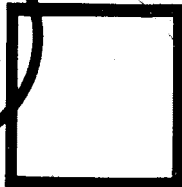

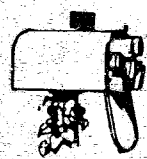

Letter to the Editor

Re: Value of the Federation.

## MAINSTREAM

### Emphasis Calls:

- 1st quarter 1989 - Cross Run and Cross Fold
- 2nd quarter 1989 - Chain Down the Line
- 3rd quarter 1989 - Spin The Top
- 4th quarter 1989 - Cast Off 3/4

### Current Quarterly Selections:

- 3rd quarter 7/1/89 - Grand Sweep
- 4th quarter 10/1/89 - Reverse Dixie Style
- 1st quarter 1/1/90 - Spin Chain & Scoot Thru

Definition: Spin Chain & Scoot Thru - Author Colin Emery

Starting formation: Parallel waves.

Action: Each end and the adjacent center dancer turn 1/2. The new centers of each ocean wave turn 3/4 to form a new ocean wave across the set. Meanwhile, the ends facing our circulate once while the ends facing in move to the center to form a four-person star with the very centers. Turn the star 1/2. Now those who meet cast off 3/4 while the others move forward and out to the ends of new parallel waves.

Ending formation: Parallel waves.

Timing: 16-18 beats.

About the Quarterly Selections...

The purpose of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection is to provide directed variety for the Mainstream program. These calls are not a mandatory part of any program, but are to be used at the caller's discretion. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present. A QS call should be verbally mentioned and, if any dancers don't know it, physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance.

- 1st quarter 1989 - Crossfire
- 2nd quarter 1989 - Anything and Roll
- 3rd quarter 1989 - Explode And
- 4th quarter 1989 - Anything and Spread

### Current Quarterly Selections:

- 2nd quarter 5/1/89 - Slip Out of a Diamond
- 3rd quarter 8/1/89 - None
- 4th quarter 11/1/89 - Recycle the Diamond

Definition: Recycle the Diamond - Author Doren McBroom

Starting formation: Normal Diamonds (either left or right)

Action: The points Cross Fold as the centers do a Diamond Circulate then Fold.

Ending formation: Facing couples.

Timing: 4 Beats.

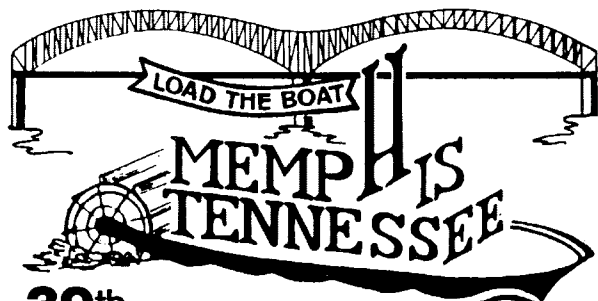

## THE NATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Going to a National Square Dance Convention is an experience equal to none other. The first one that you attend will be best and longest remembered.

Over 20,000 square dancer friends converge to one city to enjoy dancing and its many facets. They are indeed friends and friendly! It's impossible to leave a convention without having made many more friends and having a once-in-a-life-time experience.

The host city goes all out to accommodate the square dancers. Can you imagine hotels filled with square dancers? They're in the lobby, elevators, and on every floor. (Over 6,000 rooms this year are already committed to square dancers.) Can you imagine restaurants filled with square dancers? Every booth and table is filled with square dancers who greet you and are anxious to chat. Buses run to and from hotels constantly. Can you imagine stepping out from a long day of square dancing to a bus waiting to take you back to your hotel? The bus driver has to be congenial as he has no choice! The ride is noisy, fun and always too short.

There is square dancing from 9:00 am to 11:00 pm continuously. There are so many callers that want to call, there is no time to waste trying to fill a square. They just begin calling. Don't worry, your square will fill in seconds and then another square will start to fill. If dancing gets tiring, there's so much else to do! All sorts of panels, discussions, and square dance exhibits, and shops.

When you are traveling to the Convention, it's interesting to see so many square dancers going your route. They are easily identifiable by the square dance flags, or the petticoats in the windows. At rest areas they are the ones smiling and chatting up a storm. It's a good idea to try to arrive at the host city by late Wednesday afternoon. After registering at your hotel, camp ground, or residence, and a relaxing meal, it is advisable to saunter down to the Convention Center to pick up your ticket packet, and "learn the lay of the land". Your packet will contain your program book, official badge, and many other pieces of helpful information. Do take time to plan the major activities of each day. You can only be in one place at a time.

Memphis, Tennessee is hosting the 39th National Square Dance Convention this year, June 28, 29, and 30. It's one of the closer ones. Use the registration form in this issue to register. When you receive the return response, you'll also be invited to many tours, trail-in dances, and other events.

Memphis hosted the Convention in 1980, - talk about southern hospitality! They seem to know how to treat Square Dancers. Everything was expertly planned out - down to the last ice cube. See you there!

## A LEGACY GOAL FOR 1990

A Legacy goal, assigned to a committee headed by Frank and Helen Cavanagh of New Jersey, is to have the Square Dance named as the Folk Dance of each state.

With Square Dance Month and its theme of "A Perfect Pair - Fun and Fitness - That's Square Dancing" now behind us and new classes in progress, Legacy is urging dancers in each state to have Square Dance made their state Folk Dance.

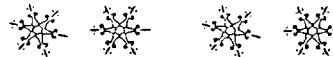
Currently, ten states have recognized the Square Dance as their Folk Dance: Alabama, California, Florida, Idaho, New Jersey, Oklahoma, Oregon, Tennessee, Washington, and West Virginia. Will your state be next?

Only when the majority of states recognizes the Square Dance as their Folk Dance can a new bill be successfully introduced to the United States Congress.

When this is done, square dancers in the U. S. will have established what other nations currently recognize - the American Folk Dance is the Square Dance.

Let's all get behind this effort and make Square Dance the American Folk Dance, first in our own states, and then for the whole country. Every dancer's help and dedication is needed for the campaign.

## LEGACY LOOKS TO THE NINETIES

Legacy members are aware that square dancers are about to enter a new decade, the last of this century. Already the theme for the next Legacy meeting, in Wisconsin in 1991, has been chosen - "Square Dancing Rockets Into the Nineties." These are only a few of the present committee projects now in progress.

Square dancing may see a surge in membership as baby boomers mature in the nineties and seek social activity to contrast with their high-tech job responsibilities. Legacy trustees will seek to prepare themselves and square dancers to meet this moment when it arrives and welcome these new dancers to the activity.

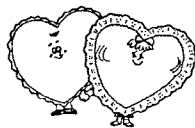

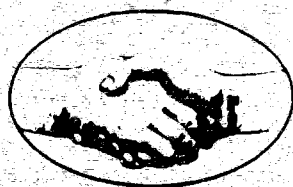

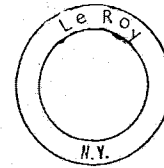
