WHAT IS A BEGINNER? Beginner square dancers come in assorted sizes and varying ages. One could be a portly grandfather and another the skinny kid next door. Most of the males are good looking and all of the females are pretty. Some beginners take up square dancing to stop being pestered by their friends, even though they know it isn't for them. However they are good enough sports to admit they were wrong.

A beginner still thinks his caller is wonderful, never objects to taking his turn at kitchen duty, considers a visit to another club an outstanding event and finds an evening of square dancing for a couple of dollars is a bargain.

If his square breaks down, a beginner wlll often apologize rather than start telling the other seven people where they went wrong. Most beginners confess that they have one disability--two left feet. Oddly enough, they do not seem to notice that this is offset by their two right hands...Both handicaps disappear around the twelfth lesson.

A beginner is old-fashioned. He thinks he should attend class as regularly as possible, arrive on time and stop talking when the caller is explaining something. ## A View From the Squope

There are very few feelings worse than the ones you get when you join three other couples in a square, and the dancers already there either frown, glare at you silently, or have no greeting for you at all. The only worse situation is when you are one of the first two couples in a square, and you hold up your fingers for one or two more couples, and dancers walk through your square in order to square up somewhere else, or leave the floor rather than square up with you.

I have often seen three couples be forced to leave the floor and skip a tip, even though there are five or six couples sitting apathetically on the sidelines. Sometimes, if you are not a round dancer, you don't have a prayer in the world of getting into a square, when the rounds end. You and your partner took the time and trouble to come to the dance, you paid the entry fee, and therefore you have a right to dance.

Most advanced and challenge dances use a "number" system to ensure that no couple sits out too many times, and that each couple dances with as many different couples as possible. The system works as follows: each couple receives a number as they pay the dance fee. Then before each tip, the caller announces or displays a letter, and the dancers consult a chart, to find out where they dance based on the letter and their couple number. These systems are flexible enough to handle the cases where a couple comes in late or leaves early.

There are variations to the number system that allow "free" tips, so that dancers may choose to dance with specific couples during the dance. A club might have the first and last tips of a dance designated as "free" or "open" (no number system) to allow dancers to rest or join their friends in a square. Another flavor of the system is to have one tip off the numbers followed by two tips on the numbers.

This number philosophy can cure your club of experienced dancers locking recently graduated dancers out of their square. It can help shy, under-confident couples to be paired up with those who can demonstrate competent dancing skills. In larger clubs, the number system introduces couples that would never have made contact otherwise.

In an effort to take the "black art" aspect out of square dancing, callers should be more helpful with instructions in a squared set situation. If the call is heads right and left thru, there is no specific rule (just vague tradition), as to whether the heads should stay in the middle or not. Better callers are using wording such as, "heads dance into the middle and do a right and left thru, and then back away." That way there can be no confusion as to the state of the square following the call. This also allows right and left thru from a squared set to be defined exactly as it is done from facing lines, or from an eight chain thru setup. This makes calls simpler and more fun to learn. -- Ron Ehrlich

I have to disagree with Ron Ehrlich's opinion that a recent mpromenader" ad that advertised a dance "for couples" was in poor taste. Square and round dancing is a couples activity. I know of no club in this area that does not welcome singles to their dances as long as they have a partner for the dance. There is nothing worse for a single person than to come to a dance, pay the admission donation for the dance, and then have to sit on the sidelines for the evening because everyone else has a partner. For the single person with no partner, there are two great singles clubs in this area: Lilac Squares and Cloverleaf Squares.

#### Abstract

I quite agree with Mike Callahan's comments on single dancers. I believe that club members feel a certain amount of resentment at a lone single at a club dance who sits on the sicielines and, by his or her presence, tries to put the blame on them for not furnishing a partner.

Mike did forget to mention another club for singles, even though he calls for it himself: the Silver Squares. Admittedly it is limited to those who have the time to dance on Monday afternoons.

On another tack, I don't think much of the idea of singles asking the management of conventions and festivals to provide a special ribbon or badge. My suggestion is that the national singles' organizations should adopt a permanent "SOLO" badge that each dancer would buy for himself/herself, and wear on any suitable occasion. Following the comments by Carolyn Hebblethwaite in the Cayuga Cutups column, such a badge might also have a mark to identify those who can dance the part of the opposite sex.

When Ron Ehrich lambasted a local club advertising a dance "for couples" in his column in the October issue, I had to look it up in the September issue. It sounded like unmarried people were specifically excluded. It turned out to be an announcement of a workshop by a club that caters to couples (which most clubs do). If Ron thought the ad meant you had to be married and attend with your spouse, he has a point. If he interpreted it, as I did, as meaning people had to have a partner to attend, I think his comment was out of line and unfair and he owes an apology to the club he doubtlessly offended.

