# THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD 



Wanda and Mike Callahan
The winners of the 1990 Leadership Award

From 1964, when Mike Callahan became a caller, many non-square dancers in the Rochester Area have learned of the activity through programs Mike has presented to various civic and social organizations and his appearances on local television shows. Wanda has a quiet remarkable ability to recognize problems and see common-sense solutions. She is always willing to help where ever she can.

Their contributions are: articles to the Promenader and to national square dance publications, active members of Callers' Co-op of Rochester (Moderators twice, and Treasurers for several years), sound Co-Chairmen for Dance-0-Rama from 1974 through 1076, major participants in the organization and promotion of the Muscular Dystrophy Association dances for 16 years, co-organizers and staff of the irish Children's Benefit Dance since 1985. Mike is also a menber of Callerlab.

Congratulations, Mike and Wanda. Your combined and sustained efforts over so many years have helped build square dancing in the Rochester area to a level that makes it one of the largest and most active in New York State.

## IHE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Each year at Dance-0-Rama, the presentation of the Leadership Award comes as a surprise to many dancers. There are questions about what kind of award it is and how the recipient is chosen. Here are some answers and I hope you will take a minute to submit a nomination to our selection committee.

The award was established in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation to the recipient for extensive and sustalned leadership over an extended period of years in square, round, or contra dancing. Some of the areas of leadership considered are:

1. Years of dancing or calling.
2. Total clup partletpotion (membership, support of activities, and offices held.
3. Rochester Area Federation activities (offices held, committees, support of RAF activities).
4. Dance-0-Rama participation (Chairman, committee chairman, committee, support of activity).
5. Any New York State Association participation (officer, delegate, support of activity).
6. Any National association participation (member, officer, committee, publication, support of activities, including Callerlab and Roundalab).
7. Dance caller or teacher for new dancers, youth, elderly, or handicapped.
8. Attitude: Evaluation of candidates' continuing willingness and success in the ir endeavors, a positive force in furthering the square dance activity.
9. Other leadership roles in functions to enhance square, round, or contra dancing in the community or to benefit the community through the square, round, or contra dance activities.
10. An individual or couple may $w$ in this award only once. If the Selection Committee unanimously agrees that no one meets the criteria, then the award will not be given.

## SELECTION COMMITTEE

The selection committee is made up of: the permanent advisors Frank and Norma Salvagio and John and Daphne Fink (non-voting members), and the last three recipients of the award, with the latest acting as chairman.
