





PRESIDENTS

Even though a special committee made recommendations for Dance-O-Rama that were adopted just a year ago, this year letters from two local callers, Jerry Carmen and Mike Callahan, have made suggestions for radical changes in the operation of D-O-R. The whole subject is too important to be shrugged off by referring to another committee; it's important enough so that all of the Federation representatives should get involved, and through them, all of the clubs that are affiliated with the Federation.

The dancers and the club officers are reminded that, not only is D-O-R a Federation activity, but it is the only source of funds for carrying out other activities of the Federation. Your club's dues don't even pay for circulating the Minutes of the Meeting each month. Either we find ways to keep D-O-R healthy or we figure out some other way to support the Federation treasury!

You are also reminded that many of the clubs are dependent on the Federation and the United Square Dancers of America for their liability insurance, so it is directly important to you to keep both organizations healthy and prosperous.

Yeah, I'm lecturing. The chief desire of a wasp is that he won't be ignored, and that people will get the point.

Anyway, my hope is that the club officers and the dancers in the area will pay a lot of attention to the problems of D-O-R. Talk it over among yourselves, and especially with your Federation representatives, so they know what the club wants them to do. Remember that any member of a Federation club is welcome to attend meetings and speak their piece, and so is anyone else who is interested in the wellbeing of square dancing in the Rochester area, even though it is only the designated representatives that have a vote.

The specific points in the callers' letters were listed in the RAF Newsletter of 1987 August. The experience of the September meeting made it very clear that the problem is going to take a lot of time for discussion, and points 1 and 2 are on the agenda for the October meeting, which will unfortunately be history before you read this. Anyway, there'll be lots more to talk about, so get interested and involved. It's important to YOU!

And when we get D-O-R taken care of, there are still some other questions about the Rochester Area Federation that we need to be concerned about. Don't worry that your Fed reps are going to get bored. (Aside to the representatives: If you do get bored, please let me know, and we'll do something about it.)

SPOTLIGHT ON CLOVERLEAF SQUARES, INC.



Cloverleaf squares celebrated its 17th Anniversary In April by holding its benefit dance for C.U.R.E. Special guest was this year's C.U.R.E. Child. This was another example of the spirit typically found in both the dancing and in the willingness to pitch in where needed. Next year's CURE dance chairperson, Eleanor Miller, DOR-87 Chairperson Elsie Epke, and 1986-87 Federation President Dave Recklinghausen are all active Cloverleafs.

The club held its first dance April 5, 1970 at the Chili Town Hall with a new young caller, Bruce Shaw. The nucleus group of founders organized in a month's time after some differences with the year-old Swinging Singles Club. At an organizational meeting at Sylvia (Arnold) Kellogg's the group chose "Cloverleaf Squares" as a good luck/positive image name; and because of the time of year near St. Patrick's Day, and because Cloverleaf was a square dance call. The call became a symbol too - just ask a visiting caller who hears the clapping pattern every time "Cloverleaf" is called. The color green and the design of the badge became obvious to Bob Sponable, who designed it and soon became the first President and generous patron. Other founders were: Dick Naven, Paul Sutton, Ed Michaels, Ron Hyman, Linda (Blakeley) Hyman, Alberta (Winters) Tufts (now a caller in the Batavia area), Bobbie (Gell) Diehl and Donna Reifsteck. Many came long distances to dance - a pattern that continues as we now have members traveling from Geneva and the Buffalo Area.

Dances were on Tuesday or Sunday evenings depending on Bruce Shaw's changing work schedule. His friend, Mike Callahan taught the first class after he got out of the Army and a few years later Mike became, and still is, the club caller.

Past presidents still active in the club are: Carl DeGraff, Mike and Linda Liberti (now our cuers), Nancy (Ostrander) Herne, Shirley Mullan, Bill Saintey (a new cuer), and Dave Fisher. Lash LaRue and Bob Karam are other past presidents.

The club moved from the Chili Town Hall to the Lutheran Church on Holmes Road then to their current home, Trinity Episcopal Church on West Ridge Road. Cloverleafs, partly because of its nature as a Singles Club (couples are welcome members but cannot hold office) continues to attract large classes, many guests, and a full house most Sunday evenings all year around. Monthly social events encourage a spirit of comraderie; some of the most popular have been the Winter Weekends in the Adirondacks, cross-country skling, and clambakes. Differences with Swinging Singles have long since faded, with many dancers holding dual memberships. The two clubs co-sponsor a popular New Year's Eve party and Memorial Day picnic.

Cloverleafs sponsor two special dances each year:—"Summer Showcase", bringing Ron Libby to our area for the last several years, and a "Fall Showcase" with a variety of national callers. Probably the biggest undertaking for any Individual club will take place next year on Labor Day Weekend, when Cloverleafs host the National Convention for Single Square Dancers U.S.A. on September 2, 3, 4, 1988.

Cloverleafs look to the future with excitement and energy and welcome the rest of the Square Dance Community to its dances. For information call 671-2585. A special thank you to Sylvia Kellogg for her interesting recollections shared with this relatively new dancer.

Caller Profile



CHIP KELLOGG

Chip Kellogg started square dancing in 1970 with the Swinging Singles as a result of a radio advertisement. With the encouragement of Jerry Carmen, he began calling in 1972. Since that time, he has been a member of CCR where he served as moderator in 1973-74. He became an accredited member of Callerlab International in 1978, has attended four conventions, and presently serves on the Plus Quarterly Committee. Chip has also attended three caller's colleges with Earl Johnston and Al Brundage, Dick Jones and Johnny Davis, and most recently, Frank Lane and Vaughn Parrish.

