The Copy Cats were formed in 1970 by Xerox Employees who wanted to square dance. The first dances were held in Xerox Building 337 and the first caller, who also gave lessons was Dick Frohweln.

In 1971, the club members applled to the Rochester Area Federation of Square Dance Clubs for membership. Jan and Judy Brederson created the Copy Cats Banner and Russ and Margorle Taber designed the original badges.

The first presidents (1971-1972) were fred and Charlotte Speechio. At that time the club conslsted of nine club couples and seven class couples. Mike Callahan became the regular club caller in 1972 or 1973.

In 1982, the Jim and Pearl "Rathke Award" was established. This award is given each year to the club couple that contributes to most to the club in past years. Also around 1982, the club voted to become an independent club. Until that time membership was open to others, but club officers had to be employees of Xerox. Also about that time, the club moved its dance headquarters from the Xerox Building to the Rochester Christian School on Embury Road in Penfleld.

Today our club consists of 37 couples and one honorary member - Pear! Rothke. Our cub dances are held at the Scribner Road School, Penfield, New York, on the 2nd and 4 th Saturday of the month. Our square dance caller is still Mike Callahan and our round dance cuer ls Roy Keppen. Chip Kellogg is our class instructor. Beginning classes start in September or October and end in April or May. They are held on Tuesday night at 8:00 at the Church of the Good Shepherd (corner of State Road and NY-250) in Webster, New York.

Some special dances are the annual Christmas Dance and Valentine Dance. Other fun events are the Turkey Dance, dessert soclal and Swap Around.

We are always happy to see couples from other clubs join our dances and hope to see you and yours at one of our future dances. Come and join us for square dance fun: For information call 872-1399.

## UNITED SQUARE DANCERS Of AMERICA

The Rochester Federation is a member of the United Square Dancers of America. Organized in 1981, the USDA has grown steadily and now has a membershlp of over 250,000, making it - by fär - the largest square dance organization in the world.

The primary purposes of the USDA are to promote square dancing and to serve square dancers. Outstanding projects to serve square dancers are: providing an economical dancer accident and group liability insurance program, promoting and supporting actlve programs for Handicapable Dancers, developing and distributing educational materials, and promoting a square dance credit card.

## UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA continued

Promoting square dancing must be a cooperative effort. The USDA works at the national level, cooperates with other national organizations, and with state and district organizations.

The USDA worked very hard with other national organizations to secure the passage of H.R. 2067 making the square dance the national folk dance. Since the bill failed to be reported out of committee, the $\mathrm{Na}-$ tional Folk Dance Committee has shifted emphasls to the states. When enough states make the square dance their state folk dance, emphasis will then be returned to the Natlonal Congress.

In promoting square dancing, the bottom line is that much responsibility lies with the individual dancer. We must all work together to keep square dancing allve, well, and growing.
