EDITOR'S EDITORIAL

Editorial is defined as a newspaper or magazine article that gives the opinions of its editors or publishers. The following is the opinion of the Promenader's editor.

The Special Events Calendar has been working so well, - up to now! The number of listings indicate that it is of value. Conflicts have been resolved, and

people are using it.

Clubs have been very considerate by trying to avoid listing two events on the same date. Two events on the same date can lessen attendance at both events. Listing two events on the same date discourages use of the calendar: what's the point if other clubs schedule over your event? Listing two events on the same date puts us right back to where we were before the calen-

Listing two events on the same date shows no consideration for the sponsor of the event already listed. To insist on a date that is already scheduled seems to say, "I don't care about you and your event, mine is more important." Up to now, - clubs have gone out of their way to avoid this. Some have rescheduled events, which has involved rescheduling the caller, hall and a lot of extra work. Some, being unable to reschedule, simply went ahead with their event, but were gracious enough not to insist on being listed in the Special Events Calendar. Some resolved the conflict by talking to the other club. Seems all have been governed by a sense of cooperation and consideration - up to now. Insisting on a double listing only diminishes this spirit of cooperation and consideration.

ARE WE TOO AFFORDABLE?

This month's editorial was prompted by a visit Carole and I made recently to a very nice (and expensive) restaurant to celebrate Carole's birthday.

I knew it was not "the average" restaurant, when as we pulled into the driveway, two valets rushed out to open doors for us and then parked the car. It was disappointing, however, as we walked in to find no cloak room, but in fact only hooks in the walls on both sides of the foyer, which meant that our coats would be completely unsecured.

The building itself was new and nice but not anything extra special. The entrees were high in price and all a-la-carte. Salads were \$4.00 extra with no choice of dressing. The waitress brought you one roll at a time and only if you asked for one. The potato with a fancy name turned out to be pan fries (about five slices). I would have preferred baked but they were not available. The fancy-named sauce for my filet mignon turned out to be brown gravy and dessert was another \$4.00 each. When the \$80.00 bill came (Tip Included) I have to admit that the word "Ripoff" did come to mind.

As we sat there sipping our tea and coffee, I posed a question to Carole, "What makes this restaurant worth this kind of money"? we both agreed that the owner established what his place was worth when he had the menus printed. He told the public he is running an expensive restaurant and they are flocking to his place and paying the price, to the point where we overheard the hostess tell people over the phone that they were completely booked for the following night.

We do the same thing in Square Dancing. We establish what our recreational activity is worth by our fee for admission at a dance. Unfortunately, by today's standards, we are telling the whole world that SQUARE dancing is not worth very much when we offer an evening's entertainment for \$2.50 or \$3.00 per person. What else can you do for that amount of money? Stop at McDonalds? Maybe. Go to a movie? No! Go to a comedy club? No! Have one drink at a lounge? Hardly!

What other kind of dance lessons can you take for the price we charge to learn Square Dancing? None!

For twenty-two years now, I have watched clubs reluctantly and slowly increase their admissions fee from \$1.25 to \$2.50 per person, while inflation was running rampant all around us. Meanwhile our dancers have accepted that fact that cars now cost \$15,000, trailers \$10,000, motor homes \$30,000, going out to dinner costs \$20 to \$25 per person, etc., etc.

Why do we insist on telling people how little Square Dancing is worth while clubs are not taking in

enough money to meet expenses?

Maybe it's time to take a different look at the way we market our Product? Should we be trying so hard to make Square Dancing "affordable" that nobody is Interested? Do people really want something that is "affordable" or do they want to reach a little? They certainly don't buy "affordable" homes, cars, vacations, etc., etc.

If we want this activity of ours to live forever, we must keep it solvent and also attractive. I see very little in this world that is both cheap and attractive. Let us know your thoughts on this.





COUNTRY DANCERS OF ROCHESTER

Some newer dancers probably wonder about the club called Country Dancers of Rochester. Just what is a contra club? How did it get to be part of Federation, a western square and round dance organization?

