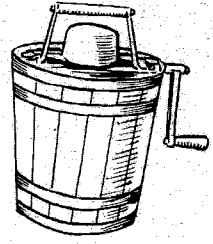

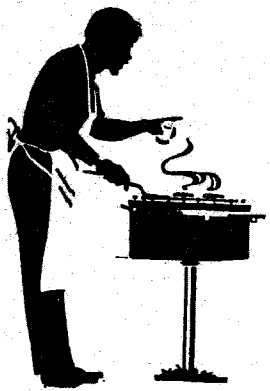

Many of our newest dancers were there, and it was apparent that they thoroughly enjoyed their first experience with festival dancing. There seemed to be a special communication among the four staff callers, and cooperation in passing on to the dancers an appreciation of the joys of square dancing. The Federation owes a standing vote of thanks to Joyce and Mike Ford, Chairmen of the 1988 D-O-R, to the committee chairmen who so ably assisted them, to callers Anne and Joe Uebelacker, Mac McCall, and Jim Wheeler, to Bob and Nora Slomcenski for directing activities in the round-dance hall, to the local round-dance teachers who provided round dancing in the Plus hall and callers who called for square dancing during the dinner period, and to the many club members of the Rochester-area clubs who took care of the many jobs that need to be done.

This year's D-O-R also proved that enough dancers will support the festival to make it possible to continue in the same format: square-dance halls at three vocabulary levels and a hall devoted to round dancing. Unfortunately the contra hall was not possible this year, because mechanical problems at the Tuttle gym building prevented us from using the five halls we have had in the past. The permanent-committee system that the Federation adopted recently is working very well, and will make the staging of future Dance-O-Ramas easier for all concerned.

Two of the callers already contracted for next year are Jim Mayo of New Hampshire and John Kaltenthaler of Pennsylvania. Both of them have excellent and well-deserved nation-wide reputations. Of course we will always need the continued cooperation of the Federation clubs, in helping with the work of staging the festival, and in publicizing the many benefits of attending, especially to our newest dancers: the recent class graduates.

The joint chairmen for next year's dance are Joan Sanford and Rita Hoadley. Both are particularly interested in hearing whether there are any features (workshops, seminars, etc.) you would like to have added to the program beyond the square dancing, round dancing, and vendors of clothing and square-dance accessories.

Since this is the last of my President's, Corner columns, I wish to express my appreciation and thanks for their hearty cooperation and lively interest to the other members of the Executive Board, and to the Federation members who have cooperated in conducting the business affairs of the Federation. God bless us, every one!

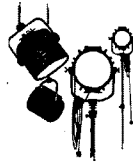

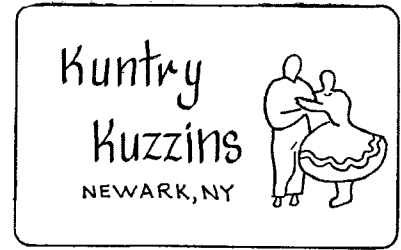

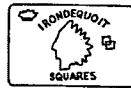
Friday night Golf League at Deer Field to run from May 20 through August 26.

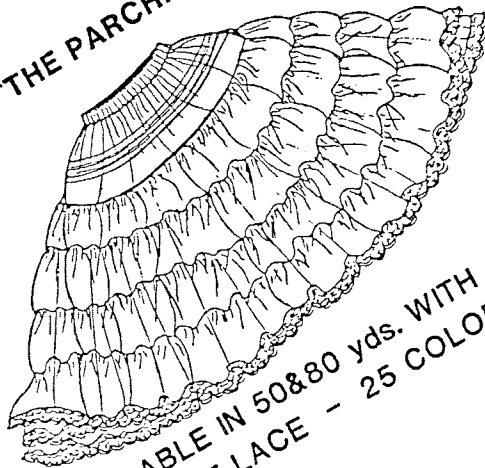

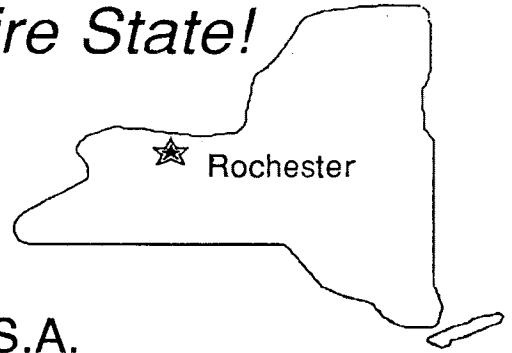

My wife and I were not dressed in fancy matching blue outfits like theirs.

