This list, although harsh and laced with sarcasm, is probably good food for thought for most, if not all, of us.

1. Demand that they attend ALL club dances. If they miss one, don't just welcome them back and let them know you're glad they've come to this dance. Give them a hard time and embarrass them if possible.
2. Make them feel obligated to go banner atealing and retrieving. If they can't or don't want to, make them feel guilty.
3. Intimidate them into joining or chairing a committee or even running for office right away. Give them a lot of responsibility. This will keep them from having the time to get to know club members, dance, and just plain have fun.
4. Force your opinions of other club members, club politics, other square dance clubs, counctl, and all callers on them, especially if your opinions are negative, before they have a chance to form their own.
5. Convince them to start Plus lessons or round dance lessons, or both, as soon as possible, rather than letting them relax, get comfortable with and enjoy Mainstream for a while first.

Letter to Editor
This letter was sent to the Democrat and Chronicle as a letter to the editor. It was not printed, but we have permission to use it and 1 thought it would be of interest to many. -Ed

Dear Editor,
Beginning Thursday evening, November $96 t h$, Rochester was host to over 1000 grade school, high school and college level teachers belonging to the New York State Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance. These wonderful people gathered in our downtown convention facilities for four days of seminars on many subjects.

We of the Rochester Area Federation of Western Round and Square Dance Clubs had the pleasure of welcoming these teachers Thursday evening at the Holiday Inn with a demonstration and workshop square dance called by Louis Flego of Plainview, New York, who is both a teacher and a very accomplished caller. Most of our more than thirty local clubs were represented. We had fun, and so did the many teachers who joined us on the dance floor to learn more about how to teach square dancing to students as part of their school program.

In 1982 President Reagan proclaimed square dancing as the official folk dance of the United States. It is heartening to know that our schools are incorporating this wholesome, health-promoting activity into our young people's cultural heritage.

1. Clubs wishing to take part in Banner Stealling must register with the local Banner Stealing Association of the Rochester Area Federation.
2. Those clubs registering with the Association must have at least one minlature Traveling Banner that will be used for stealing.
3. In order to steal a member club's banner, the Stealing (visiting) Club must have at least four couples (one square), who have paid the visitor's fee at the Host Club. A representative of the Stealing Club must then make it known to the President of the Host Club that they are attending the dance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's banner.
4. In the event that more than one club is in attendance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's only available banner, it will be the duty of the President of the Host Club to determine some fair way to choose which of the Stealing Clubs will be awarded the banner.
5. Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve sald banner by sending no less than four couples to the Stealing Club's dance and then they can take their banner back home. If a retrieving club also wishes to steal the banner of their hosts, they must then have a second four couples in order to be eligible. 6. At no time can a member club allow any other club to take a banner belonging to a third club. Also, when a club steals a banner from a club, it is the recelving club's duty to safeguard at all times the banner they have stolen. If said banner has not been retrleved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (three months), the banner should be returned to the owning club.
6. Banner stealing shall be restricted to regular club dances only, and does not include any speclal dances a club might hold and so designate. In addition to those dances so designated, any dance which has a caller other than the regular club caller shall be a special dance. If a club does not have a regular caller, all dances shall be regular club dances unless so designated.
