


Ideas about the new season were exchanged and shared all around. All of the square dancing problems were'nt solved, but a relaxed time was had by all and some new friendships were made.

A View From the Square


We attended a fantastic square dance weekend at the Woodstream Campsite near Gainesville in July. There was a dance Friday night, three dances on Saturday, and one more on Sunday morning. The callers were Ted Whitacre from Rochester, and Mike Jacobs from the D.C. area. Twenty-four couples from New York, Canada, Arizona, Pennsylvania and Massachusetts attended. The three of us stayed in a rental trailer provided by the campground. Since my daughter, Tracy, does not yet dance at the level called that weekend, Mike Jacobs was kind enough to call a special tip just for her.

Mike Jacobs is a full time, "national", traveling caller, who calls more than forty weekends per year. No matter what the level of the dance, his timing to the music is impeccable. His calling style is a direct contradiction to the idea that all advanced and challenge dancing has no rhythm or musical flow. If one square, or even one dancer is having a particular problem with the dance material, Mike tries his best to get that square through the tip. His choreography is exciting whether he is "sight-calling", or calling from notes. Mike called at the New York State convention that was held in Rochester several years ago. His singing call voice is of professional quality.

Ted, Sandy, and Dae Whitacre were the hosts and arrangers for the weekend. They put on at least four weekends a year of this type. Ted and Mike alternated tips at this July weekend. Ted manages a computer department at Xerox in Rochester. Ted and Sandy live near Phelps where they maintain a horse farm. Ted has been calling for well over ten years in the Rochester area, and he calls twice a week for his clubs here. We had a lot of fun with Ted's material at this weekend. If a square did not understand part of the tip, Ted was more than happy to walk that square through the material between tips (usually my square, and usually my fault!). The dancers in Ted's clubs are called Teddy Bears.

Ted is one of a handful of advanced and challenge callers in this area, along with Mike Callahan, Chip Kellog, Bob Stern, Jerry Carmen, and others. Ted has the ability to call up through the C4 dance level. One of Ted's outstanding skills is being able to understand and explain most any complex choreography situation. Ted also has been the author of quite a few new square dance calls over the years.

Survival tip: when you first square your set, take special notice of the dancer of your same sex in the opposite couple. That one dancer is known as your "opposite", and this is important to note when you want to keep your square from breaking down. If your square has correctly danced the choreography, you will always maintain the same symmetric relationship to your opposite. When your setup is parallel waves, your opposite is normally in the other wave. -- Ron Ehrlich

The United Square Dancers of America continues to offer the best available group dancer insurance to the square dance community. Every square, round, clogging, contra, heritage and folk dance organization needs general liability protection and accident medical expense benefits while conducting and sponsoring dance activities.

No Blue Light Special offered in any store can match what USDA offers for the dancers insurance. Only $\frac{2.05}{2.05}$ per person (with a minimum fee for a club of 32.00), gives you a whole year's protection. Here are some other things you may not be aware of:

1. Any later changes in the club roster, either up or down, will not require additional fee until the next renewal date.

2. Classes sponsored by an insured club, will be covered without additional costs during class sessions.

3. An honorary member or caller member of a club is covered by this policy only when attending a dance as a dancer.

4. The policy provides \$50,000 legal liability in the event of a fire, \$1,000,000 personal liability and \$10,000 medical benefits.

5. The accident insurance coverage is excess (secondary) to any other valid and collectible insurance covering the same accident.

6. The policy year is January 1, through December 31.

7. A dancer belonging to more than one club pays only one enrollment fee.

8. All members of an insured club must participate in the insurance program.

9. Picnic, campouts, snowtrips and other nondancing activities, of an insured club, are not covered by this policy.

10. The club must be a member of an USDA Affiliate to obtain the \$2.05 price. If the club is not a member the insurance is available at \$2.70 per person.

11. Approximately 45 days are required to obtain a Certificate of Insurance, that is why insurance applications should be submitted by November 15 each year to assure coverage for January 1.

Each year the insurance program increases. Nationwide, the halls that the clubs are using are asking more and more that the clubs provide their own insurance coverage. It's just impossible for anyone to find a company who will write coverage for a club, and provide all the things that this program provides, for $\frac{52.05}{2.05}$ per person. 


