## A View From the Square

An article in the February, 1992 issue of American Square Dance, stated, "... we would need to completely do away with the different programs if there is any hope for square dancing." That same month there was also a "level-bashing" letter in the Promenader. To address the inaccuracies in that letter: the Callerlab lists dated 4-11-90, show 50 calls in the Basic Program, an additional 17 calls in the Mainstream Program, and another 26 calls comprise the Plus Program. This comes to a total of 93 calls Plus dancers should know, not the 108 stated in the letter.

That letter encourages Callerlab to, "... start working for sensible programs that promote fun and sociability instead of competition and ill feeling." In attending dances above the Mainstream Program all over the Rochester area since 1968, I have never detected any attitudes remotely resembling competition and ill feeling. There is just as much, if not more, fun and sociability at Shamrock Squares or Teddy Bears as there is at other clubs in the area.

Variety is the delicious spice of both life and square dancing. 14 out of the 26 Federation clubs dance an advertised Plus Program. No one seems to bash round dancing for having Phases I through VI. It is perfectly acceptable for Round cuers at a square dance to have one low level round followed by one high level round, even though as many as fifty percent of the dancers leave the floor for the second round. Similarly, it shouldn't be out of line to have a dance where square dance tips alternate between Mainstream and Plus, or Plus and Advanced.

The letter also falsely claimed that in 1970 there was virtually only one level (whoops, I meant program). But in 1970 in Rochester, there were club level groups, and then harder groups like K. A. Squares and Lilac Squares, and the Challenge Program was offered by Rochester Rollaways at the Greece YMCA, and Bar-Nothings at the Greece Town Hall. Art Harris called tough dances on Grand Island, Tuesday nights at Twirlaways. All these groups had four squares or more at each dance.

My complaint with Callerlab, is that non-callers are not allowed to vote on policies or call lists. I tried to join Callerlab several years ago, but was told that I could join only as a nonvoting member. Callerlab has no way of forcing any club or caller to structure dances according to Callerlab lists. Call lists exist so that visiting dancers anywhere in the world will know if they should attend a dance advertised at a certain level.

A club should tell their caller which calls to use, and if he does not comply, then a different caller should be hired. If you don't like the list of calls that your club requires the caller to use, then switch to a different club, or start your own club. Stop bashing other people's inalienable rights to dance the call lists that they enjoy. Live and let live. - Ron Ehrlich

Note: The Special Events Calendar was created to eliminate conflicts between club dance schedules and it is unfortunate that two clubs scheduled their club/class dance on the same evening. Perhaps it would be wise when scheduling your Special Event, to consider that some clubs traditionally list their club/class event at the same time every year. To do less than this only diminishes the attendance at both clubs.

#### MORE ABOUT BLEEDING

It's good to see so many responses to my letter on "Bleeding": it means that people are really interested.

Apparently some missed the major point of the letter. They speak of the need to improve Recruiting and Retention, and then do exactly what I mentioned. They bewail the fact that the competition for people's leisure time is greater, or at least different, from twenty years ago. They study ways to increase recruiting, but don't even think about doing something to hang on to more of the new dancers that they do manage to get into a class.

Not only that, but dancer retention has a strong influence on recruiting. Most dance leaders are aware that over 90% of recruits are brought in by personal contact with enthusiastic dancers---that very point has been mentioned in the letters. Dancers who are three years or more out of class have mined all of the possibilities among their friends and associates, and most of their new friends are already dancers. What it takes to maintain recruiting is new graduates who stay in the activity, and bring along a new group of friends who are a fresh source of recruiting possibilities. The early drop-outs are not only themselves lost to the club, but so are the recruits that they should have brought in.

A Positive Attitude toward square-dance problems is all very well, but not if it makes a person blind to facts. This is another thing that I mentioned previously: a strong tendency for people to believe that they are doing everything exactly right. If things aren't going well, it's not because I might be doing something wrong, but because I'm not trying hard enough, or nobody is willing to help me. Some of you may know the story about the optimistic and pessimistic twin boys who badly wanted a pony for their birthday.... Which of them was deep in wishful thinking, and which saw things as they were?

Some of the letters mentioned variety and challenge as an important value to be found in square dancing. Unfortunately, in many parts of the square-dance world this has come to mean learning whole batches of new calls. A good caller can give dancers enough challenge and variety, with a number of different ways of using the Mainstream calls, to keep most graduates happy and interested for at least two years. And a lot of the new dancers have all the challenge they can handle for a year or so, with developing their dancing skills and learning to do easily all the calls they've been exposed to.

#### MORE ABOUT BLEEDING - cont.

This brings us to the topic of "levels", which word too many people use too easily, without considering the implications. Nobody wants to be thought of, or think of him/herself as, a "low-level" dancer. But, the word 'level' is also used to mean the number of calls that a dancer can respond to. The clear implication is that the best dancers are those who "know" the most calls. Not only that, but dancers and clubs don't want to be known as anything before Plus, even if they can do only six or eight calls of the Plus vocabulary. Callerlab says that a Plus dancer is one who is familiar with all of the Plus calls, as well as all of the calls on the Basic and Mainstream lists. It's a matter of some imagined virtue in "having the name", but "the game" isn't important.

