A PORTRAIT OF GENESEE DANCERS
The beginning of Genesee Dancers and the start of square dancing in the Rochester area are practically synonymous. In 1955 two Rochester couples, who experlenced Western Square Dancing in Pennsylvanla, were eager to enjoy it in Rochester. They corralled sixteen couples, procured a teacher from Buffalo, got permission to use the Penfield Town Hall and started classes. After a few months, the Town Hall was to be turned into an office building, and a new hall had to be found. In the course of time it became possible for them to use the "Barn" for their dances. The "Barn" was owned by the Gannett Foundatlon, built especially for the youth of Rochester. Following the first lessons, this small group formed the Genesee Dancers in 1956. As you see, we are celebrating our 30 th anniversary this year, the first Western Square Dance club in the area! After a couple of other moves we found our home in the ballroom of the Green Lantern Inn in Falrport.

We are a couples club, with membership among the largest in the vicinity. We dance on Thursday evenings all year long with the exception of Thanksgiving, Christmas and the last Thursday in August. Rounds start at $7: 45$ followed by squares at $8: 15$. Since we are a member-run club, members can participate, or not, in the running of the club in many different ways. We are sometimes surprised at our own talents. Our annual dinner-dances are: September's "Trall Back", December's Holiday Dance and June's "Trail's End". These include catered dinners for members only followed with lively open dancing. In addition, we look for excuses to celebrate with several speclal events featured throughout the year, such as our Halloweenie Roast, Turkey Trot in November, February's Valent ine Party, and our summer "class dance". Most are pot-luck dinners where nomone works too hard and everyone enjoys the dellcious meals. What cooks we have, both male and female!

For the last two years we have featured a "Refresher Coursel for those who, for one reason or another have dropped out of square dancing. It is exciting to see our old friends return to enjoy the camaraderie of square dancers and the dancing. We also have classes for new dancers, starting in September, with two free dances, and lessons continuing through until spring and graduation. Mike Herne is our class instructor.

Our membership roster reaches from Macedon to Spencerport and south to Avon - and all points between. All are welcome who dance the Plus program. During the summer and early fall we dance malinstream with a review and teach of Plus.

We belleve we have the best caller in Mike CalIahan, the best cuers in Bob Slomcenski, Brian Adams, and Roy Keppen, the best ballroom, avallable for square dancing, in the Green Lantern Inn, with air conditioning, wooden floor, good acoustics and a surplus of parking space.

## Caller Profile

MIKE CALLAHAN


When Ray and Irene Callahan (charter members of Country Twirlers) encouraged their teenage son's interest in calling square dances, littledid they realize that he would eventually become a full time professional caller. That was some twenty-six years ago.

Past Moderator for the Caller's Co-op of Rochester, active in national and international caller groups, and recording artist of "You Put the Blue in Me" and "I'd Do It All Over Again" is our well respected Mike Callahan.

What is square dancing's biggest problem? Says Mike, "The biggest problem today, especially in the Northeast, is the dwindling size of our beginners classes. This can be attributed to many factors: VCR's, health clubs... and the fact that square dancing requires a 25-30 week commitment. I personally feel that square danclng has become too complicated for the average couple looking for a recreation. This is why square dancing is becoming a retirement activity. I also feel that in the next few years, square dancing will become a very popular singles activity."

Mike gets most of his calling enjoyment out of teaching a beginners class, which he is proud to say, he does each and every year.

Today Mike, who has been calling full time for the past twelve years, calls all levels for seven clubs in the Rochester, New York area. He has called at special dances and festivals in twenty states and Canada.

Mike's wife, Wanda, who is a part-time sales representative for Schuylmerich Carillons Inc., does most of the work for their Advanced Clubs which are caller/wife run. Wanda and Mike and their three children llve in Hilton, New York.

