## A View From the Squope

There is a vast amount of existing feeling by callers and dancers, that much of the material in the advanced and challenge programs is too intricate for the mainstream dancer. But there are several plus calls that still require all my concentration to complete, even with my quarter of a century experience in square dancing. Spin Chain and Exchange the Gears, Relay the Deucey, and Coordinate, are not trivial figures to master. And yet the very same dancers that whine about APD, DBD, and the programs above plus, get through those three calls smoothly and expertly.

The latest Callerlab quarterly selection for the plus program, Box the Top, is an exciting, challenging call, but easy enough to be mastered by plus dancers. Here is the official definition:

From columns;

1. Center four box circulate $11 / 2$
2. The outside two pairs of dancers cast $3 / 4$
3. The three dancers on each end do their part of a fan the top
4. The two centers trade and move up (as in coordinate)
5. Form parallel waves

Let's take a closer look. In step \#1, the center four must be sure to stay in the center area of the square, and they will end up making something that looks like a diamond. At the end of step \#2, there will be a wave of six dancers down the middle of the set. Step \#3 takes these six dancers and splits them into two waves of three dancers each; the outside end dancer of the three will do the end part of fan the top, to become a wave end looking in; the other two dancers will cast $3 / 4$, which is their part of fan the top; they become centers of the final waves. The two dancers who were not in the wave of six do step \#4, and they end up as wave ends looking out. Notice nothing is said here about the sex of the dancers, or whether the call starts from right or left handed columns; this is good, because how well you learn this call should not have to depend on your sex or starting position. Note that if the call starts from right hand columns, it ends in right handed waves, and if it starts from left handed columns, it ends in left hand waves. I hope this experimental gets lots of play, because it deserves to be a permanent part of square dancing.

In the September, 1992, issue of Promenader, an ad appeared that was in poor taste. A dance was advertised, "for couples." The exclusion of singles from any dance in this community should not be condoned. There was a fair amount of hard feelings in the Buffalo area over this issue and we don't need it here. The local federation should take a stand on this matter, to prevent offense to a large segment of our local dancer population.
