Promenader 428 Johnson Road Bergen, New York 14416 One of the important news items at the time of this writing is that Bud and Flo Parker have agreed to chair the nomination committee for new Federation officers. All dancers should remember that the Federation cannot operate without officers, and, according to Chape Blake, there are now 20 clubs and over 1300 dancers covered by the Federation's group insurance policy with the United Square Dancers of America. Those 20 clubs should remember that without the Federation they would have to scratch elsewhere for their insurance, and the Federation can't exist without people willing to take on the responsibility of the Federation offices.

What this all says to me is that the affiliated clubs had better take on a serious interest in the welfare of the Federation, or they're likely to find themselves in a real bind!

The other problem the RAF is facing right now is the future of Dance-O-Rama. I have received just three responses (less than 10%) to the questionnaires that Dick and Mary Kosbab (of Boots & Slippers) made sure got into the hands of the presidents of each Federation club. One club thinks that DOR should be dumped, one thinks it's fine the way it is and pledges the whole-hearted cooperation of the club in staging DOR, and the third wants to leave the DOR program the way it is but have it in a different place.

Anyone who agrees with the third answer should be aware that the present DOR program requires five dance halls. The possibility of finding better accommodations has been studied for several years without coming up with any good answers. So the choices are: (1) continue as we are, (2) dump Dance-O-Rama completely and come up with some other way to find funds to operate the Federation, (3) find a better place to hold DOR in its present form, which nobody has been able to do yet, or (4) cut down on the DOR program to require fewer halls, and then find a place that will accommodate the reduced program.

Meanwhile, Dick  $\epsilon$  Mary have resigned from the DOR Committee. However, we have been able to find an excellent pair to do the job: Roger and Nancy Dart, of the Promenading B's. So it looks like DOR is safe through 1990, at least.

The committee is of course always glad to hear suggestions for the improvement of DOR. The other side of this coin is, don't be surprised if the suggestion has been made before, and someone has already considered the undesirable side-effects that haven't occurred to you.

Just don't forget that it takes more than a small committee to put on a successful Dance-O-Rama; it takes the enthusiastic cooperation of all of the Federation clubs. Don't say no when you are asked to contribute your share of the effort.



#### SPOTLIGHT on



'Twas a dark and stormy night in January, 1970 when several square dancing couples gathered together to form a traveling club composed of dancers from other clubs. Their first trip was to Hawaii. 250 people went on a two-week, first-class tour for \$515.00 each! Non-dancers helped fill the second plane on that not-to-be-forgotten journey in February, 1972. Returning home, Rochester airport was snowbound, so all passengers (and pineapples) had an overnight stay in New Jersey added to their itinerary. Friendships made on that trip are still in existence today.

Since then, the Circul-8-tors have had a diversity of trips. We have been to Europe, Spain and Portugal, Nashville, the British Isles, Hawaii (again), Nova Scotia, Holland (Mi.), Mexico, Agawa Canyon in Canada and the MASDA Festival in Montreal. Our September, 1987, trip was to Quebec City, the Laurentian Mountains, and Toronto.

Our first caller Don Pratt and his wife went on many of the trips with us. When he retired, we were fortunate in securing two more top-notch callers. Jerry Carmen and Chip Kellogg alternate their calling duties during our September-through-May dances. These are held one Sunday a month in Penn Yan or Fairport. After the dance and brief business meeting, we go forth to a nearby restaurant for dinner. Visitors are always welcome. At the same time that Jerry and Chip joined us, we were also happy to be able to add Betty Carmen and Dottie Reed, everyone's favorite cuers, to share cuing responsibilities. In August we have a campoutpicnic. Originally, this was a picnic-only held at Bonnie Brae in Prattsburg. It was moved to Keuka Lake State Park and is now held at a private campground. During the dance season we have an Open House, Potluck Dinner, Christmas Party, Silent Auction, and Presidents' Day Dance.

Our membership currently covers the greater Rochester area, the Finger Lakes region, the Southern Tier and Shinglehouse, Pa. Our members are of a most generous and cooperative nature. They give willingly of their time and talents, which are much in evidence when gifts are presented to Hillside Children's Center at Christmas time, and we donated \$200 to CURE in 1987. This was raised by selling members and friends their own color snapshot taken at our February dance, which had a red, white, and blue theme.

On Friday, May 20, 1988, members will be going out to dinner and square dancing afterwards. Any EKC-0 members interested in joining the group should contact