## CREATING IDENL CLUB ATMOSPHERE

1. Have dance faclllty open and set up thirty minutes prior to dance.
2. Club banner and attractive bulletin board set up.
3. Club officers and member greet visitors and members at door as they arrive andbid farewell as they leave.
4. Club officers and members set an example of the "ldeal" as to dress, promptness, badge, enthusiasm and knowledge of the square dance activities.
5. Recognize special efforts of Individual club members.
6. Recognize visiting dancers, area and state officers.
7. Club members make special effort to dance and converse with new members and guests.
8. Club activitles and functions involve all club members and are made to be fun not work.
9. The club leaves the dance hall in better condition than it found it.
10. Publicize club, area and state functions.
11. Assure club support of all club, area and state activities.
12. Club is responslve to needs of dancers, caller and offlcers.
13. Avoid cliques by avoiding secrecy in any club activity.
14. Club constitution, and policies are issued to all new club members. Updated documents are distributed to all members.

## WAYS TO FIND NEW DANCERS

There are hundreds of ways to promote your class. - imited only by your imagination and hampered only by the amount of tlme and effort you put into the execution of these ideas. Here are a few:

1. Demonstrations, Planned performances, shows, street dances wherever people gather.
2. Phone campalgn, with follow-up calls.
3. Invitations sent to local people.

Free ticket hand out.
. Placemats in local restaurants. Make your own or they can be ordered.
6. Personal contact.
7. Billboards in the area.
8. Banner across maln street.
9. Front yard sign at home. "Learn to Square Dance Inquire within."
10. Local Chamber of Commerce. Get on the club directory or in the monthly bulletin.
11. Personal letters to local organizations' presidents.
12. Welcome Wagon/Newcomers distribute Information to new residents.
13. Window displays for square dance week.
14. Newspapers - Make sure the "Shoppers News" has an ad.
15. Rad io and TV free spots.
16. Joint sponsorship of class: YM/YW/community adult education/community college, church, rad io station.
17. Use flyers. Leave in literature racks of local motels. Put on every bullet in board you come to, Put free ticket in each bag at supermarket check out. Leave at information centers, doctors office, with each newspaper on your streets.

15. Club actively supports area and state organizations, their festivals, conventions and activitles.
16. Sponsor visitations, charity work, exhibitions, promotions, etc.
17. Make every dance a "special" dance and "happy memory" for the dancers.
18. Coordinate club activities and gimmicks with club caller.
19. Members wear Club and Federation badges for identification and to indicate support and loyality to their organizations.
20. Club Representatlves attend every Federation Meeting.
21. Prepare club membership roster and distribute to club members.
22. New officers or potentlal officers are scheduled into leadership seminars or provided other means for their education.
23. Inform all club members that they are the host and hostess to each club dance. Each member is supposed to welcome visitors, -not just the officers.


## GROUN RULES FOR SQUARE DANCING

from Square'em Up, MayJune 186 issue

1. Be a good listener. The caller is like a "quarterback". He calls the plays by giving you the signals for the movements he wants you to make. Talking or thinking of something else is distracting to you and makes it difficult for others to hear.
2. Get into squares quickly. Don't make the caller and fellow dancers beg you to dance! Do you reallze how much time in an evening is spent that could be used for dancing if so much time was not wasted waiting for dancers to "Square Up"?
3. Be a courteous dancer. Standard rules of courtesy are always appreciated. Saying "thank you" to all those in the set with you is a natural reaction. Be aware of these special courtesies: A. It's considered bad manners to pass a square in order to fill another square. B. Even worse, is to leave a square, once you have joined it, untll the tip is over.
4. Be on time for club and classes. This speaks for itself. Just one couple can prevent a square from "Squaring UP".
5. Be a thoughtful dancer. Personal cleanliness is important in any activity, especially one where folks exercise vigorously in clear contact with each other. Another rule to remember is: before square dance don't drink.
6. Be a cooperative dancer. A square is made up of eight individuals working as a unit with no individual person attempting to show off or be "the star".
7. Take it easy. Don't overdo. If you get tired, sit down. Sometimes you can learn a great deal by watching and listening.
8. Be a friendly dancer. You are the host in square dancing. Get acquainted with others in the square and make it a point to dance with as many different dancers as possible each evening. It has been said that "Square dancing is friendship set to music".
9. You're never through learning. You'll find there is always something new that you can learn or some part of your dancing which can be improved upon.
10. Enjoy yourself, have fun, pleasure is contagious, you'll be surprised how much your smile will pep up the entire square!
