

PROMENADING B'S

Our club was started in 1971 by caller Ron Fotch and his taw Betty. The early years were characterized by many social functions, often relating to square dancing, outside the dance hall. Ron lived in a trailer park near Batavia, in which there was a small pavilion, and many times he would have a square dance during the summer at this site. There also was participation in the annual Fireman's parade with a float consisting of dancers on a wagon, dancing as it was being pulled along the parade route. We have stories of the many square dance weekend campouts and the spaghetti dinners.

Most of the present members have been with a relatively short time but there are some people who stand out with their contributions to square dancing. Alice and Angie DeFelice have been with the club nearly from the beginning. Roger and Nancy Dart have been club presidents three different times and have directed the club through some difficult periods. Bob and Maryln Dailey have contributed a lot of time, not only to the club, but to the Federation and the **Promenader**. In 1985 Ron and Betty Fotch moved to Florida, where he is still calling.

Since September 1985, Bob Schlenker has been the "Bee" keeper, commuting weekly from Kanona (near Bath), New York. Bob and his "honey bee", Sue, have gulded enthusiastic class members into square dancing. We enjoy their caring, expertise, and humor. Also in the '80s, Betty and Bert Wolcott started teaching round dancing. The classes are continuing, meeting before the club dances. Betty also cues round between tips.

Our famous "Black Light Dance" was first held in the Grange Hall in 1975 and has been held in the high school since, usually packing the place. Every other tip is called with the black lights being the only illumination, and the glowing colors are a sight to behold. Our other special dances include the Thanksgiving Turkey Dance and Strawberry Social in June. (Watch the **Promenader** for date.)

We are still a funclub. Our emphasis is Mainstream with an occasional Plus tip thrown in. One evening we wrapped our caller in toilet paper as he was calling. Another time we lathered his face and proceeded to give him a "shave" complete with Old Spice refresher. He never missed a beat. Wait 'til he sees our next episode.

Our members travel from Alton and Akron, so you can see we are right in the middle of things. Visitors are always welcome. Since we're concentrating on enjoyment, perfection isn't always necessary.

Dear Editors:

I believe that it is time for someone to speak out for the Round Dance Community.

As a Round and Square dancer for about 16 years I have continually heard about square dance etiquette. As a dancer I have tried to practice good manners and etiquette by treating other dancers as I would like them to treat both my wife and myself. However through the years I have found that the square dancer who does not round dance seems to either forget or ignore the fact that when people are round dancing they have to hear their cuer as much as people square dancing have to hear their caller. The next dance you attend, dance a tip and then ask yourself, did the round dancer sitting on the sides of the hall make enough noise that kept you from hearing the caller? After you have answered yourself stop and listen to the round dancer cuer and listen to how much noise there is on the sidelines being made by non-round dancers.

I don't think it is wrong for the round dance community to ask for the same courtesy as the square dance community expects. Do you?

COMPRESS TO A COLUMN

Starting formation - parallel two faced-lines.

The centers facing in Extend (the tag) to meet each other in the very center and Trade; the centers facing out step ahead and Fold toward the other center; and the ends slide together and Trade. Now all Extend (the Tag) to form a column.

Comments: This is an easy teach and feels similar to a Triple Scoot to some dancers. Half sashayed and left handed arrangements seem to offer little difficulty after a walkthru.

Timing - 6 Steps

The current Plus Quarterly Selections are:

Compress to a Column

Relay, Cycle & Wheel (R.C.W.)

Spin Chain and Exchange the Gears

Advanced Quarterly (Beginning March 1) Selections:

OPEN UP THE COLUMN

Open up the Column from right or left hand columns. The number one dancer in the column Cross Clovers, the number two dancer Clovers. The number three and four dancers Circulate ahead, Cast off 3/4 and Extend the Tag (as in Transfer the Column). This call ends in waves.

COVER UP

From right or left waves - Cover Up - all eight Circulate once and a half. The center wave dancers Recycle while the outsides Step Thru and 1/4 in. Ends in beginning Double Pass Thru (zero Tag).


