

We, meaning the D-O-R committee and the Federation, will keep on trying to make the festival a most enjoyable occasion for dancers, from new graduates to those who like to dance A1 or A2. Because we know how important our class graduates are to the health of all square dancing, we will continue our special efforts to make them happy with their first festival experience, in the Mainstream hall. One of the improvements this year will be a much larger emphasis on decorations, to help give a more festive atmosphere to the occasion.

But Dance-O-Rama can't succeed without dancers. Please plan to come, and everybody -- dancers, callers, teachers -- encourage the class members to come, come with them, dance with them, and help them have a fine

time.

Another thing D-O-R can't succeed without is the active participation of folks from the Federation clubs, to serve on the Committee and do all the little jobs that have to be done to make it go. Joyce and Mike Ford are going to try very hard to get all the clubs involved, so

don't try to chicken out when you're asked.

The Leadership Conference held on January 31 was a great success. A total of 84 people (in spite of competition from Super Bowl) participated enthusiastically in the discussions, and many stayed afterward to enjoy a delicious dinner (as usual for the Green Lantern) and dancing with several CCR callers and cuers. We were most pleased to see a number of old friends there, but also a good turnout of folks who are new in leadership positions. We hope and trust they found a lot of ideas to take home with them and use, and also to pass on to their successors, when the time comes.

COMMENTS ON CCR 1987 QUESTIONNAIRE

Here are the comments that 81 people or couples wrote on their returns of the questionnaire circulated last November (see the February **Promenader**). They are divided into five sections: praise and approval for callers, suggestions for caller improvement, comments of interest to both callers and dancer leaders, comments on the annual Leadership Meeting (which is most likely history when you get to read this), and miscellaneous. I refuse to make any remarks about the fact that the second section is about six times as long as the first.

The double colon (::) separates remarks from different returns. A short dash (-) is used for different comments from the same person.

Letter



To the Editor, Promenader

I have read with much interest both the letter from Callerlab submitted by Mike Callahan, and Orio Hoadley's analysis of the Dance-O-Rama (CCR) questionnaires. both say: something is wrong with square dancing today. Keith Rippeto comes close, I think, to identifying the problem, and perhaps Orlo's second article will shed more light.

From my experience with the Federation and with a club that has been struggling to survive, I have come to the conclusion that there is one main problem with Square Dancing today, and it is spelled: C-a-!-!-e-r-!a-b. I have talked to many dancers and many experienced callers, both local and national, in forming this Oddly, most of the professionals agree, although their organization is not going in the direction they would choose.

The problem which Callerlab has created is called LEVELS. We now have about ten, from Basic to C4. This fractionates the dancing public, but worse, it has a devasting effect on the organizations that have been the heart of square dancing: the dancer-run clubs, who keep the spirit alive and who bring in the new dancers.

We started dancing in 1969, and sure, there were problems. It was hard to get beginners up to club level, and there were dancers who turned them away at the spring events: Dance-O-Rama and Trail End dances, by being snooty to them because their dancing was not perfect. But we learned well enough in 24 lessons to keep up with almost any club we visited. At the end of the next season we were having no more problems, and had not taken any workshops.

We were aware that there were a few people who wanted to dance more complicated calls, faster, better, or in some vague way "higher level." But we heard little about these. They were "invitation only" groups, usually small ones that met in someone's basement. All this did not effect the dancing in the regular clubs. It was not an officially recognized level, and there was no implication that all good dancers ought to aspire to

At this time we brought several of our friends into square dancing, and were pleased to do so. We thought we were introducing them to a pleasant activity. And we were.

A few years ago, the LEVELS started, and were promoted by the professionals. Most of the clubs decided that they did not want to be "only Mainstream" and chose Plus Level. Two things happened to them: 1) they could not train new members in 24 lessons, and most of them dropped out before reaching the club's level, and 2) the ones who made it were enthusiastic, and hard pushers, and imbued with the idea of "progressing." So they were easy prey for the advanced clubs to pick off. The "regular" club lost on both ends, and square dancing started slowly to lose its backbone organizations.

For ourselves, we perceived that we were no longer doing our friends a favor by asking them to join a class, and we stopped doing so. Obviously, a lot of others have too, including the new graduates, who may be even more negative and tell their friends to avoid it, as they quit in disgust after taking 30 lessons and not being able to dance.

So it is up to you, members of Callerlab: cut out the levels and get back to making square dancing FUN at a level that people can learn in 24 weeks and enjoy. Or look for other employment when the supply of club members runs out in a few years. Why wait for it to reach bottom?

FINANCIAL SUCCESS FOR YOUR CLUB

There are many problems that may cause a club to die, but certainly not financial ones! If income does not match expenses, someone has missed the boat! Hopefully this article will help solve future problems.