Contras are a recreational form of dance, requiring little learning, much sociability and great music. The dances are round dances (predetermined patterns are set to a phrase of music and each dance may be called or the patterns may be memorized). Contra dances are like squares, in that the 18 or so basic figures are those used in square dancing. Contra dances are different in that you dance with many other couples in each dance. Usually the formation is "longways" (like the Virginia Reel), but can also be in a circle of partners. Other formations are used as a change of pace. The common factor is that partners stay together and progress to another couple to repeat the sequence.

In 1975, Mitzi Collins (a Rochester folk singer and recording artist) and her husband, Tom Bohrer, thought a dance group could be started doing the old Playford English dances and some older contras on a once a month basis. Ed and I joined that group, meeting at the Genesee Co-op. Music for the dances was provided by the Blackthorn Ceidleh Band while Mitzi played for the English country dances. Soon some transplanted New Englanders joined the group. They wanted Tom to add New England styling to his program and start meeting weekly.

This gave birth to Country Dancers. We met every Wednesday at St. Thomas Episcopal Church. The first meeting, June 23, 1976, featured Tod Whittemore calling with the Blackthorn Ceidlidh Band. No experience was necessary, dress was casual and admission was \$1.50.

We were very informal. Often callers and bands were hired at the last moment. A loose policy evolved around the concept that this group would be open to everyone. Membership was not necessary - but did save dancers \$.50 a dance and provided a newsletter mailed to their home.

As new leadership assumed control, it became apparent that dancers preferred live music and we have had live bands since.

Read our club news column to find out more about Most of our club members are under 40 and our favorite dances have lots of swinging. It's not how old you are that counts - but having lots of energy is necessary. We have no lessons, but each dance is "Walked through" before being danced to the music. The orientation within the set tends to confuse square dancers in the beginning, but since the pattern is repeated for each dance it is soon learned. It is often said of contras that "the caller tells you what to do and the music tells you when to do it. Do join us.

POLICY ON LEVELS -by Maryin Dailey

The concept of Square Dance Levels has, years ago, changed to Square Dance Programs. (You knew that, but it got your attention.) Callerlab, a well known, long established, association of hard working individuals has strived long and hard to organize and define square dance calls into various programs. Remember the confusion before Callerlab's work in this area? Whenever you attended a dance other than your own, you had no idea what calls would be used. Callerlab's work in this area has benefited us all. (You may not agree with Callerlab, but you must cooperate with them to change them.)

These well defined and established programs - not ievels - help us communicate. Use of defined vocabulary enables and facilitates understanding. When terms such as "club level" (undefined), "Mainstream Plus" (undefined), or "Plus 2" (undefined), are used, very little information is conveyed (other than exhibiting lack of square dance knowledge). Speak of the Mainstream Program, Plus Program, Advanced 1 or A2 Program. These terms convey information because they are defined.

Writers of square dance literature and callers, by the nature of their occupation, are put in the position of leadership as are the dear individuals that assume club offices. Strive to use these terms correctly. The square dance world learns from you.

The **Promenader's** purpose is communication. A P following dance information in the schedule implies the Plus Program (which includes the Mainstream Program) will be used. When M is used, it is assumed the Mainstream Program will be used. When both P and M are used (a bit confusing), it is assumed both the Mainstream and Plus Program will be used. (Accomplished by using 2 halls and 2 callers or dividing the evening timewise into a Mainstream portion and a Plus portion.)

Let's make an extra effort to use the correct terminology in our reports, articles, and ads. We'll be able to communicate more effectively, appear better educated, and help instruct others.




The Anniversary Dance will be a special dinner dance, with many former Triggers there to help us celebrate our Silver Anniversary. It is going to be a


On April 11, we will have a fashion show for all class and club members sponsored by Sally's Square Line. Come on out and see the new spring fashions.
