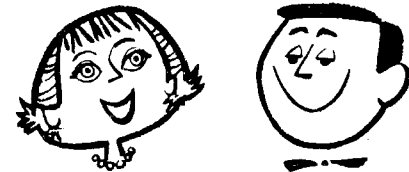

Please note that the first dance of April, on the 2nd, will be held at the Market Street Firehall in Brockport.

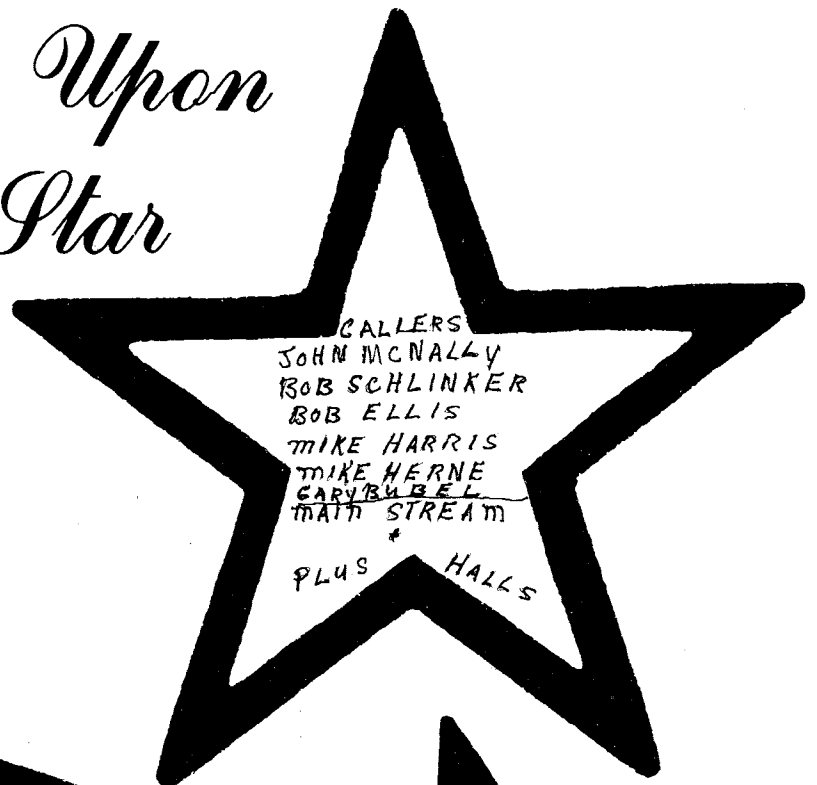
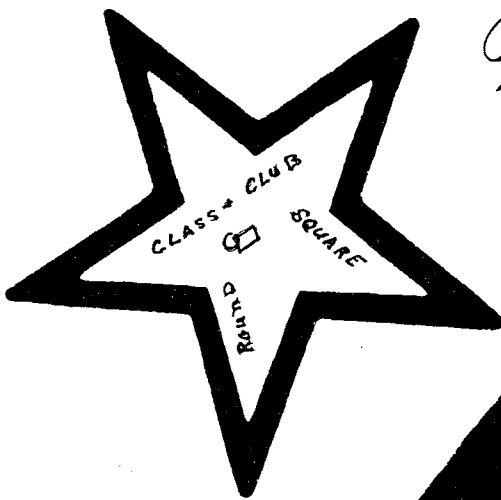

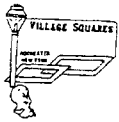
Web Spinners