I feel after dancing 15 years, including Advanced, I can dance as well as this group. The club they belong to is an advanced level club and after dancing that long they should know some square dance etiquette! (This incident was also noted by other people.) If it was up to me only, I would never square dance again, as I was very hurt. Square dancing is for fun and relaxing. Don't ruin it, Old Dancers!

Dear Editor,

In response to Orlo Hoadley's letter in the May Promenader, we would like to set the record straight regarding our resignation as Dance-O-Rama chairmen for 1990.

First, we did not "make sure a questionnaire got into the hands of the presidents of each club". We passed out a suggested questionnaire at a Federation meeting, the purpose of which was to determine exactly what the clubs want in regards to Dance-O-Rama. We gave extra questionnaires to Orlo Hoadley with the suggestion that, if the questionnaires were to be used, that extras be sent to those clubs not present in order to get an overall view.

In talking to present and past chairmen of DOR, it seemed that there was a lack of cooperative spirit in putting on the dance in recent years, and it was our intent to find out whether the majority of clubs (#1) wanted the dance to continue as is and were willing to actively put it on, (#2) wished to change the format, or (#3) wished to discontinue it. We hoped the response would be #1 or #2, but felt it important to give the third choice as an alternative.

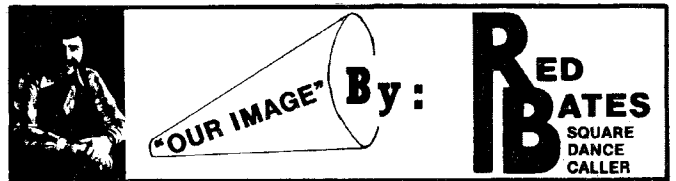
The reason we made the presentation at a Federation meeting was because Orlo Hoadley suggested we do so when we raised our concerns at the DOR Committee Meeting. Not knowing why DOR support seemed hard to garner, we decided to analyze the problem and communicate what we had gathered from many conversations with dancers, callers, and cuers this past year. When we presented this at the Federation meeting, the attitude of some of the officers present made it apparent to us (and others) that they were not interested in the content of the presentation. As a result, we decided it would be best for all concerned that we resign since the format to the DOR Committee necessitates close cooperation among the chairmen for several years.

In addition, Mr. Hoadley states in his letter "not to be surprised if the suggestion has been made before and someone has already considered the undesirable side effects that haven't occurred to you". Does this mean that new people seeking ways to improve the dance should not look at suggestions given to them just because they have been considered before? Time and circumstances often change an earlier "impossibility" into a very viable solution, and it seems to us that continual reappraisal is not only healthy, it is necessary to keep the problem solving process dynamic.

In closing, we realize and appreciate the fact that Mr. Hoadley has contributed much to the round and square dance community over the years; however we felt we had to clarify the events leading up to our resignation. This, in no way, diminishes our support and appreciation of the round and square dance community which has become such an important part of our lives.

We have all kept our activity a big secret from the general public. Most of our publicity is directed at those who are already enjoying Square Dancing through publications for Square Dancers. We are inbred! We are all aware of what happens when there is too much inbreeding and not enough new blood coming in to any group.

I pick up all kinds of magazines, newspapers, etc., and see ads for every activity except Square Dancing. On TV, we are constantly exposed to ads for aerobic classes, weight reducing classes, exercise machines, and other health related activities - why not Square Dancing? Certainly Square Dancing is an excellent form of exercise, especially for older people. I would like to drive down the highway and see a billboard advertising Square Dancing and its virtues.

Maybe it's time we got some professional advice on how to market our great form of recreation - to let "John Q. Public" know the truth about Modern Square Dancing.
