<u>Caller</u> Profile



JERRY AND BETTY CARMEN

Jerry became a square dancer and caller while a student at the University of Massachusetts in the early 1960's. At that time there was no class so Jerry was one of the bystanders dragged into a square when one more was needed to fill it. It was here that he met his favorite dance partner, Betty, who is now his wife and mother of their two sons and two daughters. The entire family will be dancers this fall when his youngest child takes lesson.

Jerry says the thing he enjoys most about square dancing is the people because some of the nicest people square dance. When asked what the biggest problem facing square dancing is, Jerry replied, "Superficially it is maintaining numbers, but this is a very deep question." If you have read Jerry's column in the Promenader, you know Jerry address many facets of square dancing.

Jerry, a member of Callerlab since 1977, has attended callers clinics under the direction of Earl Johnston, Al Brundage and Dick and Ardy Jones. He is also a charter member and twice past moderator of the Callers Coop of Rochester. Jerry has been chairman (more than once) of the annual leadership conference jointly sponsored by the Federation and the Callers Coop.

Jerry calls for seven clubs, teaches two classes and guest calls frequently throughout New York State. His calling experience ranges from one night stands to advanced dancing and round dancing. His wife, Betty, accompanies him often as a round dance cuer and together they have sponsored beginner round dance classes during the summer.

Jerry has arrainged sound for the past ten years at Dance-O-Rama and has been on staff twice. For all the many things the Carmen's have done and are doing, the author of this column was pleased when Jerry and Betty were presented the Norma-Daphane Leadership award at the 1987 Dance-O-Rama.

The Carmens moved to Rochester when Jerry was hired as an engineer for Eastman Kodak Company. Betty, a math teacher, now teaches computers. They live at 2619 South Union Street in Spencerport. Their phone is 325-5504.

Quick Action Saves A Life

Lockport firefighters credited two women with saving a Tonawanda woman's life in Lockport Thursday evening.

Doris Lockridge, 72, of Tonawanda, remains in serious condition in the intensive care unit at Lockport Memorial Hospital where hospital officials today say she is "doing much better".


Firefighters said the woman collapsed about 8:30 p.m. at the Lockport Senior Citizens Center, 33 Ontario St.

When they arrived, they said two women were administering cardio-pulmonary resuscitation to the victim who had stopped breathing.

Florence Schaffer, identified as a nurse, and Jody Mettice, identified as an emergency medical technician and CPR instructor, did an "outstanding" job of keeping the victim alive, according to Capt. Robert Symes.

The city rescue crew of Matthew Streckwald, Kenneth Roth and Roger Cassell continued the CPR en route to the hospital.

JERRY'S FUNSHOP

As our name implies, we dance for fun. It is not important what program of dance you do, but what program you enjoy. This is the philosophy of the founders of Jerry's Funshop, Ruth and Blakely Harris, who have danced since 1967. The Club was started in the fall of 1978, and followed an earlier attempt to make all programs of dancing available in the Batavia area with a relaxed program of dancing In a club, the Wheel-A-Rounds, in which Jerry Carmen was the caller and Betty Wolcott was the round dance cuer.

A couple of years after the Relaxed club disbanded, Ruth, Blakely and Jerry decided to form an advanced club. It was hoped that those in the local clubs who wanted a different program of dance would come to this club and still support the local clubs. The original members of Jerry's Funshop were mostly from the Batavia Twirlers and the Promenading B's clubs. When the Batavia Twirlers club folded, there was no longer a nucleus of dancers available in the area, so the club moved to the Chili Community Center at the corner or Routes 33 and 259. The majority of the club's dancers at that time were from the Churchville area. We did not consider ourselves "advanced dancers" them, but we wanted to learn the Advanced calls and were willing to make a lot of mistakes along the way as long as we could have some laughs and smiles doing it.

After moving to Chili, the club attracted dancers from as far away as Bath, Auburn, and Savannah, and many dancers from the Rochester area who really enjoyed the all-position advanced program that Jerry calls. In the spring of 1987, circumstances made it impossible for us to retain the Chili Community Center as our dancing hall. Fortunatly, we were able to find a new "home", the Lutheran Church of Concord, 485 Holmes Road, Greece, where we are normally dancing three Sunday nights per month with A-2 workshop starting at 6:30 followed by regular A-2 dancing at 8:00. No rounds except on special occasions.

Our club is a caller-run club that operates with three couples serving on the Board of Directors. At present they are: Herm and Gloria Shippers, Bob and Sue Schlenker, Ken Ford and Terry Veniskey. We dance throughout the summer and have a summer picnic. During the rest of the year we have party nights to celebrate the various holidays. We welcome guests. People who join our club, or come as guests, find that when they go to festivals in this or other areas, they can execute the advanced calls with ease. We all thank Jerry for making this possible.

Jerry's Funshop also has a branch club that dances Saturday nights, twice a month, at St. Peter and John Church, Genesee Street, Auburn, New York. The A-1 Workshop begins at 6:30 and at 8:00 the A-1 dance begins. At 9:00 we begin the A-2 dance and continue to 10:30. We love to have guests. 
The Cloverleaf Squares Singles Club will host an afterparty on both Friday and Saturday evening at the Holiday Inn, following the regular dance schedule.

A couple that graduated from classes last spring from one of the oldest clubs in the area visited us tonight. They're on the brink of quitting square dancing. Why? "We had to take the Plus Workshop this summer so we can dance with the club this fall." They've literally studied the plus calls 'till they can recite the definitions, but have tremendous difficulty executing them. Is that fun - or even enjoyment?

Has a Plus Club got the right to take a class graduate and push them into plus or out the door? We, as square dancers, have the audacity to wonder why our numbers are declining! (This used to be a Mainstream Club - when their membership list was longer!) Are we all abiding by the rule: dance two years

Are we all abiding by the rule: dance two years before pursuing the Plus Program? (If this couple felt comfortable with mainstream, the Plus Workshop would be enjoyable.) Callers, you are guilty of a grievious offense to square dancing if you accept a beginning square dancer in your Plus Workshop. They won't be around long enough to be in your Advanced or Challenge Workshop! Clubs that permit new square dancers in your Plus Workshop are guilty of the same offense. (No wonder there's not a decent Plus dance in the area!)

Only Mainstream Clubs have the right to hold Beginners Classes. Plus Clubs should have Plus Workshops for two year (or more) mainstream dancers. Advanced Clubs should have Advanced Workshops for two year (or more) plus dancers.

New dancers, please seek out and find the fun and enjoyment of square dancing. Look in the **Promenader** schedule for mainstream dances. (The symbol "M" after the time denotes a mainstream dance.) Try a few Mainstream Dances at different locations with different callers and clubs until you find the club that's right for you. After investing a year of your time in square dance classes, don't leave square dancing because you're being pushed to plus. Enjoy square dancing in the mainstream program for a couple of years. If you love square dancing like I do, you'll want to be in it for the rest of your life. Take time to enjoy every aspect of each program.



Lima Grand Squares


