GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES

It seems as though there are a number of things about square dancing that come in threes, for instance:

• The Three Dimensions of square dancing: Calls --Variety in the ways that a given list of calls can be used -- Dancing.

• Three qualities of good dancing: Smoothness -- Rhythm -- Styling.

• Three kinds of call timing: Too fast, making the dancers rush and shortcut to keep up -- Too slow, making the dancers stop their movement and wait to hear what they're supposed to do next -- Just right, so the dancers can move continuously and easily.

• Three kinds of things that new dancers learn: Information -- Skills -- Values.

• Three kinds of things that the caller says while he is calling: Calls -- Helper Words -- Patter, included for entertainment but not carrying any message for the dancers.

• Three kinds of leaders: The Manager -- The Teacher -- The Authoritarian, or Supreme Boss.

• Three important words that are seldom heard in square dancing: Discipline -- Responsibility -- Humility.

• Three approaches of a teacher to discipline: imposing a strict and rigid discipline -- ignoring it completely -teaching students the rewards and satisfactions that come from self-discipline. -HOH-



Every Square Dance organization needs general liability protection and accident medical expense benefits while conducting and sponsoring dance activities. As closely as safety rules are followed, accidents can and will happen. This insurance program was specially designed for square and round dance groups. It provides for \$1,000,000 liability and \$10,000 accident/medical coverage plus other benefits, such as Certificates of insurance for special dances (including provision for additional insured, or when required by a property owner) at no additional cost. This is becoming increasingly important as more owners of public and private facilities demand that groups show proof of liability insurance before they will be allowed to use the facility.

LIABILITY INSURANCE

Limit of Protection: \$1,000,000 combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence (subject to a \$100 property damage deductible per claim) while participating in scheduled and sponsored dancing activities.

Who is covered: The club and its members while participating in club or organization sponsored and supervised dancing activities.

ACCIDENT MEDICAL INSURANCE

Limit of Coverage:

- \$10,000 Accident Medical/Dental Expense
- \$ 5,000 Accidental Death
- \$ 7,500 Dismemberment Benefit for loss of
- both hands, arms, or eyes.
- \$ 3,750 Dismemberment Benefit for loss of one hand, arm, or eye.

Note: Coverage is <u>excess</u> over any other valid and collectible group insurance covering the same accident. (Continued next column.) (insurance - continued)

Who is covered: Club members while participating in any regularly scheduled and sponsored dancing activity, world wide, including group travel in a commercially licensed common carrier vehicle operated by a person holding a valid operators license for such vehicle while being transported to or from a covered dancing activity which is a minimum of 25 miles from point of origin to destination (one way).

What is covered: Accidental bodily injuries sustained wile participating in dancing activities sponsored by a recognized club or organization, for a period of one year from the date of the accident.

Period of coverage: The insurance year is January 1, 1990 through December 31, 1990. It is important every club take the policy in December of each year to receive the full twelve months coverage. There is no pro-rate provision. (This is necessary due to the large administrative expense of maintaining different policy dates).

Cost of program: Remains a very low \$1.90 per member per year. All members of a club, as of date of application, must be enrolled.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. Roster of club members is required at time of premium payment.

2. If a club member belongs to more than one club, they pay only one enrollment fee.

3. Any later changes in the club roster, either up or down, will not require additional reporting or enrollment fees.

4. If club members leave the club and fail to join another participating club within 30 days, their in-surance coverage ceases.

5. Classes sponsored by a club will be covered without additional cost.

6. The minimum fee for a club is \$30.

7. Policy does not cover the caller and his/her equipment when he/she is calling.

8. An honorary member or caller member of a club is covered by this policy only when attending a dance as a dancer.

9. Name, address, and telephone number of each facility anticipated to be used during the year will be required when taking out a policy.

10. Approximately 45 days lead time is required to obtain a certificate of coverage for a particular facility not on the original policy.


11. Provides \$50,000 legal liability in the event of a fire.

12. Picnics, camp outs, snowtrips, and other <u>non</u>dancing activities are <u>not</u> covered by this insurance. Special and one-event accident medical insurance must be separately arranged.

13. Claims must be filed, whenever possible, within 20 days of the accident with medical bills attached. Mail claims to affiliate insurance chairman.

14. The death and dismemberment benefit applies regardless of any other insurance the member may have. Death must result from a covered accident at a bonafide club or organization dancing activity or an accident during the course of group travel (see definition of group travel).

WHAT IS LEGACY?

