CARMEN'S COLUMN

## MAKING ANNOUNCEMENTS

You are called upon to make the club announcements. You get nervous just thinking about it; "I'll sound stupid", "They'll all laugh", "I'll forget something." "How will I know what to say?", you think to yourself. It's natural to feel this way for the first time. The secret is PREPARATION. If you are prepared, you will be more relaxed and sound more confident and probably your voice won't squeak.

Begin by asking whoever has done it before, what you should say and take notes. Yes, write it down. try to be concise and to the point without a lot of banter. People will listen, but only so long. At the end of this article is a general outline for club announcements. You can make a form out of this and fill it out each time.

Tell the caller when you would like to talk well ahead of time. Generally, it's best when the floor has just been squared up, but this may differ according to the group. In between tips people are socializing and they hate to stop talking just for you. If you are a strong enough speaker, you can get their attention any time.

Be sure to use the microphone. Amplified sound means you don't have to strain yourself. When you have the microphone in your hand, ask the caller if it is on. If you wish to test it yourself, DO NOT BLOW INTO IT. This ejects moisture into the microphone which eventually is damaging to it. Rather, tap lightly on the windscreen with your fingertip. Hold the microphone about 45 degrees from horizontal and point it directly at your mouth. When you are ready to speak, talk naturally into the microphone, holding it about an inch from your mouth. Say something like, "Good evening folks." The caller will help you adjust the volume if you should need it.

Before you continue speaking, make sure the crowd is quiet. An effective method of quieting everyone is to pause and say nothing. Eventually, most will realize you are waiting for them and the floor will quiet down. When speaking, say everything slowly and deliberately. If you rush, you will not be clear and intelligible. You'll be surprised how easy it is!

When you are done, thank everyone for their attention and hand the mike to the caller or place it gently on the table. If you turned it on, be sure to turn it off.

## SUMMARY OF THE 1991 LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE \& DANCER FORUM:

The conference was held at the Covenant United Methodist Church and was attended by 64 dancers representing 14 clubs and 12 CCR members for a total of 76 . $\$ 34$ was taken in on door donations for hall rent and 40 people stayed for the pot-luck supper. Panelists renresented clubs who were successful in attracting and keeping members and they were there to tell all how THEY do it. Here are the highlights from each club represented on the panel:

BOOTS'N'SLIPPERS - Sid ef Renee Galinsky. three free square dance lessons for class...when selecting officers, a nominating committee looks at who is really interested in the club...make each individual feel as if you wanted them...class dances parallel to club dances... Fun! Fun! Fun! keeps people in club... refreshments at end of dance...telephone people when absent (even if you don't like them)...pay particular attention to guests; make sure they dance as much as they want.

BELLES'N'BEAUS - Ed $\mathcal{H a d}$ fleton \& Ed $\mathcal{D e t a m b l e . ~ 8 0 + ~}$ couple membership...dancing skill not important; create own fun ... 25 year club; many original members left ... Federation should help or assist clubs at their request ... 6-7 squares dance at class (3 class-rest club) ...separate night for class...advertise thru newspapers, malls, word of mouth.

CAYUGA CUTUPS - Don \& Siarian Efínwood. accepts singles or couples...work around weakest link in club...emphasize loyalty to club on its dance night ...promote class during a square dance week; window dressing in area stores...class invited to all parties ...extra review sessions at different members' houses...include other area club in all promotions.
village squares - Harold \& Gerry Scfwartz. sought advice from other clubs... the club raised extra money to keep from folding by "poor box", raffles, silent auction, garage sales...share money goals with club ...caller working with club on fee...sliding scale with hall rent...when selecting officers, find people who are interested in the club...get people involved in club activities.

TECUMSEH SQUARES - Manny \& Eleanor Scfwartz. club went from 9 to 72 couples in three years ..."programmed" fun... caller, cuer considered club members...board meetings are a party...inter-club visitations important... every dance night is a party...pay particular attention to guests...much of what we do has already been mentioned by previous speakers.

