

We would like to take this opportunity to explain what happened to Dance-O-Rama 1989. About 2:00pm on Tuesday May 02, we received a phone call from SUNY Geneseo informing us that all public events on the campus were canceled until midnight Saturday because of a quarantine that resulted from an outbreak of measles. Although Geneseo is in Livingston County, we contacted State Senator John Perry and Assemblyman Roger Robach's office for any and all information. We also made personal contact with Dr Joel Nitzkin, Health Director for Monroe County, for advice. An immediate emergency meeting of the DOR Committee was called.

At that meeting, we got in touch with the mayor of Geneseo, and set up a meeting with the Athletic Director of the Geneseo Central School. Members of the Committee toured the school on Wednesday afternoon, hoping to salvage Dance-O-Rama by moving it to a different but nearby location that could easily be reached by dancers coming to Geneseo.

Unfortunately, the School Superintendent decided that he could not have the building ready for a group as large as DOR on such short notice, and even if he could, the labor cost would be prohibitive. At this point, the Committee reluctantly concluded that we had no choice but to cancel Dance-O-Rama '89. We feel that we might still have had a Dance-O-Rama somewhere, somehow, if we had had advance notice of 10 days or so, instead of only three. Several people have suggested that it might have been just postponed for a week or two. This is impossible, mainly for the reason that we sign contracts for the date with four callers and a round-dance teacher, two years in advance of the date. Also, it is very difficult to find a place with four large halls suitable for dancing, let alone a fifth that we once had for contraand folk dancing. (RAF members have been searching for a better and more convenient site for DOR for years, and the Committee welcome any suggestions.)

We share your disappointment. Much work is involved in winding things down. Another emergency meeting was held on Wednesday to discuss the details of what needs to be done. We hope our publicity efforts will hold to a very small number the folks who make a fruitless trip to Geneseo. Refunds for tickets that were ordered by mail will be sent out automatically, as soon as possible. Your club president will be advised on how other advance sales will be handled.

We can never thank enough all you great dancers and friends who have been most supportive and helpful. The problem of thanking people publicly is that you are sure to miss someone, but we feel that the square dance community needs to know about the great work done by Andy and Marge Hamlin on signs, Bill and Barb Hossler on sales (86 tickets!), and Tom and Becky Wells with the new graduates and with communications. We truly thank you from the bottom of our hearts.
