This is a reprint of an article from the February, 1981 issue of the Promenader. It is perhaps time this be updated with an addendum I thought didn't have to be said at the time.

The title may seem a little drastic, but, like it or not, clubs do change callers and all too many times this results in broken friendship, dissension and hurt feelings. I hope this article will assist in reducing all this by presenting a reasonable approach that regards the caller as a human being with feelings who deserves common courtesy.

Callers, to begin with, should be professional enough to realize that they can be replaced for no other reason than the club wants to. The club, specifically the board of directors, has an obligation to be direct, honest and timely in their dealings with the caller. It is an unpleasant task to tell someone he is no longer wanted and there is a tendency to hold back and avoid confrontation. Most of the time, the thought of approaching the caller is more terrifying than the act. All too many times I have heard of another caller hired with not even a hint to the current caller or club membership. Perhaps at the last minute a letter is sent terminating him. I have even heard of a caller showing up at a dance and told by the club president upon entering, his services are no longer required and there is someone there replacing him. Upon stating he had contracts and promises, he was told they no longer had any meaning. What little wonder there is bitterness, resentment, and hard feelings! What damage has been done to the club and the square dance activity just for failure to act in a gentlemanly fashion!

For future reference to any who may be concerned, I would like to recommend the following steps be taken.

- If there is a problem discuss it with him. Cal-1. lers are rarely rarely replaced as whim and there is generally a problem, real or imagined, that is at the root. Invite him to a special board meeting and be open. Many times the caller can correct a problem he is unaware of, or point to a solution and things need not go any further. Communication is a valuable tool and is absolutely necessary for good club/caller relationships.
- 2. Broach the question of replacement with the club membership. The membership should be made aware of an impending change and their approval be sought. The board is there to serve the needs of the membership and to run the club smoothly. Such a move should have their approval or you may find your club split in two and in worse shape than before. Our activity should be open and fair to all, and to make such important decisions secretly is wrong. I recommend each club should have a procedure for selecting or changing callers written into their bylaws, then all will be aware of the process.

Be direct and timely when notifying the caller. 3. In the event that differences cannot be ironed out, a caller should not be notified just prior or during a dance, and never by mail. It should be done face-to-face by a selected board member in a situation where the decision can be discussed if desired. It is absolutely unfair to wait until the end of the season because this often ruins the caller's opportunity for an alternate position on that night. Clubs generally hire guest callers, etc. from September to March for the following season. I know a caller who turned down two opportunities to call regularly on a night he currently called for a club. The board didn't notify him he was terminated until June, and by that time the positions were filled by other callers.

approach can be applied to others as well.

<u>Caller to caller relationships in dealing with clubs.</u> What is the potential incoming caller's responsibility? While it's true our caller's association has a code of ethics, club officers need to be aware that individual callers may be totally selfserving in their relationships with clubs and other callers. Beware of the caller that runs down the ability and performance of his fellow callers. Beware of the callers who lays the blame of the club's problems directly on the shoulders of your club caller. Beware of the caller that offers to undercut the fee of your caller. Beware of the caller that offers to solve your problems by taking over. A caller's relationships with his fellow callers is indicative of how he'll treat you. Certainly, the ability to get along is just as important, if nor more, than technical ability.



Some of their activities in the club have included Secretary, Treasurer, Vice-President and they have served as Presidents of the Glass Slippers for the past year and a half.




Lima Grand Squares




panist. Together they run the morning segment of the "Wellness Program" at Churchville-Chili, which consists of aerobics, weight training and swimming.


The dancing season will soon be ending and our class of sixteen will be graduating on May 7. The Belles 'N' Beaus are looking forward to dancing with them.

Guests at our April dance will be the Happy Hoofers of Canandaigua and the Kuntry Kuzzins of Newark.





Country Dancers of Rochester






Spring has sprung, as the saying goes, so let's enjoy! Jack Barnes will start our spring dancing off on April 7.


HOW TO FIRE YOUR CALLER Continued

What is unprofessional behavior between callers with regard to clubs? Unprovoked deliberate actions or words that negatively affects the status of another caller. Caller training programs warn novice callers to avoid taking opportunities to call at the expense of other callers. The following are excerpts from the CCR Code of Ethics:

A caller must not accept a club without first talking it over with the replaced caller. "Taking over" a club which has had problems usually means there are two sides. A caller coming in has problems to start with. It has been proven that if more callers would refuse taking over a club and urging the leadership to reconsider, there would be fewer callers dismissed. This is called loyalty among callers. The eagerness to call at whatever price is not a professional attitude and in the long run does not benefit either the caller, the club, or the square dance movement in the area.

Gossiping about another caller's problems, ability or personal matters is taboo. Callers are always in a position of being asked for an opinicn on other callers' club situations, etc. Regardless of the situation, no caller should ever discuss another caller's problems with dancers.

Hire a caller like you would hire someone to side your house or take out your appendix. Look at his credentials and talk to those who hired him before you. If you can't work as a team with the caller, it doesn't make any difference how good he calls.
