## CLUBS IN TROUBLE

The Y'all Come Square Dance Club is having real problems. Once a 100 -couple club dancing $15+$ squares every Tuesday night, they are now lucky to muster three squares. The only thing that keeps them afloat is the well-attended Beginners Ball they sponsor every spring. This is considered unusual because they were unable to assemble a class for the last two years. Of the last class they had, only one couple out of two squares remained after graduation. Some members are complaining about the level being too low and threaten to leave if it isn't raised. Three members were heard to mutter, if the level were raised, THEY would not be coming anymore. Others say if they had a better caller, the club would grow. Still others say there are too many poor dancers in the group and if the officers would get rid of them, more guests would be willing to come. The nominating committee just reported they could find no one willing to run for office on the board. Party dances were cut back because they could find no one to chair them. So were refreshments because no one volunteered to bring anything. The word was around that all the club people had "done their part" and it was up to someone else to pick up the ball.

## The Spirit of Square Dancing

Contest v.s. Social Activity. Sometimes it's good to sit back and review in our own minds why we are involved in square dancing; what gives us pleasure, why we keep coming back, why we have joined a particular club. We are all involved for different reasons. Some need or desire the constant feel of mental challenge and surprise. They compare their ability to execute calls with other dancers and other clubs. Sometimes they dare the caller to break them down. Others prefer predictable patterns so they can move smoothly and comfortably to well-phrased music. Just as people have different attitudes, so do the makeup of the various clubs, taking on the personality of the dominant members and the caller. The ultimate goal, however, is to have harmony by developing a program that satisfies all the members' wants. Now we know this is impossible, and, in practice, the leadership tends to drive the club in the direction they want it to go. Clubs range between two extremes: social or puzzle-solving. The social groups like to go along at a predictable pace and seem to exist as much for social purposes as well as dancing. The puzzle-solving groups always want something new and appear to resent it if the caller hasn't broken them down a couple of times during the evening. Both groups can exist in a club with one or the other group being dominant.

The Social People. If you are part of the social group, you will resent the caller putting you in what you feel is the opposite sex's position or unfamiliar setups. You will say, "Now what's he doing all that weird stuff for?" An audible groan might be heard from you when the caller announces, "This tip we're going to learn a new call." You have no fear at all sitting out the workshop tip. After all, the others will help you through. However, when you miss a couple of dances, you will fear rejection by other members (the puzzle-solvers) because there will be things called you don't know, and you know some of them will be upset at you breaking down the square. You volunteer readily to be a class angel because you know you can relax.

The Puzzle-Solvers. If you are part of the puzzlesolving group, you feel bored and frustrated if you can't say you've danced something different. On the way home you discuss anything new you have learned during the evening and try to commit it to memory. You probably will attend as many out-of-town guest caller dances as you can at various clubs. You tend to stay away from open houses, class-level dances, and graduations because there's too many breakdowns and, besides, they are boring.

Let's Co-exist. There is nothing at all wrong about being part of any of the two groups just described. In fact, most people are a mixture of both. We need them both, for one group enjoys what we have, and the other explores new horizons. They represent different expectations and desires of what we want to get out of the activity. Callers generally realize this and attempt to compensate, presenting something special during the evening just to please each group. That's why there are 'relaxed' tips and 'hot hash' tips. That's why there is a workshop tip and an occasional evening without anything new being presented. The problem arises

when one group does not tolerate the other. The club that tries to change things to the exclusion of the other group is in trouble.

True Spirit. We say that square dancing is friendship set to music. We say that we are promoting cooperation and not competition. The spirit of square dancing means the club environment should provide e. platform for all these things. There should be no place for competition among dancers. I like to think of square dancing as sharing set to music. Sharing means giving up something so someone else can have enjoyment. We must all learn to give a little as well as take. If some of your pleasure does not also come from helping others to succeed, perhaps you are in the wrong activity - or at least, the wrong club, for you are not an asset to the activity. People who are there for the joy of sharing help create a happy atmosphere. Their enthusiasm spreads. It is to these people we owe the success of our open houses and classes, guests returning time after time, and new members joining our club. If we are a puzzlesolver, we should not insist that each tip be different and challenging and that the club level be raised. If we are social dancers, we should not complain when new calls are workshopped occasionally and the dance level is increased a tip or two during the evening. We also should realize we need each other to fill the squares, so no matter what happens, let's smile and behave like ladies and gentlemen. Emphasize the good part of the evening and the rest will soon become insignificant.