Here is an answer given by new Canadian Trustees Bob and Ruth Pereira, in a recent Canadian Square Dance publication.

LEGACY was founded in 1973 by the editors of the three most important square dance magazines in the U.S. at the time - Stan and Cathie Burdick of American Squaredance, Bob and Becky Osgood of Square Dancing (Sets In Order), and Charlie Baldwin of New England Square Dance Caller. These people recognized a need for better communication, cooperation, and coordination among leaders in all aspects of square dance activity dancer associations, caller and round-dance leader associations, publishers, record companies, suppliers, special groups (singles, youth, handicapped, campers, dancers, tour leaders, callers' schools, overseas vacation institutes etc.), and various National Societies and Foundations. Square Dance is, in this context, a generic term that included Round Dance, Contras, Clogging, Heritage, and Country Dance.

"Trustees", as the delegates would be called, would meet every two years to exchange ideas and formulate goals, for Promotion, Protection, and Perpetuation of the activity. Committees would function continuously, coordinating useful programs and offering assistance as needed. The objective would be to operate as a leadership-service-advisory organization, with open channels of communication to and from all square dance organizations.

LEGACY I, held in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1973, outlined specific areas of concern - Leadership Training, Communication, Organization, Standardization, Square Dance Image, Heritage Education, Ethics and Attitudes, Business Aspects.

LEGACY's accomplishments in these areas during its 16 years of operation has been most impressive:

- Establishment of local leadership programs (Mini-Legacies), production of manuals to improve leadership skills, leadership seminars at National Conventions.

- Maintenance of a national "Hot Line" and Dancer/Answer lines in every state and most provinces.

- Maintenance of mailing lists of Associations and Publications.

- Establishment of National Association of Square And Round Dance Suppliers (LEGACY 11 1975) and Roundalab (LEGACY 1V 1979).

- Assistance to solo groups, youth, handicapped.

- Supported and endorsed Callerlab in its establishment of Quarterly Selections as a controlled trial process for new movements, and reduction of complexity and number of basics for a more realistic Mainstream Program.

- Measurement of dancing population and its opinions and desires through national surveys.

- Endorsement of Codes of Ethics, guidelines for proper attire, non-alcoholic and non-competitive status.

- Promotion of heritage awareness, displays and demonstrations to celebrate the US Bicentennial, 1976.

- Endorsement of the National Folk Dance Movement.

- Coordination of September as Square Dance Month; production of "Promo-Kits" and "New Dancer Notes".

- Development of guidelines for sound fiscal practices in square Dance organizations.

Definition: Reverse Dixie Style - Author Unknown

Starting formation: Facing Couples or Facing Tandems

Action: From facing couples, the left hand dancer steps forward and to the right to become the lead dancer in a tandem. Lead dancers join left hands and pull by. Moving to the other trailing dancer, each extends a right hand and touches to a right hand mini wave and turns one quarter. New center dancers join left hands and form a right-hand ocean wave.

Ending formation: Right-Hand Ocean Waves Timing: 6 beats

About the Quarterly Selections...

The purpose of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection is to provide directed variety for the Mainstream program. These calls are not a mandatory part of any program, but are to be used at the caller's discretion. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present. A QS call should be verbally mentioned and, if any dancers don't know it, physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance.

Emphasis Calls: 1st quarter 1989 - Crossfire 2nd quarter 1989 - Anything and Roll 3rd quarter 1989 - Explode And 4th quarter 1989 - Anything and Spread Current Quarterly Selections: 1st quarter 1/1/89 - Zip to a Diamond 2nd quarter 5/1/89 - Slip Out of a Diamond 3rd quarter 8/1/89 - None

4th quarter 11/1/89- Recycle the Diamond

Definition: Recycle the Diamond - Author Doren McBroom

Starting formation: Normal Diamonds (either left or right)

Action: The points Cross Fold as the centers do a Diamond Circulate then Fold.

Ending formation: Facing couples. Timing: 4 Beats.

Current Quarterly Selections:

-Shadow the Column -Lock the Top

Definition: Lock the Top - Author Tim Marriner

Starting formation: For Advanced: Call is limited to 1/4 or 3/4 Tag with outsides in couples or mini-waves. For other programs, additional allowable formations include 1/4 or 3/4 Lines.

Action: Centers Lock It as Outsides Single or Partner Hinge, all finish with a Fan The Top.


Ending formation: For Advanced: Will always be parallel waves. When 1/4 or 3/4 Lines are used, ending formation will be parallelograms. Timing: 6 to 8 beats
