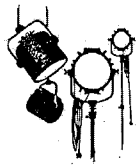

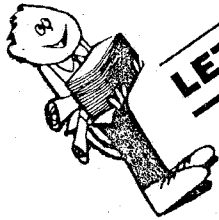

CARMEN'S COLUMN

BECOME A BETTER DANCER

This month we're going to discuss something that has been said before, but needs to be said again. Part of our enjoyment in square dancing is to be able to dance as much of the tip as possible. We do not pay our money to stand around and watch others. Since the square we are in will probably break down one or several times during the evening, the name of the game is RECOVERY. One can tell good, experienced dancers because almost as soon as their square breaks down, they are back dancing again. The sooner the new dancer learns to recover, the greater will be his enjoyment, and the better he will be accepted among the older members. Here are some hints which you should remember:

1. **DANCE WITH YOUR HANDS.** Try to join hands with the people beside you immediately after completing a call. Even a touch helps. By doing this you can know where your partner is and see whether you are in a line, wave, etc. You might also help to orient your neighbor who has lost his direction.
2. **DON'T TURN AROUND** when you are lost. Walk slowly straight ahead or around the outside of the square. Look around to see where everyone else is by moving your head, and extend your hands shoulder high for help. Much shoving occurs because the lost person freezes and keeps his hands by his side leaving nothing for guiding except his back. By extending your hands, you will most likely be led rather than shoved into position.
3. If you miss part of a call, **DON'T RACE THROUGH IT TRYING TO CATCH UP.** Instead, forget the part you missed and try to pick it up where everyone else is.
4. If a person is not in position to do a call and you can't guide them, **DO THE CALL AS IF THEY WERE THERE.** Waiting for that person puts two more people behind and breaks the square down.
5. **LEARN TO LISTEN TO THE CALLER** when you hear a call you have forgotten or never heard of. Most of the time the caller will tell you how to do the call after he has said the name.

Last but not least, if you are a new dancer, always try to get in squares only with people who dance better than you. You will dance more, learn more and have more fun. Good dancers can keep going with only one weak couple in the square, but it is almost impossible with two.

CARMEN'S COLUMN

WHO'S YOUR PARTNER?

You will have less chance of being confused if you know who your partner and corner is in various formations in the square. Here's a glossary defining partners and corners under most situations.

Your partner is:

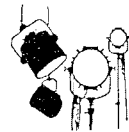
- anyone you SWING
- anyone you PROMENADE,
- the person you meet after doing an ALLEMAND LEFT
- the lady to the man's right as he is facing the center in a CIRCLE
- anyone you start a DO PASO with
- anyone you start a GRAND RIGHT AND LEFT with
- the one next to you in a SQUARED-UP SET
- the other person. on your half of a LINE
- the person facing the same direction as you in an OCEAN WAVE
- the person beside you when all the couples are stacked up such as after WHEEL AND DEAL or DOUBLE PASS THRU

Your corner is:

- the lady to the man's left (clockwise) as he is facing the center in a CIRCLE
- the lady clockwise from the man in a SQUARED-UP SET
- the lady clockwise from the man in ANY formation after the completion of any call.
- if two ladies are standing together facing two men, NOT IN A LINE, the person you are facing is your corner.

Your partner is constantly changing as the square is in motion, so you must be aware whether you are in a line, wave, etc. Remember, you will have a better chance of identifying your partner by joining or touching hands with the people next to you immediately after completing a call to check the formation you are in. Also, by doing so, you may help the one next to you and save the square.

An exception: It is possible not to have a corner or partner such as in a line or circle where two ladies and two men are together. In that situation, if the call is ALLEMAND LEFT, then only the men who have ladies to their left have corners and only they can execute the call. Those men who have corners do not have partners at this point, and vice-versa. The caller often tries to help by saying, for example, "*those who can, allemand left!*" If this seems a little confusing, it is. Whether a person is your partner or corner can literally depend on the next call.

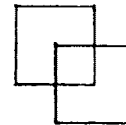
She started dancing almost nine years ago and in the inter-

Our club has been working hard on plus calls and will continue to have workshops between 7:30 and 8:00. If you'd like to brush up you're more than welcome.

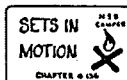
Our Black Light Dance was a huge success. Everyone had a great time and enjoyed dancing under the black light. Thanks to everyone who worked and furnished refreshments.

Sets in Motion

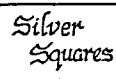
Camping season, 1991, here we come!

The Stardusters will be dancing all summer on Tuesdays at the usual location. Look in your Promenader for the schedule.

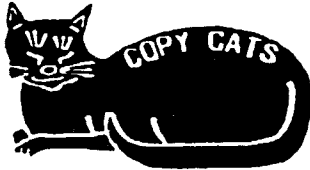

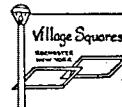
Join us at Dance-O-Rama on May 4. This is a good way to meet friends from other clubs.