Legacy's Club Leadership Journal has completed its first year of publication, with subscriptions in 41 states, four Canadian provinces, Australia, and Germany. An evaluation form was sent to all subscribers to determine if the Journal is performing as intended. Thirty percent of the questionnaires were returned, a percentage well above the average for surveys of this type. Comments were very positive and several good suggestions were given to improve the journal. Adding a "Letters to the Editor" column was the Number One idea. This column will appear regularly, depending on incoring mail.

Bob and Becky Osgood will become regular contributors to the Journal starting in 1991. They will join the Journalls other regular writers, Walt and Louise Cole and Cathie and Stan Burdick.

Several subscribers asked for two- and three-year subscription rates. Effectiye immediately, Club Leadership Journal will accept subscriptions at $\$ 30$ for one year, $\$ 50$ for two years, and $\$ 60$ for three years. All renewals will be given the opportunity to take advantage of this two and three-year subscription plan.

Several subscribers asked why we don't accept advertising to reduce the cost of producing the Journal. Individual letters were sent to those subscribers who identified themselves, explaining Legacy's "noncompete" philosophy with Legacy members. In brief, Club Leadership Journal does not accept advertising because, if we did, we would be competing for the advertising dollars that are now going to other square dance publications.

In response to requests from dancers, Grenn Records and its own membership, last June at its annual convention Roundalab created a new committee: Standardization of CLassic Dance Cues. Its purpose is to try and arrive at some standard cues for the Classic round dances that traveling dancers will encounter no matter where they are dancing.

Over two dozen leaders volunteered to assist the committee which is chaired by Phil and Royna Thomas of Plant City, Florida. Other Round Dance Leaders from all over the world, as well as the original chorecgrapher, were also contacted during the summer and fall, and asked to submit their cuing words for dances on the Roundalab Golden Classic Listing.

All of their replies were then compared, and compilations prepared using Roundalab-approved standardized cues wherever possible. The revised cue sheets were then sent to the entire committee for another review. Once a cue sheet has been given final approval by the committee and choreographer, it will be pubI ished.

Since we now have established there are many calls that are in the "list" that we don't know well, here is an opportunity to increase our knowledge, hence, RAISE THE CLUB LEVEL. Just as your board of directors was insistent learning the PLUS calls and raising the club level, now is the time to be equally as insistent on learning the MAINSTREAM calls. Maybe we can be a little militant about it. Approach the caller and the club president and say, "If you don't raise the club level and teach us the mainstream calls, I'm going to join another club." Sound like you mean it and put a little fear in them. If you are competent in all the MAINSTREAM calls and you are in a square where people break down on them, say with a little disdain in your voice, "You PLUS dancers should go to a workshop and learn how to dance.", or something clever like, "You can always tell new dancers. They know all the PLUS calls, but screw up the MAINSTREAM calls." This should get a laugh out of your friends. After all, what's so bad about reverse snobbery? I have heard of club executive boards telling the caller to use every PLUS call during the evening. Why not also tell him to use every MAINSTREAM call during the evening. If he has forgotten how to call them, offer him a scholarship to beginners class so he can learn them.

All kidding aside, most callers try to be responsive to what dancers want. Within the caller's capability, you will get what you ask for. Why don't you hear more calls from the mainstream program? Because, like it or not, most people can learn only so much in a given amount of time. In a situation where new people are coming into the club annually, to absorb the PLUS vocabulary, something has to be sacrificed, and that is much of the the mainstream program.

If you truly want to be considered a good PLUS dancer, you must also be able to dance all the programs preceding it at least from the standard positions. May I also remind you that MAINSTREAM dancing is not necessarily easy dancing.
