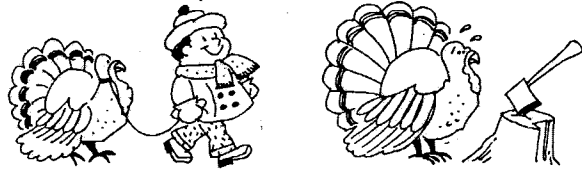

CARMEN'S COLUMN

CLASS LENGTH

I imagine it is discouraging to struggle 9 months on a high learning curve through to graduation only to be told you can't really dance with the club unless you also learn this other group of calls. Not only that, but you must do this during the HOT months when you'd really rather be boating, camping, etc. As a matter of fact, this appears to be the time we lose most of our recent graduates. I always thought it strange that people would attend the class dances faithfully for many months, and be gone within a few weeks after graduation - just like that.

MOST people can only absorb so much at a time no matter how great the instructor is. SOME people can soak up material at an accelerated rate. Evidence of this is MOST people are gone shortly after graduation and SOME people are left. If the frustration of keeping up is too great, they will be gone. There is a dilemma concerning class length and calls to be learned, and it amounts to wanting to have your cake and eat it too. Consider the following facts:

CALLERLAB recommends 40 2-1/2 hour sessions to properly introduce everything through the mainstream program (many callers attempt to do it in half the time).

If potential candidates perceive the class is too long, they will not sign up.

The class graduates and become club members not possessing the ability to dance the repertoire desired by most members.

The class is graduated prematurely because (1) it's customary to graduate them at this time (2) the club needs the members and dance fees to sustain itself (3) the club ceases dancing for the summer.

Some class members have no intention of dancing throughout the summer.

The club decides it wants to dance the plus program (which requires more learning time).

Many members do not want to drop back to level of the graduating class to permit everyone to dance together (but all members agree dance attendance should be increased in their club).

My personal opinion is that any club sponsoring a class should provide its students with sufficient skills to adequately participate in club dances before graduating them. If this means "dropping the level" in the club to permit the new members to progress further, or a longer class time, so be it. In watching new dancers, it takes two to three years to become reasonably proficient to dance through the PLUS program. So, the caller who says he can teach a class to do it all in one season is to be regarded with great skepticism.

I might add, at this point, there has always been a summertime attrition in my memory (since 1967), because after a summer hiatus, some felt they had FORGOTTEN too much and would only mess up squares and look foolish if they returned. This did not create an impact, however, because of the large class sizes in those days (6-8 squares was not uncommon).

In summation, MAINSTREAM is the most new dancers should be taught in their first dance season. If you want your class to stick with you, the club must give something up - it must be either increase the class time or reduce the dance level. This can be a catch-20 situation. Increasing class time can scare away potential members. Reducing the level can discourage some of the more experienced members. Some clubs have attempted to solve this by having a multi-level evening. I believe the wrong way is to have a workshop during club time. This is truly boring to many club members because it forces them to walk through material they already know very well. The best way will ultimately depend on circumstances and what everyone in the club agrees to.

The DALTON GANG

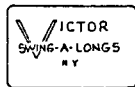
After a summer of dancing every other week, The Dalton Gang held Open House on September 17 and 24. Several new/fun couples participated, and we are looking forward to their joining us.

THE AMERICAN FOLK DANCE OF THE STATES

The American Folk Dance Committee of LEGACY, along with the National Folk Dance Committee of United Square Dancers of America, is making steady progress toward the recognition of square dancing as the folk or official dance of all the states. Legislation has now been approved in 16 states—Oregon, Washington, Tennessee, Alabama, New Jersey, Florida, West Virginia, Oklahoma, California, Idaho, Massachusetts, Illinois, Arkansas, Virginia, Montana and Texas. This project will lead to resubmitting bills to the federal legislature to make the square dance the National Folk Dance of the U.S.A., as it is known throughout the world.

The following states have appointed legislative chairmen to work toward the goal: Arizona, Ed and Harriet Kellen; Colorado, Larry and Pat Loeffler; Connecticut, Matthew Walsh; Georgia, Sam and Carol McClure; Iowa, Norm and Maxine

"OHIO, THE HEART OF IT ALL"

When many dancers first heard "Ohio, the heart of it all" associated with the 41st NSDC we questioned the origin of this theme and wondered why we weren't referring to "Ohio, the Buckeye State." It has become evident, however, that square dancers did not "invent" this catchy slogan. Instead, in 1984 an ad agency was hired by the Department of Tourism and the slogan was born.

Starting this year, in early 1991, Ohio license plates will boast "The Heart of it All" in red letters, and numbers will be in blue on a white background.



State bird - Cardinal

State flower - Red carnation

State song - "Beautiful Ohio"

State tree - Buckeye

Nickname - "Buckeye State"

Motto - "With God All Things Are Possible"

Ohio originally had the motto, "Imperium in Imperio," meaning an "Empire within an Empire." Many people thought that the motto was much too royal and pretentious and it was recalled after a few years. In 1959 the schoolchildren of the state were reminded that Ohio needed a motto. Twelve-year-old James Mastronardo of Cincinnati is credited with suggesting the Biblical line, "With God all things are possible." The motto, from Matthew 19:26, was adopted in 1959.

"Beautiful Ohio," the state song was written by natives of New York and Oregon and not by an Ohioan. The song really paid tribute to the river and not the state. Because of this, the General Assembly attempted to have a contest to have the song replaced, but the people of Ohio overwhelmingly supported the choice of "Beautiful Ohio" - becoming official in 1969.

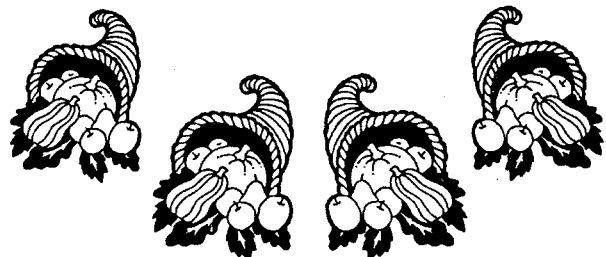

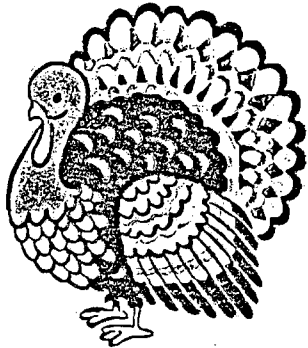
