












This-11-That from the Editor's Desk

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Each year at Dance-O-Rama, the presentation of the Leadership Award comes as a surprise to many dancers. There are questions about what kind of award it is and how the recipient is chosen. Here are some answers and I hope you will take a minute to submit a nomination to our selection committee.

The award was established in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation to the recipient for extensive and sustained leadership over an extended period of years in square, round, or contra dancing. Some of the areas of leadership considered are:

- 1. Years of dancing or calling.
- Total club participation (membership, support of activities, and offices held).
- Rochester Area Federation activities (offices held, committees, support of RAF activities).
- Dance-O-Rama participation (Chairman, committee chairman, committee, support of activity).
- Any New York State Association participation (officer, delegate, support of activity).
- Any National association participation (member, officer, committee, publication, support of activities, including Callerlab and Roundalab).
- Dance caller or teacher for new dancers, youth, elderly, or handicapped.
- Attitude: Evaluation of candidates' continuing willingness and success in their endeavors, a positive force in furthering the square dance activity.

- Other leadership roles in functions to enhance square, round, or contra dancing in the community or to benefit the community through the square, round, or contra dance activities.
- 10. An individual or couple may win this award only once. If the Selection Committee unanimously agrees that no one meets the criteria, then the award will not be given.


SELECTION COMMITTEE
