



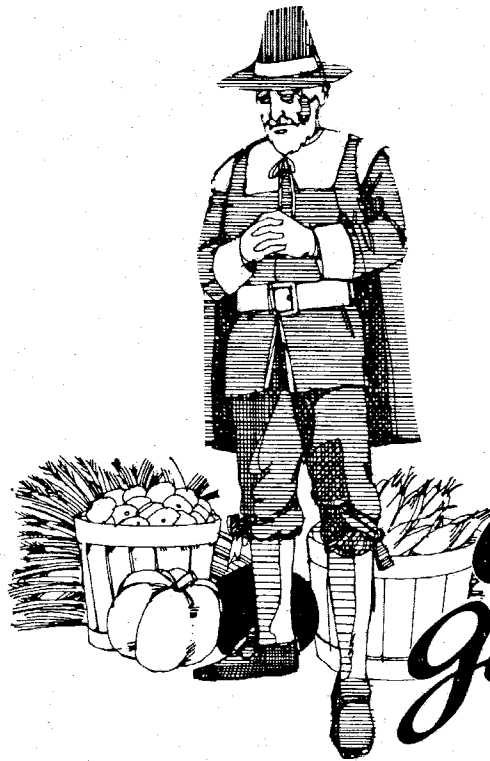

By now all classes have started, sure hope your clubs have many new couples. Our class is doing fine, as usual, but the angles are having troubles.

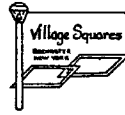

Happy Hoofers

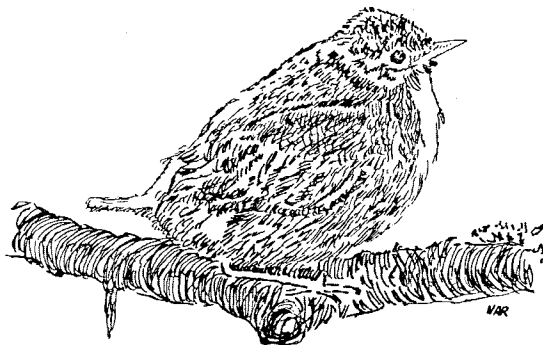
