
In October 1987 New York State shall enjoy for the first time in many years a state festival.

My question simply put is; "How can you call this a N.Y.S. festival and feature out of state $\$ callers?" I again expressed the fact that this is MY opinion and nothing more. However several other callers in the Co-op felt as I do. Perhaps it is time for C.C.R., callers groups, cuer groups, and dancers to voice their opinions. It's the best way to give input to the committee. Why hire callers, when in many large festivals such as the popular New England Festival and of course the grand daddy of them all, the National

Square and Round Dance Convention, there are no paid staff. Surely New York State has more than enough talented men and women to handle this two day festival.

At NO time have I spoken out over a microphone against this festival, for good reason, contrary to belief, I am not. In fact I am in favor of it! It's good for Square/Round Dancing and good for New York State. I'm only opposed to the staffing policy. There is no doubt in my mind that the committee feels that they are doing what's best for the Festival. With that in mind and the actions by one member of the committee who, without one word spoken concerning this issue has given me reason to re-consider my position. The calling staff has been chosen. The committee has made its' decision, it is now time to pull together. Let's make this the best State Festival in any state !! I offer my support. If there is anything that I can do I invite the committee to contact me. I'll do anything I can to help make The Empire State Square and Round Dance Festival a success.
