DANCE-O-RAMA CHANGED!

The Dance-O-Rama Committee have announced that this year's D-O-R will be held on the Geneseo campus of SUNY. The campus is in a very scenic location, on a hillside overlooking the wide Genesee Valley, and don't forget that the first week in May is a time when many flowers and much of the green follage are in full swing. The dance facilities are better than we have had in Brockport. Mainstream and Plus dancing will be in the Schrader gym, separated by a very solid wood partition and with bleacher seats at each end. Advance dancing will be in a smaller gym in a building right next to Schrader, with a short covered walkway between. Round dancers will have a beautiful ballroom in the Student Union, just across the road. Round dancers who have attended a summer dance held in Geneseo by the Reillys will be right at home, with both the room and the teachers.

Meals and snacks are available on campus, so there will be no dinner tickets required this year. For those who want to go off-campus, there will be a directory of nearby restaurants. This year there was only one square-dance shop who requested space at Dance-O-Rama: the Carriage House will have a spacious showroom right by the front door.

Of course the travel distance will be greater for folks who live to the northwest of the city, but there isn't very much difference for those on the east side. It will be less for dancers from Henrietta and Avon, and hopefully for folks from the Southern Tier who may be encouraged to come dance at our festival by the reduced travel distance. Besides that, most of the trip from the city is on expressway (I-390), and most of the rest is on a straight, well-paved, and lightly-traveled road (US-20A). The only traffic lights on the whole route to SUNY Geneseo are at the exit from I-390 and at the entrance to the campus itself: no more fighting the traffic and the traffic lights in Brockport and on Ridge Road or Spencerport Road.

The Committee regret having to change the location of D-O-R at short notice, but the decision was forced on them because the folks at Brockport have mechanical problems with the folding partitions and bleachers, and are unable to give us four rooms for dancing. And the Committee hope that you will be as pleased as they are with the excellent facilities at Geneseo.

THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, and club dances, and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that the dancers should know some calls outside of the Mainstream Program? If so, which calls? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction?

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MS Plus designation, he probably assumes that the dancer will be expected to know some of the Plus Program calls. However, which Plus calls does he need to know for that particular dance or caller? (Continued page 4.)



The Web Spinners' Club was founded by Bill and Judy Wilcox in 1967, when they came to the Rochester area from Minnesota. Bill had been a caller and he decided that to keep calling he would see about forming a club. Webster was the town that he picked, as Webster did not have a square dance club at that time. Hence, the birth of the "Web Spinners". Bill was the teacher for the class and caller for the club until he retired in January 1984. Upon Bill's retirement, Jerry Carmen took over the calling and has been with us ever since. Cuers were Rocky and Laurie Maggie; then in 1974 Gordy Copeland became the cuer. In 1984 we lost him and Sylvia to sunny Florida. Since that time Jody Mattice has been our cuer. For their long service to the club, Judy and Bill Wilcox and Gordy and Sylvia Copeland deservedly received honorary life memberships.

Our club has had many homes over the years, but for the last few and presently we are having our dances at the United Methodist Church at 169 East Main Street in Webster. We dance on Friday nights at 8:00 doing the Mainstream and Plus programs, and rounds.

Web Spinners have many special dances during the year: an Octoberfest, Christmas Dance, New Years' Eve Party, Valentine's Day, a style Show, St. Patrick's Day and then, naturally, we close our year of dancing with a Trail's End Dance. As you can see, we are very much a social club and hardly a month goes by without having something to celebrate. We always have a good turnout of members as these special dance, and with the excellent meals that are served It also shows that we have great cooks in the Web Spinners! Members Hilda and Len Fischer even compiled a Web Spinners' Cookbook, which contains our favorite recipes.

During the summer there is usually a family picnic and summer camp-outs for those who enjoy camping.

In addition to the club's scheduled events, the Web Spinners have also joined in many local parades and town events: Firemen's, local churches, Good Neighbor Days, and Fourth of July. We have dances on grass, concrete, and moving floats. There is always a good showing of dancers for these days, which makes them a lot of fun for the dancers and spectators.

We have our own special "Mascot", which was first given to Judy and Bill Wilcox. It was left on their front lawn. A famous (or Infamous) "two-holer". since they received it in 1973, it has been passed around until most everyone in the club has had it at one time or another. Over the years is has been completely renovated. In 1976, the Bicentennial year, it was painted red, white, and blue. Since then it has had new red velvet upholstered seats and a lace paper holder added. Everyone who acquires it puts their names on it and then passes it on to the next unsuspecting victims.

At our dances, one of our guests receives a ticket for free admission to one of our dances that can be used at a later date.

The Web Spinners celebrated their 20th Anniversary last year, and we are looking forward to many more years of dancing together as a club.


The latest publication of the Cailerlab Basic and Mainstream Programs makes it clear with this statement: "There is NO PROGRAM called the Mainstream/Plus program. No dancer is required to know Plus calls to attend a Mainstream open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as Mainstream or Plus, NOT Mainstream/Plus."

Proper program designation help dancers find a dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. Club officers must tell callers what program they are expected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating dance programs. Club officers and dancers need to be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration. Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers alike.

The correct program designations are shown below. Dancers should be able to dance, in accordance with their definitions, the number of basics or movements shown.

- Basic Program(B) - Numbers 1 through 49 on the Calleriab Program approved 3/30/88.
- Mainstream Program (MS) Numbers 1 through 67 on the Callerlab Program approved 3/30/88.
- The Mainstream Program and the Plus (+) 27 calls on the Calleriab Plus Program approved 3/30/88.
- Advanced One (A1) - The above programs and the 37 calls on the Callerlab A-1 Program approved November 1987.
- Advanced Two (A2) - The above programs plus the 42 calls on the Callerlab A-2 Program approved November 1987.
- Basic Challenge (C1) The above programs plus the 69 calls on the Callerlab C-1 Program approved January 1988.

Extended Challenge (C2) - The above program plus the 75 calls on the Callerlab C-2 Program approved March 1988.
