To the Editors of the Promenader;

I read with interest the article "Approaching Square Dancing from the Outside" and I feel that the term "workshop" would be a good way to go. As you indicate this term would not be objectionable to one's senses and would give a whole new meaning to the learning process.

As your last paragraph suggests, caution should be used with any new ideas but they should be given a chance to see if the ideas have merit.

At the Open House dance of the Club, the new, to-be square dancer could be introduced to the basic calls such as do se do, grand right and left, promenade, and a dozen other basic calls. New members would be accepted that night and could continue to be with the friends that brought them.

At regular dances the program calls (calls from the program the club regularly dances) could be workshopped for the benefit of all and as basic calls are used they could also be workshopped. The caller could plan his or her dance for that night and include the workshop material as needed. This would allow new members to dance with their friends, instead of one or two years later.

What I have suggested would put added responsibility on the caller and club members to clearly understand and explain to the new members the definitions and parts or fractions of each call used and it would also make a stronger all around club.

Two hours of such a workshop, dance night and onehalf hour for more dancing by the experienced members might be a program to start with and then adjustments could be made to it to satisfy everyone.

[The following information is supplied by RAF Insurance Chairperson, Chapin Blake (381-2191). It concerns the insurance offered by the RAF. If interested call Chapin.]

Every Square Dance organization needs general liability protection and accident medical expense benefits while conduction and sponsoring dance activities. As closely as safety rules are followed, accidents can and will happen. this insurance program was especially designed for Square and Round Dance groups. It provides for \$1,000,000 Liability and \$10,000 Accident/Medical coverage plus other benefits: such as, Certificates of Additional Insured for special dances (or when required by a property owner) at no additional cost. The latter is becoming increasingly important as more owners of public and private facilities demand that groups show proof of Liability insurance before they will be allowed to use the facility.



LIABILITY INSURANCE

LIMITS OF PROTECTION: \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limit of Liability for bodily injury and property damage per person and/or accident (subject to a \$100 property damage deductible per claim) while participating in scheduled and sponsored dancing activities.

WHO IS COVERED: the club and its members while participating in club or organization sponsored and supervised dancing activities.



ACCIDENT MEDICAL INSURANCE

LIMITS OF COVERAGE:


\$10,000 - Accident Medical/Dental Expense

5,000 - Accidental Death

7,500 - Dismemberment Benefit for loss of both

hands, arms, or eyes. 3,750 - Dismemberment Benefit for loss of one hand, arm or eye.

NOTE: Coverage is excess to any other valid and collectible group insurance covering the same accident.



WHO IS COVERED: Club members while participating in any regularly scheduled and sponsored dancing activity, world wide, including group travel in an approved vehicle operated by a person holding a valid operators license for such vehicle while being transported to or from a covered dancing activity.

WHAT IS COVERED: Accidental bodily injuries sustained while participating in dancing activities sponsored by a recognized club or organization for a period of one year from the date of the accident.



PERIOD OF COVERAGE: The insurance year is January 1, 1989 through December 31, 1989. It is important every club take the policy in December of each year to receive the full 12 months coverage. There is no prorate provision. (This is necessary due to the large administrative expense of maintaining different policy dates.)



COST OF PROGRAM \$1.90 per member per year. All members of a club, as of date of application, must be enrolled.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Roster of club members is required at time of 1. premium payment.
- If a club member belongs to more than one club, they pay only one enrollment fee.
- Any changes in the club roster, either up or down, will not require additional reporting.
- If club members leave the club and fall to join another participating club within 30 days, their insurance coverage ceases.
- Classes sponsored by a club will be covered without additional cost.
- The minimum fee for a club is \$30.00.
- 7. Policy does not cover the Caller and his/her equipment when he/she is calling.
- An Honorary Member or Caller Member of club is covered by this policy when attending a dance as a dancer.
- Name, address and telephone number of each facility anticipated to be used during the year will be required when taking out a policy.
- 10. Approximately 45 days lead time is required to obtain a certificate of coverage for a particular facility not on the original policy.
- 11. Provides \$50,000 legal fees in the event of a
- 12. Picnics, camp-outs, snowtrips, and other nondancing activities are not covered by this insurance. Special and one-event Accident Medical insurance is available.
- 13. Claims must be filed, whenever possible, within 20days of the accident with medical bills attached. Mail claims to Affiliate Insurance Chairman.
- 14. The Death and Dismemberment benefit applies regardless of any other insurance the member may have (death must result from an accident at a bonafide club or organization dancing activity).

For a long time I've been wondering what soft Plus is. In the December 88 issue of **American Squaredance Magazine**, I may have come across the answer.

In his column called "AC Lines", Ed Foote addresses "quasi-Advanced". He says, "Quasi-Advanced means giving one Advanced call, then ten or twelve easy Mainstream or Plus calls, then one more Advanced call, then another dozen easy MS calls". He goes on to say, the true Advanced Dance means stacking Advanced calls, one after another. When a dancer, not used to stacked calls, attempts a normal Advanced Tip, with stacked calls, he will feel the tempo is too fast, and/or feel mental pressure and be dissatisfied with the caller.

live known Advanced Dancers that belong to (and attend regularly) Advanced clubs, but are unable to handle Advanced dancing to other callers and at festivals. Are they too used to quasi-advanced? Another observation is that both Advanced and Plus dancing at festivals usually feel more challenging, satisfying, and non-hesitant. Is that because they are true Advanced and Plus tips?

From this, can I generalize that Soft Plus is like quasi-Advanced in that one Plus call is followed by many Mainstream calls? What are your thoughts on this?

Ed Foote is not advocating quasi-Advanced (nor I, Soft Plus), rather warning dancers of it. Soft Plus and quasi-Advanced sound like great ways to get acquainted with a new program, but they don't prepare dancers for a normal dances in those programs. Perhaps before we consider ourselves Plus or Advanced dancers, we better check to see if we're dancing to stacked calls regularly.

OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA JUNE 22, 23, 24, 1989

38th

Facilities Top Notch at 38th National

The Myriad Convention Center, in Downtown Oklahoma City, will serve as the "center stage" of the 38th National Square Dance Convention. This complex is climate-controlled by computer.

Central to the structure is the Main Arena, capable of holding 270 squares of dancers. Onlookers may enjoy the 12,000 seats circling the entire area.

The Great Hall with its ballroom decor and 16,000 square feet of floor space, will be divided in half by electrically operated soundproof walls, and both areas will house the Round Dancing activities.

The Exhibit Halls will be divided into five dance areas, and one large area for 2/3 of the exhibitors at the Convention. Two larger areas, each large enough to handle over 200 squares, will be devoted to Mainstream and Plus dancing. Other areas will be dedicated to Clogging, Basic, and Youth Dancing. The second Exhibit Hall will be devoted to the remaining Exhibitors.

Myriad Gardens lies just a short stroll from the convention complex. This beautiful botanical garden provides 17 acres of greenery, surrounding the Amazing Crystal Bridge, a cylindrical shaped structure filled with tropical plants and changing floral displays.
