

Many of us will be dancing the mainstream and plus level with Bob Meagher at the Summerville Presbyterian Church on Thursday evenings during June, July and August.



We have reached another "Trails End" and our dance schedule has been completed for now. The only event left is the campout at Lakeside State Park in June.




It's getting to be a wonderful habit! 260 dancers from 16 States and Canada were housed AND danced in the deluxe Sonesta Beach Hotel.