The points that were common from all the speakers were:

Accept even the poorest dancers as full-fledged club members and dance with them
Find leaders who are interested in the club
Get people involved in club activities
Have a POSITIVE ATTITUDE - we can do it if we try!
Have club activities other than square dancing
Visit other clubs as a club
Have good board-dancer-caller communication

SUMMARY OF THE 1991 LEADERSHIP
CONFERENCE \& DANCER FORUM: COnt Inued
A lively question and answer session followed. After the pot-luck supper, the hall was cleared by 5:20 PM. Bob Schlenker and I wish to thank the CCR members who helped promote the conference and make it the success it was by urging your club leaders to attend. We also feel that those who xwere not there missed a good opportunity to learn how dancers think about their clubs. It is regrettable that the Federation voted not to support the conference this year (words taken from the Federation minutes). Since this was a forum of dancers talking to dancers, I would have thought the representative of area dancers would be eager to participate in any way they could for the "good of the order".

Re: Federation
We need a change of direction. We are losing dancers and some of our clubs. What's wrong? Probably many things.

Lets' start with lack of promotion. This is the primary job of our Federation. The methods of promotion must be more realistic, such as subsidizing of Teen Age Clubs, as they usually cannot fund a club of their own.

The club presidents should send to the Faderation a resolution for a more active promotion of our teens in the square dance activity. This might also help with the teen drug and alcohol abuse problem.

There is a clause in the By-laws that says: "The Federation shall not interfere with the internal affairs of a Club." This is very negative. It would be more helpful to read, "The Federation will help or assist, on request, any club who is having difficultes."

The structure of the Federation is very cumbersome. There are thirty-four clubs, each having two couples as Representatives. This equals 136 people eligible to give their opinions. This is $33 \%$ more than the U. S. Senate. This can be very chaotic, as there is no way every one can be heard.

The By-Laws and Constitution consist of more words than the U.S. Constitution. If they were rewritten in a more concise and simple lenguage, it could be followed much easier.

The representatives should also bring any issues discussed at Federation meetings back to the Officers of their respective clubs and ask for their input on voting on these issues.
l urge that dancers express their opinions in the Promenader.

Dear Editor,
In his February Promenader article, Jerry Carnen alluded to the perennial dispute between serious chal-lenge-orentated dancers and the more laid-back socializer type. Those in each camp, he sald, may even threaten to leave their clubs unless/if the dance level is raised/lowered. Ron Ehrlich's March article addresses another aspect of this controversy, all position dancing (APD).

Supporting APD, Ron suggested distribution of "written call definitions and call schematics" to class members. So that club members may sharpen their skills, he recommends the purchase of a glossary of rules, besement workshops, and 'digging' in an extra measure of excitement in square dance choreography. I disagree with this, and would like to offer another point of view.

There are, indeed, many who enjoy the additional challenge of APD, but by forcing it on all, we will reduce particlpation in western square dancing to a cadre of ellite "serious unforgiving technically-orentated" dancers. If that is our objective, APD should be taught from day one, to filter out and discourage all but the most competitive and determined class members. (A prerequisite stint in Marine Boot Camp might instill a greater sense of discipline and commitment, in order to control the already high attrition rate.) Tightening requirements for club members would purge clubs of those individuals who only come for a good time, some exercise, and camaraderie. I hope this agenda will not be pursued.

Ron noted that dancers "will really be frustrated If they move on to Advanced and Challenge" levels without a background in APD. Actually, few who enter square dancing have any such ambitions and most will be lucky to survive long enough to reach Plus. I believe most existing and potential dancers prefer an evening of relaxation and socialibility, free of pressure, concentration, challenge, and aggravation. (We have that from 9:00 to 5:00 all week. it's called work and we get peld for itll. They may not dance every week, but do enjoy moving to music, uninterrupted by the inevitable, frequent breakdowns common to all position dancing.

I have also noticed that cless dances are popular with veteran dancers (i,e. Blizzard Ball), and wonder if there is not a largely untapped market for what might be called sub-mainstream dances. While western square dancing has been in decline in recent years, eastern square dances in Geneseo. Hopewell and Pembroke are packed, with many western and former western dancers attending. Eastern dances are easy, and live music provides an extra dimension.