Lesson 1 INCOME MUST EQUAL OR EXCEED EXPENSES. (In a formula, I (income) = E (expenses). Easy enough! At the beginning of the year, there is a forwarding balance. If it is less than 0, we have our work cut out for us! If it is 0, we must plan very carefully. If it is above 0, we want to leave at least that amount for next year, so we'll consider ourselves at the 0 point.

Lesson 2 DETERMINE OUR CLUB'S EXPENSES. Make sure all anticipated expenses are included. Example:

- 1. Total hall rent for dance year
 - (\$30 per night, 25 nights).....\$750
- 2. Total callers fees for dance year
- (\$50 per night, 24 nights + \$100 quest caller),1,300
- 3. Cuer fees for dance year
- (\$20 per night, 25 nights)......500
- 4. *Club supplies for one year
- (including publicity, postage, and misc.)......100
- 5. Federation dues and insurance......100
- \$2,750
- * Item 5 is estimate, use past records to get as close as possible.

Lesson 3 DETERMINE OUR INCOME. We already know it has to be \$2,750.00, because I=E. Isn't this easy? If (for our example) we have 25 member couples, this year's dues must be \$110 per couple (\$55 per person). Sounds like a lot! (I know of no other hobby that costs less then \$55 per person a year, is as beneficial and fun, but....) If this figure is too high, some clubs use an installment plan, give discounts to chairmen of profitmaking dance committees, charge for coffee, refreshments, partles, etc.

Lesson 4 ADJUSTING INCOME AND EXPENSES. Your club's expenses will be different than our example. Your expenses may be higher or your income lower. Therefore, you will have to adjust to make I=E. You only have two options:

Option 1. Increase income. Increasing your membership list would help. Classes, workshops, visiting, and retension tend to do this over the long run, but usually not an instant answer.

Option 2. Decrease expenses.

Expense #1 - Hall rent. Your landlord may consider lower rent rather than no rent at all. Can't hurt to

ask. Investigate less expensive halls.

Expense #2 and #3 - Caller/cuer fees. Talk to the caller/cuer about a lower fee. This may come as a surprise to you, as well as your caller/cuer, but CALLER/CUER FEES ARE NEGOTIABLE. It may come to the point where the caller/cuer must accept a lower fee, or be replaced with a caller/cuer the club can afford. Consider one talented person that can both call and cue. The total expense may be less.

Expense #3 and #4 - Supplies and dues. Usually there's not much room to economize on these items, but

check it out!

Lesson 5 IF WE WANT TO SURVIVE, WE GOTTA DO IT! Making I=E sounds easy but executing lesson 4 is difficult. There's no other way to be sure of surviving. Guests and special dances are nice but can not and should not, repeat can not and should not, be relied on to make our club financially sound. Guest revenue (nice if we can get it) will make extras affordable for our club; extras like decorations, special parties, officer and caller/cuer awards for their hard work.

Conclusion. A club cannot exist if income is less than expenses. The responsibility for this usually rests directly on club presidents and board members. Start and plan your financial year with your eyes open. Make sure I=E. It doesn't just happen! Good planning is the starting point; cooperation and support of members, caller/cuer, and landlord make it a success!

Callers Co-op

CALLER APPROVAL

Is friendly, takes time to explain, walks thru:: Good "dance by definition" caller:: Uses most of the Plus calls:: Good personality:: Pleasant personality:: Teaches well, is patient:: Callers (2) call from all positions even at beginner level:: Like caller for ability, personality, appearance:: Good calling technique, personality:: He's accurate, mixes interesting calls.

Clear (Editor: voice or directions?), patient :: Original and challenging choreography :: Good technique and personality (but personal appearance needs improvement) :: Most friendly to dancers :: Caller's patience :: Good personality :: Calls to the level of the dancers :: Pleasant voice, but sometimes tips are too long :: Patience, clear understandable voice :: Clear diction :: Precision timing :: Patience and personality :: Calls are clear and varied.

CALLER IMPROVEMENT

In the next paragraphs (A): means that the comment was addressed to All Callers; (S): to Some callers, and (1): to one particular (unidentified) caller the dancer has in mind.

New callers should teach at least two years before calling for a club, and should have to be approved by Callers' Co-op:: Callers should never have another caller who may be on the floor call a tip:: Use Yellowrock sparingly:: Don't call predictively:: (A): Call full Plus vocabulary:: Workshop when the set breaks down:: Callers' Co-op should adopt a Code of Ethics if none exists (Editor: One does).

