



LET'S STOP THE BLEEDING!

A man who had been in a bad car accident was carried into the Emergency Ward, bleeding copiously from several wounds. The doctor in charge immediately yelled, "Get all the blood and plasma we have! We're going to neèd a lot of it to keep up with this man's losses." And then he went back to his paperwork until the blood could get there, hoping that it would be enough of it, soon enough to save his life.

How would you like that to happen to you?... Anyone who has ever had any First Aid training knows that the Prime Directive is, "FIRST, stop the bleeding!" Is there a lesson here for Square Dancing?

I have been in a lot of meetings, with experienced square dancers and leaders of all kinds, where the topic was the welfare of the activity. Everyone agrees that square dancing is in bad shape, and something needs to be done. It happened again yesterday (Nov 03), at the Callers' Co-op-sponsored conference (CACOCO for short?). And at all of these meetings the only suggestions for positive action have been to step up recruiting---passing around techniques for yetting more people into our classes. I've got news for you: that blood bank isn't as big as you might like to think.

How many businesses do you know that can start up with a fine blast of publicity, new or completely redecorated premises, and pleasant, eager salespersons, but then survive without any repeat business because the customers weren't satisfied with the merchandise? Maybe we ought to look at what it is that we're selling, and why so many people who do buy it don't stay sold.

I believe that our main problem is the high number of drop-outs (Jack Lasry called them "push-outs") so soon after, or even before, class graduation. I believe this is caused by an attitude that is all too common these days, even, or should I say 'especially,' in Congress and the state legislatures: "We decided last year that this is the right thing to do, and if it doesn't work, it's because we need to put more effort and more money into it, and persuade more people to help us with what we're trying to do." No-one wants to hear the question, "Is it possible that we are mistaken, and doing something wrong?" If we can face and honestly answer that question, we stand some chance of doing something effective about it.

Personally, I will make no effort to get anybody interested in square dancing, because I know what will happen to them unless and until there are some real changes made in the system. I refuse to be a person who sells the poor innocents a bill of goods.



Tecumseh Squares



Fold in chopped butter and strained nuts. Add i babblespoon of brown thugar, or whatever color you can find. Mix well. Grease oven and turn cake pan to 350 gredees. Now pour the whole mess into the cover and bake. Checkthe RUm agin and bo to ged.

Cranberry Crimson Mold

2 packages (4-serving size) or 1 package (8-serving size) JELL-O Brand Strawberry Flavor Gelatin

1 1/2 cups boiling water 1/2 cup MIRACLE WHIP Salad Dressing

1 container (12 oz.) cranberry orange sauce

1 1/2 cups applesauce

Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Gradually whisk salad dressing into gelatin until smooth. Stir in cranberry orange sauce and applesauce. Pour into a 5-cup ring mold which has been sprayed with no-stick cooking spray. Chill until firm, about 4 hours.


