Dear Grads,

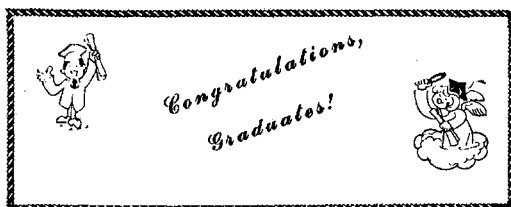
Hope you are as delighted with Western Style Square Dancing as we are! It has many aspects: various dance programs, sewing, art, travel, leadership, service roles, etc.

CHARLIE TUCKER

Our founder, Charlie Tucker, passed away January 11, 1990.

Charlie and Perkio Tucker came to Rochester from Pennsylvania and in 1955 enlisted the help of Waldo and Bea Westwater to form the first adult Western Square-Dance group in the area, which became the Genesee Dancers in 1956. (Ed. note: Earlier in 1955 the Teen Twirlers club was founded by the Westwaters, starting as a group of Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts who put on an exhibition of square dancing at the dedication of the Rochester War Memorial.) The Tuckers very soon became enthusiastic about round dancing, and cued and taught round dancing until they left town. In the late fifties they founded the Fiddle-A-Rounds, and in 1969 the Perk-A-Laders (named for Perkio).

In 1976, they retired to Las Cruces, New Mexico, where Charlie managed a trailer park. Perkio died four or five years ago.

Having been top-notch round dancers, the Tuckers not only taught the steps but included styling, which made the dances lovely to watch.

Those of us, who were fortunate to be taught by them, have missed them, but are happy to have had such fine teachers. The Rochester area square dancers and round dancers owe our founders a debt of gratitude.

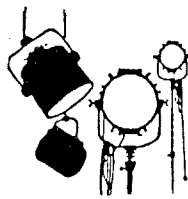
Dear Editor,

Their current goal for square dancing is to revitalize it in Western Wayne County.



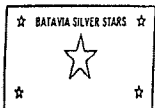
## Copy Cats

## Copy Cats

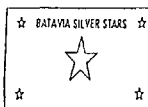

On March 7 our "Corporate raiders" retrieved our banner from the friendly folks at Henrietta Friendship Squares. We'll do some banner stealing in April!

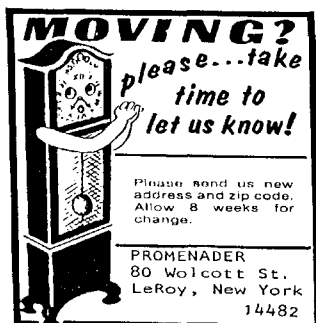
