## TRIBUTE TO ART HARRIS



This was going to be an Obltuary for Arthur W. Harris, but "Art" would not like that, believe me. Therefore this is a Tribute to a great man, a great Caller and a Square Dance Legend. Art died August 24, 1991 in his Amherst home.

In November 1942 he enlisted in the Army and served in Asia with the renowned 27th Tactical Unit, known as the Flying Tigers. He survived the flying of the "hump" and the Japanese raids. He was honored with the Purple Heart, Alr Medal, Flying Cross and the Asiatic Pacific Medal. He was a great man.

He started calling in 1949. One night stands in the early 50 's. He continued calling and soon became one of the most sought after callers of the area. He also became an excellent round dance teacher.

In Rochester ( 130 miles round trip, all winter) he called for the Genesee Dancers, the Kodak EKC-O Squares and the Belles ' $n$ ' Beaus. In Buffalo there were the Harris Squares (over 300 couples), the Twirlaways and the T n' Ts. There were others. He couldn't say no.

He was calling seven days a week. Months without a night off. He loved it, making people happy and money was never the object. He said "if it ever stops being fun, l'Il quit".

Then his volce gave out. He had a large callus on his larynx. They operated. He was told not to call for at least six months. Six weeks, no voice above a whisper, he turned up the volume and called. He could call all levels but he always called to dancers on the floor. He said "The object is to have all the dancers dancing." He was a great caller.

His wife Vera was at his side all the way. They have one daughter and three sons. Now all grown up and all are square dancers. He taught one to take his place. Mike Harris is now calling for the Belles ' $n$ ' Beaus and the Harris Squares. Art must be very happy. His dancers are dancing. He is a Square Dance Legend. -submitted by Hal \& Fran Abberger

## LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

There are parts of the Jerry Carmen column in the September issue of the Promenader that should be examined in closer detall. Jerry states that unless a caller uses certain calls from certain positions, that they are, "...gimmicky or illegal." Jerry may certainly be allowed to make that categorization about his own style of calling (which is, for the most part, competent and enjoyable), but dancers should not brand other callers' styles "gimmicky or lllegal," is these callers teach or use calls from uncommon positions. If a caller perceives that the dancers in front of him on a given night can handle and would enjoy a little unconventional positioning, and he can call the material skllifully, then he should, by all means, do so.

Jerry listed a set of calls that have supposedly different movements depending on the sex of the dancer. That is true about some of the calls he listed, but not all. The calis, Star Thru, Slide Thru, Callfornia Twirl, Box the Gnat, and Allemande Left, demand specific action according to your gender, no questions asked. But the rest of the calls jerry lists have no logical dependence on the sex of the dancer: Promenade, Rollaway, Courtesy Turn, Eight Chain Thru, Dive Thru, and Dixie Grand. What are two women who find themselves paired off supposed to do when one of these calls is used. - just refuse to do the calls an demand the set to square up? What is so terrible about two women turning to face promenade direction and walking together around a circle? If you make a general policy statement than dancers never have to think about doing these six calls unless they are in normal sex position, that insults the intelligence of the dancing population, and decreases avallable dancing enjoyment.

Jerry ended his column with the statement, "...whoever sald that square dancing was an exact sclence." While it is true that square dancing is an activity rather than a science, there are "exact rules" about how to do a given call for a set of given positions. By stating that dancing is not an exact science, does Jerry mean that each dancer has his own set of rules, or each caller has his own ideas of how to interpret each call, or that calls are done differently in differing areas of the country? This is simply not accurate, and if dancers suspect that dancing rules are a "Black Art" known only to callers, then this will only allenate them to dancing.

Since we started dancing in 1968, we have probably encountered less than ten calls out of a thousand that have non-exact definitions, and none of those imprecise calls is in the Mainstream or Plus programs. Dancers, take heart, it is possible for you to fully comprehend all the aspects and nuances of the square dancing activity.