Class teachers should not form a new club to pirate class graduates from the sponsoring club :: Teacher cuts lessons off too soon (Ed: too few lessons or too short?) :: He talks a lot while teaching :: When we break down have him help us, not holler at us :: Call to the floor; have a walk-thru of breakdown problems.

Boring because of low level calls :: Those of us who only dance Plus and don't want to dance a higher level need creative calling to keep us stimulated :: Walk through calls when squares are having difficulty; there are so few opportunities to learn Plus calls :: Stop if the floor goes down :: (S): Watch the floor, walk through calls that the floor has trouble with :: (S): Know your calls, keep club dancing, pay attention to what is happening on the dance floor.

(A): Don't take too much time between square tips :: (1): Be ready to call down if crowd cannot dance to your level :: (S): Be prepared to walk through any new specific calls that the floor is having difficulty with :: (S): Watch floor for problems; some callers do not watch the dancers enough :: Watch the floor and workshop calls missed - workshop experimentals and quarterlies before doing or calling.

(3-4): Act professional! Leave your hot tempers at home, stop stabbing other callers in the back :: Have "Intern callers" so we can depend on a "caller" to have a certain expertise and eliminate this "hired help" nonsense :: Should be more Mainstream dancing for those coming from class, and more workshops for those same people to learn Plus level.



Have short tips - have at least one hot-hash tip - more short-term classes or workshops for all levels - do not graduate dancers until able to dance at class level :: Talks excessively about trivia, sometimes crude :: (A): Cut out chatter and joking that is drivel :: (A): They all don't call the new Quarterly calls each month.

Prefer not constantly striving to learn new calls; more basic grounding in all-position dancing with Mainstream calls; people not satisfied should join another club with the challenge they want - for older retired folk have afternoon club for singles and couples (Ed: How about the Silver Squares?) - require repetition of the learning course for those who really can't handle the calls - frequent review, re-teaching, reinforcement of the Plus calls - have shorter tips and add one tip to the session.

Newer dancers need more reinforcement of calls:: Not enough dancing:: The worst problem facing experienced dancers today is graduating people who cannot qualify for club dancing:: Don't like repetition of calls:: Quit pushing new dancers with Plus workshop:: Caller gets carried away and makes things too tough:: Callers need to make sure that dancers learn all the steps of a call:: "Old, old advice": keep the floor dancing and don't worry about the word "level".

(1): Quit the "horsing around" :: Avoid monotony: keep calls simple for club dancers but use all the calls they have learned :: (1): too sarcastic :: Everything doesn't have to be a Pass Thru or Trade By :: Call to the majority of the dancers :: Adults should not be treated like naughty children: callers are employees of clubs and should have a little respect for them :: Do not like caller's attitude: I feel that he speaks poorly about our club among others.

There are two callers that I have danced to a great deal, and rate their calling as Good, but my opinion of their attitude is that they have pushed both beginners and old dancers away:: Not high enough A2 levels:: Callers should tell dancers when they cannot dance the level they think they can:: Give the name of a new call before teaching it:: APD should be kept to a minimum below A1 level: we're not looking for challenge or pressure.

For a festival weekend don't use unusual choreography and don't overdo teaches - if you teach a call make it a useful one that you might use in the future :: Quit showing off - Don't single out one couple to comment on lack of skill :: Doesn't follow through on latest calls: teaches and doesn't repeat :: He talks too much :: Corny remarks repeated too often :: Talks too much :: Make dances challenging as well as fun :: Talks too much :: Talks too much :: Talks too much.

Would like more review of Plus calls :: Stop calling to your own sex :: Needs to improve appearance :: Sometimes calls too fast :: I come for high level :: Enunciate more clearly :: Too much the same every week :: Poor selection of music :: Needs improvement of personality, grooming - not lively enough :: Wish he'd call something new :: Teach more Plus calls :: Dance level too low.

FOR CALLER AND CLUB LEADERS

How to get class members up to Plus level without holding club dancing down :: Stop pushing new graduates into more classes too soon :: (Ed: So help me, these two returns were right next to each other in the pile!) :: Quit pushing new dancers with Plus workshop :: Is it time for the clubs in the Rochester Area to be converted into caller-run clubs?

"Clubs and callers have to make some way of graduating spring classes, to go through a 2nd series of classes before they go on to dancing Plus dances. They and we weren't ready and we lose a lot of dancers who are discouraged and drop out. Maybe two years of classes and second year attend more and more higher level dances to get used to Plus dancing. Maybe a combined 2nd year learner's class and a neutral teacher and each one while in year 2 committed to one year of dancing at Plus level in their original club."

