### Lima Grand Squares





### DANCERS FORUM

On February 2, 12 callers and 100+ dancers gathered 'round the tables at the Green Lantern Inn and discussed several topics of interest to the Square Dance Community. Among the topics discussed was the numbers system. Some local clubs presently use the system as a way of mixing up dancers - old and new, good and not so good. The system also prevents or at least lessens the formation of cliques on the dance floor. Using the mixer idea for class instruction was also suggested. Both ideas seem to be popular.

The Life After Class topic brought out many ideas and suggestions. The two-year program was too long for most people. The loss of many of our new dancers was attributed to a lack of good feelings towards them by other dancers. A "Buddy" system was discussed, that is, one couple is responsible for a class couple on a one to one basis. Also, recycle recent grads and use as "angels". This would also re-enforce the newly taught basics. The need for each class instructor to teach the prescribed basics was touched upon. New members that appear to be drifting away should be contacted by club officers. Callers need to start to mix up the squares to get new dancers to join in with other club members. Using the mixer or numbers system was again mentioned. Summer workshops are necessary.

The discussion of what a caller owes to a club and a club to a caller was really one topic. The dancers thought that the callers needed to make their dances more interesting by not calling the same dances every week. Some thought the callers should call to the ability of the floor. Dancers need to let the callers know what they like and also what they don't like. More open dancer/caller discussions should take place.

In brief - A caller owes a good dance to the club A club needs to let a caller know what it wants!

The dancer decline topic again mentioned the fact that dancers are being pushed too much. Club dancers are being pushed to raise the level of the club higher. New dancers are being pushed to get into the club level. Burn-out along with other commitments to family, bowling, work related, school related, etc. are a factor in the decline of square dancers.

Protecting your investment was an interesting topic. We know that belonging to a square dance club costs us money. Our investment in our club is substantial. Officers alone cannot protect our investments; officers alone cannot create a growing club; callers alone cannot produce a happy and growing club; it takes every member - every one! Fresh input from new officers and the continuity of outgoing officers remaining to help will ensure a successful transition. Plan club activities not related to square dancing. Plan mystery rides to other clubs to widen your square dance "order of friends". In short - make involvement fun for everyone!

Saturday, April 26, promises to be a fun dance with guest caller Bob Ellis and as usual the Keppen's cueing.