I applaud Jerry Carmen's admonition "Let's coexist" and suggest this possibility. Three-hour dances with a progressive format, beginning with mainstream and extra singing calls, and featuring hot hash and APD in the final hour. The most serious dancers (Jerry's "Puzzle Solvers") may prefer their own APD club until they progress to Advanced.

Square dancing has grown in complexity over the past thirty years, and in my twelve years, mostly due to the promotion of APD. The steady decline in the number of participants during this period, in my opinion, is at least partially related to the complexity issue. If there is no place for easy "fun-level" dancing, even more dancers will 'vote with their feet' - out of square dancing.

Promenader, Friday, March 1, 1991
I feel compelled to comment on Ron Ehrlich's letter in the March issue of the "PROMENADER". Ron apparently has come to the conclusion that the reason why most people leave square dancing is because they are bored and to solve this, the calls should be taught and used from all possible combinations and formations. Certainly, Ron has a point as far as some people are concerned, but how many does it apply to? Increasing challenge and variety exists in the advanced/challenge part of the activity he is currently involved.

If what Ron said was true of most people, then the advanced workshops and APD Plus clubs would be overflowing. Instead, we who are running these sort of clubs find that is not true.

What Ron has missed, being removed from the club scene for a while, is that our greatest attrition occurs after beginners class. Most callers agree we lose most dancers because the dancing is too complicated and they cannot absorb the amount of material required in the time allotted them. Callers have been asking for at least a decade that I know of, "Does the average mainstream dancer consider the challenge of the choreography as part of the enjoyment of square dancing? Why do so many more people stop dancing after completing a class than continue on in the activity?" (quote from ASD, March,1991)

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Our experience has shown us we cannot present the definition of a call and expect dancers to apply it to all situations. Learning to dance a call from a different position is for most people like learning a new call. We have all we can do now to squeak by introducing calls through the mainstream program by graduation time and even then, most dancers cannot dance them smoothly.

Let's assume for a minute that we could teach a class of new dancers to dance all-position through the mainstream program. I would put my last dollar that even though the long time dancers probably would have trouble handling the material, they would not support such a program. There is something magical to most square dancers when you say "PLUS"' and they believe a dance is not truly worthwhile unless these calls are included.

One dancer commented to me how boring the dance would be if we did not have the challenge of constantly changing choreography. I said, yes, if we did not have that feature, for challenge we might have to learn to dance as round dancers do - to the music!

Dear Editor,
I am answering Jerry Carmen's March editorial in which he looks at the many reasons why square dancers drop out, or don't join.

I belleve more attention should be focused on the main reason: that sometimes the actions of the caller, or fellow square dancers are offensive, to the point that the couple will leave the group. This happens all too frequently, and each couple is more or less on their own to deal with it. In many cases, they leave and say to each other, "We don't need this."

I believe there are specific positive approaches in dealing with this. One main way is never offend a person or couple in front if others. If some corrective action is needed, a leader should step aside privately and state the case.

By preserving personal dignity, using reasonable requests and courtesy, the reasons for a couple to leave a group would disappear

Views on Other Topics

- Better ways for newer dancers to "phase in" must be the major issue in keeping dancers and encouraging helpful participation. A caller should always freely agree to a request for a walk-through from any dancer. it doesn't happen all that often and who knows, it might help someone else.
- No-one should be singled out by name for "blowing" a call. In-between tips, the caller should go to the couple or person and by quickly assembling a teaching square, go over the missed call, in a polite way.
- I read the response to the Callerlab Press Release and agree with it.
- 1 find the following quote from Ron Ehrlich's March article unacceptable and reprehensible. "...having the club's dancing quality drop every spring, when a new group of confused, apprehensive graduates is dumped into the club". Just who do they think they are, to make this kind of remark, then wonder why there is a current deciline in the square dance population? To say that 1 am disgusted is putting it mildly!

Everyone wanting to square dance should be encouraged, not put down. This shows complete disregard for personal dignity, and is just plain rude to the many honest folks who are, after all, only guilty of being "new" - and trying to do their best. It does take tine.

People making this kind of negative, degrading remarks should remember they, too, were "new" once. Sincerely, Bob Berray