A year or so ago, a couple of callers gave their definition of what makes a good dancer, in the Callerlab magazine "Direction." According to them, a 100% dancer is one who can go from his position in the starting formation of a call to his position in the ending formation without making any mistakes. No mention of styling, of smooth and rhythmic movement to the beat of the music, of coordinating his/her movement with the seven other dancers in the set--just get there, any which way. In my opinion, this is one of our biggest problems

In my opinion, this is one of our biggest problems today. Too often, and in too many parts of the country, this is the type of "dancing" taught in the classes, and many learners, after or even before graduation, drop out because they find out that it isn't the fun they were promised when they started the class. The dancers who stay with us are the ones who like it the way it is, and I for one wouldn't think of forbidding them to enjoy whatever kind of dancing they want. But, they should realize that not everyone else is the same as themselves, and would like a different kind of dancing, if they could find it. I believe we would make the activity a lot larger and healthier if we could make room in it for different kinds of dancers.

Another symptom of the problem is, what happens to the learners when they graduate and begin to dance with the club? Do the more experienced dancers welcome them warmly and help them improve their abilities?--let them know that they're not good enough yet to dance with real dancers?--make them learn a whole new bunch of calls in a rush-rush summer course so they can dance with the club in the fall? Most clubs like to think of themselves as a friendly club, but do visiting dancers and their new graduates feel that way? In my opinion, one mark of a friendly club is that it has at least one mixer tip at each regular club dance. Of course, singles' clubs dance mixed most of the time---maybe this is one big reason why they stay healthy.

One last item: I, as a male mature in years, both in life and in dancing, do not like to be called a boy by square-dance callers. I often wonder whether the practice says something about the attitude of a caller toward "his" customers, and whether he really believes the old saying, "The customer is always right."



There's been a great deal of talk about stopping the bleeding. Let's not give a few fine individuals the idea that if they don't look like the rest of us, they are not acceptable. This was a free country in the 1800's. Today, everywhere we turn we find rules, regulations, restrictions, regimentation and Big Brother. Let's not bring that into square dancing and create more bleeding. Just come with a smile on your face, knowing that your friends are delighted to see and participate with you for two or three happy, fun-filled hours.

### CARMEN'S COLUMN

#### Talking with your Club Caller

The club board of directors has had a meeting. A number of items have been discussed and agreed on what they would like the club caller to do or not to do at the dances. The vice president is appointed to approach the caller on these points. In between tips at the following dance he corners the caller and says, "At the board meeting last night we decided we wanted....", and proceeds to enumerate various items.

This is absolutely the wrong procedure, but I have seen it done many times. Do you want a good club to caller relationship? Do you want the caller to feel he is an important part of the club? If you do, NEVER talk to the caller about important issues during the dance. There are two things wrong with this. First, the caller has many things on his mind and you do not have his full attention. Second, the caller might have a very good reason why he does NOT want to abide by your decisions and you have left him no opportunity for discussion. Also, think of your feelings when you are approached with decisions that have already been made that affects a job you think you are doing pretty well ... especially if you think the decision is wrong!

If you consider the caller an important part of the club and you feel the things you are asking him to do are of some importance, then discussion should take place in an atmosphere where there is time to explain your wants and explore other ways of accomplishing them - this is NEVER during the dance time. I think all clubs should have a time where the board and caller get together periodically, discuss the state of the club and exchange information as how to improve the club for all members. If an urgent topic comes up, a get-together over a cup of coffee at a local restaurant after the dance is appropriate. If this is not convenient, what about scheduling a special meeting at another time for this purpose? There is certainly nothing wrong with inviting the caller to your next board meeting.

The discussion should start out, for example, "We have discussed some matters and have have some suggestions. We'd like to know what you think about them...", not, "We had a meeting and this is what we want you to do...." The latter has the air of dictating and is not conducive to the spirit of cooperation you want to inspire. Like it or not, callers are people with feelings too.

Many dancers are afraid of offending the caller by being critical. Of course you may be offending if your approach attacks the person and not the problem. All callers want to do a better job and all callers want to please the people they are calling for. If your suggestions are aimed towards what he can to to make it a better dance, he should not be offended. It is better to bring these things out in the open so they can be discussed. No matter how much he agrees or disagrees with the outcome, at least he should respect the fact he was given the opportunity to participate in the discussion.

#### RON AND REE RUMBLE

Ron and Ree Rumble reside in Lakehurst NJ and have been cuing and teaching round dancing since they met in 1973 at a square dance. They currently teach for two round dance clubs and are cuers for three square dance clubs.

They have been featured as staff members at many festivals, weekends, and special dances throughout many states. They are past treasurers of the Delaware Valley Round Dance Teachers Assoc. and are members of Roundalab. They are ballroom students and study ballroom dancing in order to enhance their round dance knowledge. The Rumbles are also choreographers.


Guess What?
