

We have a variety of nice rounds between the squares which are from the mainstream program with some plus tips. We have prizes for dancers on special occasions.


We welcome all visitors and hope to start a program of visiting as many clubs as we can. Take a ride down here some Tuesday night and see how "friendly" a small-townclub can be.

Current Quarterly Selections 4th guarter 10/1/88- Hang a Right (Left) 1st quarter 1/1/89 - Cloverflo 2nd quarter 4/1/89 - Grand Sweep

GRAND SWEEP - Author: Ross Crispino

Definition: Starting formation: Static Square.

Action: Heads part: Flutterwheel, Sweep 1/4, Pass Thru, Partner Trade. Now do the Sides part. Repeat both parts to end at Home.

Heads Part: Face your partner, back awaythree steps and turn on the fourth step to face the Head position, walk forward to meet the dancer coming at you with a Dosado (back to back) and then a Star Thru. Now do the Heads Part. Repeat both parts to end at Home.

Ending formation: Static Square.

Timing: 64 beats.

Emphasis Calls -1st guarter 1/1/89 - Cross Run and Cross Fold

PLUS Current Quarterly Selection - Zip To a Diamond

Zip to a Diamond - Author Dick Han

Definition: Starting formation: From Parallel Ocean Waves.

Action: Ends Trade to become points of a diamond as the Centers Fold and follow the Ends (as in Recycle), but stop halfway when they meet to become centers of the diamond.

Ending formation: Normal Diamonds.

Timing: 4 Beats.

Emphasis Calls -1st quarter 1/1/89 - Crossfire

ADVANCED

Current Quarterly Selections - Counteract -Shadow the Column -Lock the Top

Lock the Top - Author Tim Marriner

Definition:

Starting formation: For Advanced: Call is limited to 1/4 or 3/4 Tag with outsides in couples or mini-waves. For other programs, additional allowable formations include 1/4 or 3/4 Lines.

Action: Centers Lock It as Outsides Single or Partner Hinge, all finish with a Fan The Top.

Ending formation: For Advanced: Will always be parallel waves. When 1/4 or 3/4 Lines are used, ending formation will be parallelograms.

Timing: 6 to 8 beats
