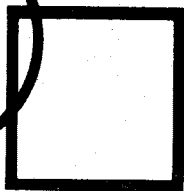

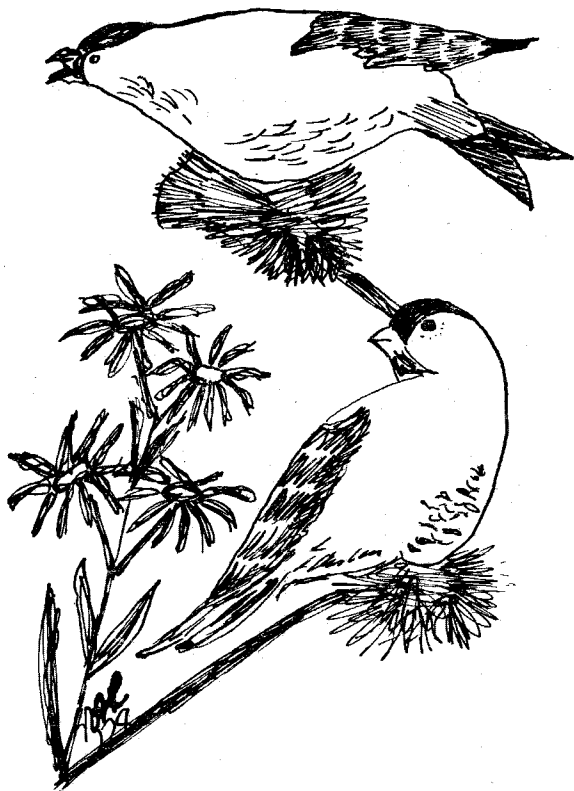

NEW CRITERIA

At the January 12 meeting of the Federation, the following recommendations for the Special Events Calendar were accepted:

1. Each listing for each special event should be submitted to the Editor of the **Promenader**, who shall be the new Keeper of the Calendar since it is more feasible that the information be sent to one central place.
2. A nominal fee of \$5.00 shall accompany each Special Event listing, based on the assumption that if one couple attends the special dance the listing has served its purpose.
3. The listing may include club/class dances (to be so indicated). The \$5.00 fee will be a one-time charge for each event until the date of the event has elapsed.
4. The Special Event should contain the date of the Special Event, the sponsor of the event, and/or name of the caller.
5. The Special Event shall be listed in each issue of the **Promenader** including the month of the scheduled event.
6. This new policy will commence with the April 1987 issue of the **Promenader**. For printing in the April issue, the information and check must reach the Editor no later than March 3, 1987.

Caller Profile



BOB AND NANCY ELLIS

Bob and Nancy Ellis are known by many dancers over the years. Since the early 1950's Bob and his band played for round and square dances in the area until introduced to Modern Square Dancing in the mid 1960's. Beginning in 1973, Bob became a full-time caller. In addition to calling, Bob works part-time as a school portrait photographer, and Nancy is Manager of the Webster Branch of First Federal Savings and Loan of Rochester.

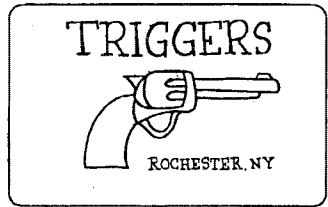
You can enjoy Bob's calling at Cayuga Cut-Ups, Auburn; Buds and Blossoms, Arkport; or their three "Caller Run" Clubs in Rochester. These caller clubs have annual workshops to teach dancers the next program in dancing. You can reach the Ellises at 4564 Yautzy Road, Stanley, New York 14561.

Bob and Nancy sponsor campouts and weekends, and escort dancers and friends to Nashville, Atlantic City, the Caribbean, and Hawaii. They are now planning their fourth Hawaii trip for February, 1988.

The Ellises feel that the fun and social aspects of the square dance activity are most important. The "level" of the dancing serves to bring people of like interest together, forming different clubs.



SPOTLIGHT ON



"Triggers" owes its existence to Myron and Peg Huss, who had learned Western square dancing with Belles and Beaus in 1957. Myron started calling in 1961, was chairman of the Rochester Callers Association in 1962, and attended a callers' school in Massachusetts with instructors Al Brundage and Earl Johnston. At 8:00 pm on January 8, 1963, Myron and Peg arrived at Bethany Presbyterian Church on Dewey Avenue to greet their first class of five couples and two assisting couples. After dancing from January to May, the group decided during the summer to call themselves "Triggers", a name suggested by Bob and Barb Patchin. Class sessions resumed in October at the Husses' home. On December 12, 1963, graduation was held at a Christmas party; and the first group of officers was chosen with Bill and Myrtle Wiley as presidents.

The first set of by-laws was dated April 29, 1964. "It shall be the purpose of the Triggers to further our knowledge and skill in the art of Western Square and Round Dancing and to enjoy through the spirit of friendliness, loyalty, and cooperation the pleasures of good fellowship." This credo evidently works - over half of our couples have been members for longer than ten years.

Boots and Slippers were guests at a Triggers Halloween dance while RAF members were voting to have the Triggers join the Federation on October 27, 1964. The first Federation representatives were Bob and Jo Mendell and Bill and Sandie Tacy. The Tacy's were also the first Promenader reporters.

The dancing brings us together and gives the club its reason for being, but a mutual respect and an outgoing affection bond the Triggers into a comfortable and enduring group. Outside, we support charitable events; and we make a deliberate effort to demonstrate the exuberance of square dancing at schools and churches and to bring some of its excitement to local nursing homes. Inside, when any Trigger needs us, we're there.