At the present time, Chip calls an average of five nights a week. Mondays are devoted to an enthusiastic and growing group of Handicapable Dancers from area group homes. He teaches class for Copy Cats one night a week and does a four month "refresher course" for them every fall. The 1987-88 dance season will begin Chip's 26th beginner class. Wednesday evening and every other Friday are occupied with his own clubs, Town 'N' Country Squares (advanced program) and Melody Squares (plus program). Chip also calls for Happy Hoofers and shares the Circul-8-tors with Jerry Carmen. This, in addition to guest calling at clubs throughout New York and Pennsylvania, as well as calling two weeks a year at Marion Central Schools, keeps him very busy. Chip has also had the pleasure of calling in London, England and is a regular staff caller at the Tulip Festival in Holland, N. Y.

Chip says he could not do all this without the support and assistance of his wife, best friend, and business partner, Sue Yara. Besides helping Chip with Melody Squares and Town 'N' Country Squares, she also plans and organizes square dance camping weekends and trips. She is also the owner of CS Engraving and makes badges for most of the local square dance clubs as well as other engraving work for local businesses and non-profit groups.

In addition to these activities, Chip and Sue run a small farm, Melody Acres, in West Walworth where they live. They raise pork and beef and keep a few horses, rabbits and geese. Sue also does some free-lance accounting and tax work for local businesses while Chip's main occupation is his home remodeling business which he started more than 30 years ago.

Chip and Sue derive much enjoyment from square dancing and dance locally as well as at festivals as often as time allows. Chip feels that dancing makes him a better caller. They also work hard at promoting square dancing all year long at one-nighters and to anyone who shows an interest. These people are later contacted on an individual basis and invited to an open house. In their experience, this one to one contact is still the best method of winning new dancers.

Chip was asked "what is the biggest problem facing square dancing today" and "how can we keep more of the new graduates"? He feels that these are really one in the same. As we are all aware, the cost and effort of soliciting new dancers is much greater than keeping current club member. It would appear, however, that the square dance activity is losing more dancers than it is gaining; and many of these soon after class. This has been a topic of great concern at Calleriab as well as

BANNER STEALING RULES

1. Clubs wishing to take part in Banner Stealing must register with the local Banner Stealing Association of the Rochester Area Federation.

2. Those clubs registering with the Association must have at least one miniature Traveling Banner that will be used for stealing.

3. In order to steal a member club's banner, the Stealing (visiting) Club must have at least four couples (one square), who have paid the visitor's fee at the Host Club. A representative of the Stealing Club must then make it known to the President of the Host Club that they are attending the dance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's banner.

stealing the Host Club's banner.

4. In the event that more than one club is in attendance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's only available banner, it will be the duty of the President of the Host Club to determine some fair way to choose which of the Stealing Clubs will be awarded the banner.

5. Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve said banner by sending no less than four couples to the Stealing Club's dance and then they can take their banner back home. If a retrieving club also wishes to steal the banner of their hosts, they must then have a second four couples in order to be eligible. 6. At no time can a member club allow any other club to take a banner belonging to a third club. Also, when a club steals a banner from a club, it is the receiving club's duty to safeguard at all times the banner they have stolen. If said banner has not been retrieved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (three months), the banner should be returned to the owning club.

7. Banner stealing shall be restricted to regular club dances only, and does not include any special dances a club might hold and so designate. In addition to those dances so designated, any dance which has a caller other than the regular club caller shall be a special dance. If a club does not have a regular caller, all dances shall be regular club dances unless so designated.

Dear Maryin,

I read your article "Let Them Smell the Roses!" and had to write to tell you that I agree wholeheartedly. I have encountered many recent class graduates over the years who have said the same thing to me.

Chip and I stopped running a Plus workshop when we got almost entirely new graduates even though our flyer said specifically that only dancers who had danced with their club for at least one year should come. They said their club required that they learn Plus level before Fall so they were attending two workshops; ours and the one their club was putting on. As a result, Chip found he had to reteach many of the Mainstream basics before he could go on the the Plus calls.

Until all callers and clubs start thinking about the welfare of square dancing and square dancers as a whole, we face a dim future. They must also realize that we get a lot of "bad press" from the dancer who has been "pushed out the door". Not only do we lose that couple, but everyone they talk to about their experience - but I don't need to tell you that.

Thanks for speaking your mind. I hope more people listen before it's too late.

My compliments on the excellent article in the October **Promenader**, "Let Them Smell the Roses". You raised many valid points and provided us all with some food for thought. I agree 100% that no one should be pushed into dancing the Plus program before they are ready! With ten or more good Mainstream clubs in this area, on various nights, why should anyone feel pressured?

I also agree that it isn't usually feasible for Plus clubs to teach Mainstream classes although Cloverleafs has done it with smashing success for years. Most Plus clubs find they lose most of their couples to Mainstream clubs! At the cost of running a class, an impractical idea and not economically sound!

I do however take exception to the statement "Not a decent Plus dance in the area". I will invite anyone who feels that way to dance with us at Irondequoit Squares. If they don't feel they've been challenged adequately and had and an excellent evening, I will personally refund their ticket price out of my own pocket.

In closing, I'd like to say that I was dancing with a Plus club when I was half-way through Mainstream classes and I loved it! If anyone had tried to slow me down, I would have dropped out of square dancing once and for all time. I do not believe that anyone has the right to decide for another what program or speed they may progress at as long as their friends and fellow dancers want to, and enjoy helping them. I know and have talked to many who feel the same way. So the conclusion of the matter is, let's just be considerate of everyone's ambitions and aspirations and we can maintain a healthy balance in a happy community.







You meet many nice people that way, and in adjusting to the particular way they do things, you will improve your own dancing skills and your enjoyment. DO NOT dance in pre-arranged squares more than once or twice in an evening.






