GARY BUBEL



The major problem facing square dancing today says caller, Gary Bubel, is our inability to keep new dancers interested in the activity. The solution suggested by Gary, who has been calling since 1974, is to have the people who bring in new dancers work with them for a year until they are comfortable. Certainly this is the time of year for us dancers to see that our graduates from last spring really feel welcome in our squares. Invite them to dance in your squares with another experienced dance couple.

Gary Bubei began calling for the Flutterbugs, a teenage square dance club in Caledonia. Gary and his wife Alice are still dancing after 15 years because they enjoy it. Gary calls because he enjoys doing it, and presently calls for the Whichway Whirlers of Pavilion, the Henrietta Friendship Squares, and the Lima Grand Squares. BETTER WORKING RELATIONSHIP

How about some suggestions to help clubs and callers form a better working relationship? Most problems that arise between a club and their caller can be traced to lack of communication.

How about an annual meeting between the club officers and the caller sometime in the late summer so everyone is of one mind before the season starts? Any suggestions the general club membership may have could be discussed with the officers and brought to the meeting by them.

Any subject that may affect your club dances should be discussed - program of dancing, themes for dances, class length, workshops at dances, star tips, ANYthing. These things need to be discussed and are best discussed at a separate meeting, away from the dance scene.

Invite your caller and his/her partner to join in other club activities. Sometimes a club decides not to invite the caller to non-square dancing activities, because they think he or she will be booked and couldn't attend anyway. This may be true, but an invitation extended will be greatly appreciated, and they will feel like part of the club instead of hired help.

Square dancing is a couplest activity with the possible exception of the caller's partner. There is need to make them feel like they are part of the picture, too. Most clubs have greeters at the door and during the course of the evening to make their guests feel welcome and thank them for coming, but they let the caller's partner become part of the woodwork for the evening. Part of the etiquette of square dancing should include inviting the caller's spouse to dance a couple of tips, with someone in the club.

Invite your caller and partner to attend a dance with the club, either at your own club as your guest, or on a banner stealing trip to some other club. You may be surprised that he/she enjoys dancing, too, and can actually do the moves.

Include your caller in non-calling activities, include your caller's spouse in dancing activities. Don't be afraid to approach your caller with constructive suggestions, as well as compliments.

Most callers don't consider square dance calling a job, as such, and enjoy seeing dancers have a good time, but hear in mind that there are things your club can do to make your caller and spouse enjoy the evening more. You may be pleasantly surprised when you get it all back over the mike.

Again this year we will have a New Year's Eve Dance, look for details.



UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA

CODE OF CONDUCT

"Square Dancers everywhere are encouraged to comply with an appropriate Code of Conduct which will enhance the public image and the pleasure of the movement to all dancers and non-dancers, as well.

Among the unique aspects of this wholesome activity is the attractive attire which is an intrinsic part of the Image of the Square Dance. Accordingly, the wearing of appropriate apparel is as important to the enjoyment of the participants as it is to those watching. Not only should the clothing of the dancers be appealing to the eye, but also functional to the others within the square. This includes the wearing of long-sleeved shirts and ties for the men and full skirts for the ladies.

Avoidance of alcoholic beverages both before and during dances is essential to insure the enjoyment for everyone. A single drink can severely diminish the response time required to execute the intricate moves of the dance. Square Dancing in Itself has the capability of providing sufficient exhilaration to warrant abstinence from alcohol on dance nights.

Courtesy to others is important at all times. This includes personal cleanliness, as Square Dancing is an energetic recreation which can be offensive should adequate precautions not be taken.

The welcoming of others into the dance and into the squares is an integral part of the social aspect of Square Dancing. Walking out of a square at any time is considered a severe insult. At the end of the dance, no one should leave the square before thanking everyone who contributed to the joy and the fun of dancing together.

Conforming to the accepted and generally taught hand positions and maneuvers for execution of the movements helps to eliminate any uncertainty among the other dancers. Proper styling while dancing is as important to the enjoyment of the Square Dance as is the proper execution of the movements.

Adherence to these guidelines should be encouraged from the very early stages of beginners class. The best means of achieving this is through example by experienced dancers and leaders and by the incorporation of ethics into the educational process during the class."

It is felt that through the re-affirmation of these long recognized rules of conduct, dancers everywhere will be reminded of the importance of courtesy, friendliness and personal hygiene. All of these things are an integral part of the Square Dance activity.