Like all clubs, we've had our lean periods and our prosperous ones; but we've always had a sense of family and of continuity. Peg and Myron created a set of photo-scrapbooks dating back to our first year. They show an unusual mix of special events, for which we hand-make commemorative badges. We celebrate all the annual holidays, of course; but we throw in mystery rides, desserts-for-two, pie auctions, amateur caller nights, our famous annual Bunny Hop, and winter and summer picnics. These traditions thrive under the guidance of Mike Herne, our present caller.

The art of Western dancing and the pleasures of good fellowship: the earliest Triggers set the standards. The latest Triggers keep them alive. We dance Tuesdays at Parkland School in Greece: rounds instruction at 7:30, squares and rounds beginning at 8:00. If you'll join us, we promise you'll feel welcome. 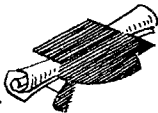
The D-O-R '87 tickets are at last ready for distribution.

WHAT IS...

1. Q. What is a "festival"?

A. A festival is like ten club dances in one. Festivals (from one to three days in length) attract hundreds of dancers. Usually dancing is going on in three or more rooms at the same time. Experience Rochester's next festival at Dance-O-Rama on May 2 in preparation to the big one - The Empire State Festival in October.

2. Q. What is a "guest caller"?

A. A guest caller is calling at your club when your regular club caller isn't. Occasional guest callers are extremely beneficial to a club and should be a regular part your club's yearly schedule.

3. Q. What is a "club"?

A. A club is made up of and reflects its members. A dancer-run club is when individual dancers unite to form a living organization, that hires a caller and promotes their common interest in square dancing. A caller/cuer-run club is when a caller/cuer presents a dance program to appeal to individual dancers. His dancers may or may not form a loose organization for social purposes.

4. Q. What is "camper-dancer club"?

A. This club promotes their common interest in camping and dancing as The Sets In Motion Club does.

5. Q. What is a "hoedown"?

A. This word has different meanings. 1. The music that a caller uses for his patter or hash calls. Usually the first half of a tip. 2. A large dance (customarily on Saturday nights) hosted by one area club. All other clubs will attend the hoedown. Each area club (or two clubs together) will take turns throughout the year hosting a hoedown. Not usually as large as a festival, but a special, fun experience. Hoedowns are prevalent in western and southern states. 3. A hoedown may indicate an Eastern Style Square Dance.

6. Q. What is a "National Caller"?

A. There's much controversy on this. A national caller has been defined as a caller that has called at the yearly National Square Dance Convention. That is not much of a distinction, as just about any caller who wants to go to the Convention can get at least one five-minute slot on the program. A "nationally known caller" is a caller that is widely known (nationally) for his calling abilities - or lack thereof.

7. Q. What is the importance of a class?

A. The class, or beginning square dancers, are the life blood of square dancing. The future of this activity is in their hands. These new dancers come with new enthusiasm, vitality, and ideas to keep clubs alive and growing. If beginners enjoy square dancing enough, they may become club members. If they enjoy the club enough, they may become future leaders and officers.

The class have a whole new set of friends and families that may be interested in square dancing. Make sure each class member is very familiar with the answer to the next question!

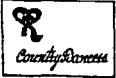
8. Q. What is an Open House, and how does it work?

A. An Open House is an opportunity to share square dancing with friends and family. Usually held in September and October, Open House is an invitation to the public to come and see square dancing, meet square dancers, and try it. (You'll like it!) Anyone who square dances must take as many non-dancers as possible to an open house. If you've enjoyed the activity, you owe it as many new dancers as possible. Only by getting friends into square dancing, can we be assured of continuing this activity.

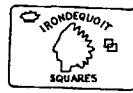

Jody's Rounds

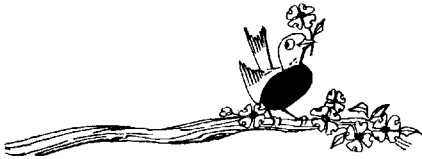

THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, and club dances; and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, MSQS, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that the dancers should know some of the Plus Program? If so, which part? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction? The MS Plus designation is similarly vague and confusing.

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MSQS designation, he probably assumes that the dancer will be expected to know something about Quarterly Selections. However, does that mean all Quarterly Selections, only the current Quarterly Selection, or something else? Even more important is the fact that the Quarterly Selection Program was never intended to be a regular dance program. The latest publication of the Callerlab Basic and Mainstream Programs makes that clear with this statement: "There is no program called Mainstream Quarterly Selections Program. Those experimental calls are intended for use in Mainstream Workshops. No dancer is required to know the QS calls to attend a Mainstream open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as Mainstream not MSQS."

Proper program designations help dancers to find that dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. They also tell callers the program they are expected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating dance programs, and club officers and dancers need to be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration. Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers.

The correct program designations are shown below. Dancers should be able to dance, in accordance with their definitions, the number of basics or movements shown. All lists are current as of February 2, 1987.

- Basic Program (B) -Numbers 1 through 49 on the Callerlab Program approved 4/18/84.
- Mainstream Program(MS)-Numbers 1 through 68 on the Callerlab Program approved 4/18/84.
- Plus (+) -The Mainstream Program and the 27 calls on the Callerlab Plus Program approved 4/18/84.
- Advanced One (A1) -The Mainstream and Plus Programs and the 38 calls on the Callerlab A - 1 Program approved 9/85.
- Advanced Two (A2) -The Mainstream and Plus Programs plus the 78 calls on the Callerlab A - 2 Program approved 9/85.
- Basic Challenge (C1)-The Mainstream, Plus, Advanced and the 64 calls on the Callerlab C - 1 Program approved 11/85.
- Extended Challenge (C2)-The Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, C1 and the 76 Calls on the Callerlab C - 2 Program approved 12/85.
