





"What can we do to raise some money?"

"Have a square dance."

"We can't do that...no one would know how to do

"Sure we can...it's fun even if you don't know what to do."

And so went the discussion at the tribal meeting of the Tecumseh Tribe at the Red Men's Club (latter named the Red Men's Party House) in early 1972, with Ed Sulewski, Frank Claccia, and Walt Oyer on the "positive side".

With Frank as chairman and beginner square dance caller Bruce Shaw, the dance was held that summer and was a huge success. It spawned great enthusiasm for the tribe to organize a square dance club. With Ed as initiator, Tecumseh squares was born. Ed and his wife Sue did the bulk of the work, along with being presidents for three successive years, 1973, '74, '75. Starting with a bang, that summer saw the first of the annual make-your-own "Sundae Tuesdays" (that was the night they danced until a few years ago) and the Strawberry Social. Mid-term balls were held from the beginning, too. Other special events now include gourmet dessert nights, mystery rides, and recently New Year's Eve dinner-dances.

In 1974, rounds were instituted with Bob Slom-censki. Other caller and cuers involved throughout the years were Chip Kellogg, Jack Sadwick, Mike and Linda Liberti, and George Burch.

Bruce has stuck with the club through thick and thin, and together the club has grown to be the funfilled "family" club that it is. And where would Tecumseh Squares be without the years of promotion and dedication of George and Una Shaw!

Among the beneficiaries of the club's treasury and 50/50 funds have been Indiar children in the Southwest, a youngster who needed glasses, a woman who required transportation to England, and for the past several years, the Al Sigl Center.

With Bruce Shaw continuing as our caller, the 1988-189 season will see Mike and Linda Liberti returning to share cuing with George Burch. Dances are held every Friday in the newly-enlarged Red Men's Party House, 1001 Lexington Avenue, with rounds workshop beginning at 7:30.

Come share in the friendliness you will find awaiting you at Tecumseh Squares.

38th National Square Dance Convention®

OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA JUNE 22, 23, 24, 1989

One of the eight tours to be offered as a sidelight to the 38th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City, June 22, 23, and 24, 1989, includes a visit to the world famous National Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Center.

The tour, identified as "Centennial Trail 1" features Oklahoma City. Other tours will include more of the Convention City, as well as other Oklahoma cities.

Many of us square dancers have never had the opportunity to see an honest-to-goodness dyed-in-the-wool rodeo. Performances are scheduled for Friday, June 23, (9:45 pm) and Saturday, June 24 (4:00pm). This is no ordinary rodeo -- no sirree! This will be sanctioned by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA), and points will be awarded to rodeo contestants toward their quest for season awards and championships.

For two hours of great excitement and entertainment, the cost of tickets will be \$9.00 apiece... however, if you order tickets in advance (with registration for the convention), you can get 'em for \$7.00 each.

NOTE: The "life" of a quarterly selection is three years after which time calls that have remained as quarterly selections for that length of time are dropped as quarterly selections and referred to the appropriate committee for possible addition to the appropriate program. In keeping with this policy, Minibusy and Checkover were dropped and have been referred to the Chairman of the Advanced Dancing Committee, for possible addition to the Advanced Program.
