's standard position or otherwise.

Please remember, when you are advertising a PLUS dance, CALLERLAB says you are telling the caller he can use any of the calls on the Plus list and visiting dancers should be able to dance them without a walkthrough.
