## ARE YOUR MANNERS SHOWING?

Part of each beginners class used to be a session on etiquette. It was emphasized periodically throughout the lessons and when we entered the club we were aware of the do's and don'ts of how to behave toward our fellow members.

Today in our crammed programs, we do not seem to have the time to give nothing more than a short lecture or hand out a few pamphlets which have the subject of square dance etiquette in them. We probably have forgotten the lecture or never got around to that part in the pamphlets. This is one aspect of our education that is short-changed these days.

Square dance courtesy is really nothing more than behaving toward others as if they were friends and we cared aboút their feelings. We seem to have lost some of that in today's high-pressure dancing.

Some of us are aware of some of the more obvious transgressions such as walking out of a square or telling people to go back to class, but some of the more subtle ones can be just as devastating to new and experienced dancers alike. Here are a few. Keep them in mind and try never to be guilty of them.

THE BONE CRACKER likes to get a firm grip. Probably the better to yank people into position. Never mind their victims might have arthritis or a hand injury. Surprisingly enough, some bone crackers don't realize what they're doing. I believe anyone meeting them would do them a favor by telling them that they are hurting people by their grip.

THE YANKER mentioned above is usually an intentional offender. Yankers like to show how well they know the call by fimly grabbing your hand and pulling you in the direction they think you should go - sometimes in the wrong direction. This also serves to establish their superiority in the square. Since yankers do not give you credit for knowing anything, they should be told they are only adding to the confusion, not giving you the opportunity to learn, and they are making you angry.

THE SHOVER is an extension of the yanker. When your hand is not available your back is. Shovers, unlike the yanker, sometimes actually think they are being helpful. The main problem with shovers is that they have no finesse. Most of us have no objection to being guided into position when we are lost, but we resent being shoved. The shover many times knows what to do but not how. When you encounter a shover, you should first assume they don't realize how rough they are and tell them politely that you appreciate that they are trying to help you but cannot stand the way they are doing it.
THE FROWNER when combined with any of the above can be absolutely deadly - especially to new dancers. They are trying to express their dissatisfaction with your performance as graphically as possible without actually saying anything. We should be careful, however, because frowning all by itself can be quite innocent. Many frowners do so without realizing it because they are concentrating on what they are doing. An unintentional frowner appreciates you pointing this out, so please try to mention it. Say something like "I hope you're not angry at something I did." The unintentional frowner will react with surprise and ask you why. Once aware of the frowning, you will notice a lot more smiling on that person. This sometimes works on the intentional frowner as well.

THE INSULTER throws-off indirect conments like, "I wish we could get in a GOOD square. "or "Oh, new graduates." As far as I know, there is no inmectate cure for these people and when they reveal themselves they should be avoided whenever possible. If you do get stuck with them, try to remember they are a very small part of the square dance population and there are probably five other perfectly wonderful people in your square. Just feel sorry for the insulters' spouse. Very often they feel embarassment but are too weak-willed to say anything.

THE COMPIAINER runs around telling whoever will listen that the class or workshop is progressing too slowly, the club level is too low, or the caller doesn't know how to teach. The complainer only thinks of himself and can be a divisive force in the class or club, turning others against the caller. In my estimation, the primary goal of these people is to be better than everyone else. They also tend to complain about slow learners. Sometimes this is accompanied by threats - "If you don't get rid of so-and-so, then I'm leaving!". From past experience, the caller would be better served to let the complainers go than to give into their demands. Time and time again, the "slow learner" has proven to be more faithful in attendance, more willing to work when asked, and more loyal to the club. The slow learner most often only wants to please everyone else, but the complainer wants everyone elso to please him.