Our club has cliques that harm the club :: There should be a workshop for Plus calls before club dance at least once a month, or a once-a-month workshop somewhere for those not sure of all calls :: More singing calls - live music makes dancing even more fun - consolidate smaller clubs; big dances (10+ squares) are much more enjoyable.

High-level clubs should not draw dancers from other clubs without replacing the dancers they have taken :: New clubs should not be formed without first having conducted beginners' lessons - Could CCR and the RAF get together to plan combined beginner classes? :: We believe the more successful clubs are those dancing every week :: More mixer dances to stir up the couples; how about a men's choice, announced ahead of time?

Two-year class for beginning dancers and teach all positions: teach the RULE, not the call:: What are MS calls and what are Plus calls? - Maybe we need to teach some more Plus calls in MS so that we can have an MSP club:: Too many clubs and callers raiding dancers into higher level but not training their own beginners - These Plus and A to Z clubs should encourage dancers to attend their MS club; after all that's where their dancers come from - maybe the Callers' Co-op or Federation could think of some way to stop this.

Club's dancing level too low :: Like the people in the club :: Simplify the learning process: new dancers are overwhelmed when they hear they must attend 30 classes---and then they need more workshops to reach a Plus level :: There are too many clubs in Rochester :: Like the fellowship :: Less lost time between rounds and squares.

1987:(rated) 2: Moderator should keep the group on track, limit ramblers, encourage participation :: 1987:4: Should have small group discussions and response to specific questions or problems assigned :: 1986:3: We've heard all the problems over and over again; we need solutions :: Ways to raise club levels :: Discuss etiquette, participation, methods for integrating new grads into the club; have class graduates attend.


Discuss basic courtesies of dancing :: Put dancers in charge of the meeting... Interesting but problems are rehashed - not sure that there are any real answers to most problems :: Remember that the problems of city clubs and rural clubs are different :: How to attract new dancers to classes - how to attract visitors to club dances - Combine several clubs to run classes more economically? :: How to retain dancers :: Try to interest young people.

There should be a certain personal loyalty to the club whose members give of their time to help people learn to square dance:: Lack of enthusiasm of round-dance cuer: his comments have lost round dancers... Cuers should get some new records; old classics are worth repeating but some old are not classic.

As I said before, there is no way of identifying how many individual callers may be the cause of some of the repeated comments, or of the compliments, either. Take your own quess.

Let's finish with a letter that was written on the back of one of the questionnaire returns:

"I have danced for more than 10 years. I love dancing both round and square. I can enjoy a well-called Mainstream dance even though I prefer Plus level.

I am not a critical person, but I do feel that some things are going wrong in the square dance world. Some of my ideas on what the problem is:

1. Too much emphasis on level of dance.

2. Disloyalty of callers to the clubs they call for -- sometimes vice versa.

3. Lack of friendliness between clubs and dancers. In this regard I like the banner-stealing idea. We should all be visiting -- supporting and enjoying each other.

4. No-one wants to be the workers -- club officers -- Federation officers -- all the things that have to happen if we are to go on.

My own personal pet peeve -- I belong to a club which regularly invites other clubs to come and be our free guests for the evening. 99.9% of the time no-one comes. I mean, we have invited as many as four clubs, and got one couple.

I thought square dancers were friendly."



EKC-O Squares was the first industry-sponsored Western square dance club in the area, and was founded in 1961. In May, 1986, we celebrated our 25th anniversary by holding a dance that was free to everyone. It was truly a fun night, and good to see the floor filled with happy, laughing faces of dancers having fun.

Two years later, we find that it has become impossible to continue with our club. The lack of membership growth and the small attendance at weekly dances has taken its toll. Because of the lack of membership growth, we find it impossible to maintain changes in leadership. Of those members eligible to serve in a leadership capacity, most have served two to five years in one capacity or another. Without new blood, there are no new ideas - over the last ten years, almost every avenue has been explored in the on-going effort to continue with EKC-O Squares.

At one point in our history we had as many as twelve dances a year with national callers, and had in Ken Anderson a national caller as our club caller. We are proud of the facility Kodak has always allowed us to use - we fee! it is the best facility in our square dance community and it is a shame it will be lost. We are proud of the fact that Kodak has never restricted our dances to employees only - it's true only Kodak employees could join EKC-O Squares, but anyone could come dance at our dances. We are proud of our present leadership and membership that have shown their loyalty to the club and have tried to find a way to continue.

But, continue we can not. We're saddened, but we make the decision with heads held high, determined not to look back and dream of what was. We had good times, made wonderful friends - now it's time to move ahead. the date of our last dance will be May 24, 1988. We invite all square dancers to join us any Tuesday night until that date.

On March 1, Gary and Alice Bubel will call and cue. They were with us last October and we look forward to another of the fun nights they provide.