To begin with, square dancing is regarded as a couples activity; that is, a partner is needed to participate. Nowhere did it state that singles with a partner were not welcome. In fact, other than one geared to singles, I consider it thoughtless and inconsiderate for an individual to go solo unannouced to any club function, and expect the club to provide a partner. It certainly isn't realistic for someone to go to such a dance and hope there will be someone there for them. This applies especially to a progressive workshop where continuity of participation is necessary. People who attend couples club dances as a solo (and there are many of them) have an understanding with the club and that detail is worked out by mutual agreement.

As a single college ifudeni aik inemioer ui iite unversiiy square dance club many years ago, we came to our own dance as solos, but we never thought of attending an outside dance unless we had partners.

Most clubs advertise their dance fees (or donations if you prefer) by the couple. Many, if not most, restrict their membership to couples. Whether clubs should open their memberships to solo dancers is another issue.

## Chats on Square Dancing - PART 1

I was looking at a letter I sent to a new dancer a few years ago, and I happened to think that it might also be of interest to other dancers, especially those relatively new to the activity. It's rather long, so I have divided it into two parts.

Dear Will,
Seeing you Wednesday evening, I was finally able to associate your name with your face. My (poor) memory was jogged, and I decided it was time to sit down and reply to your letter which I really do appreciate you taking the time to write.

First let me say I'm impressed with the interest and perception you have shown so early in the process. You hit the nail on the head on several points and I'd like to reply in a clarifying manner to fill in missing blanks which you are probably not yet aware of. I am only providing you with information - not answers to problems.

NUMBERS OF SQUARE DANCERS: There are no exact numbers as to how many people square dance western style. What you hear is an extrapolation from various polls and compilations. Regardless of what the actual numbers are, it is generally agreed by CALLERLAB and those that are involved in the national scene that the numbers have decreased significantly in certain areas in recent years. Keep in mind that the greatest decreases are occurring in the populous east and west coasts and in large urban areas. It is in these areas where "plus" level dancing is dominant and mainstream dances are virtually nonexistent. Strangely enough, the central states report their clubs as healthy as ever and claim (in general) that they do not have the problems with class sizes and membership retention that the other areas do. Most dancing (so I'm told) is mainstream with maybe a few plus calls included. They do not have large summer programs and workshops like we do. I suppose some conclusions can be drawn, and indeed, many have been. Here are a few reasons given for the reduction in numbers of square dancers:

Too much to learn ... Class lengih too long ... No good "entry level" program ... Club members unfriendly to new members unwilling to help and encourage them ... Changing society both partners working, high divorce rate, goals of society different than a decade ago ... Popularity of VCRs \& home movies keep more people in (couch potatoes)

DANCER RETENTION: All the things you mention can come under a heading we call dancer retention. Each February the Rochester Federation and the Callers Co-op of Rochester (CCR) sponsor a seminar we call the Leadership Conference. For several years running, dancer retention was the main theme of the convention. Class length, quantity of material to be learned, attitude, courtesy, relationships of class, club, caller and club leadership, involvement of the Federation were all discussed in great detail with many good ideas and suggestions presented. The real problem, as it turns out, is not in deciding what's wrong and what to do about it. The real problem is in implementation, getting a diverse group with narrow goals to work together for the common good. Everyone to a person agreed what our problems were, but no one in sufficient numbers wanted to take the steps necessary to correct them. After several years of this, dancer attitude toward the Leadership Conference was, "if your going to talk about THAT again, I'm not going to come". Our attendance dropped accordingly, and we were forced to change the topics.

I have also noticed that not many clubs will accept singles unless you have a partner. Being a single myself, it makes me angry and disappointed that we are looked upon as outsiders. Some of us are single by choice; others are not. We do have a lot to offer. I have noticed singles are able to find and/or make time to help the club. Where some "couples" have a reason why they can't help out their club, I have taken it upon myself to learn the male part. Now I can help our club finish making that square by asking another single person to dance.

Thanks for letting me bend your ear. If you haven't noticed, it is election time. Please vote. If you don't vote, you have no right to complain. Information Reporter, 315-365-2653 Carolyn Hebblethwaite

The holidays are rolling around fast. We all look for something different to do with that leftover turkey. Here's a recipe you can try and it's always good on cold, gray days. And with ground turkey, calories and cholesterol are reduced!


## Turkey Chili

1/2 lbs. ground turkey
116 oz . can red kidney beans
116 oz . can crushed tomatoes
2 stalks finely chopped celery
1 medium green pepper,
seeded and finely chopped
In a heavy saucepan, heat olive oil and brown meat. Puree onion and garlic together in a blender, adding a little water to make it blend easily. Stir celery and green pepper into the turkey and add oniongarlic puree. Stir a scant teaspoon chili powder into the mixture and add tomatoes. Stir together and lower heat. Cover and simmer 20 to 30 minutes, stirring occasionally, and adding water if needed. Stir kidney beans into the chili and adjust seasoning. Cover and continue cooking 20 to 30 minutes longer.

Garnish with fresh onion and chopped pepper. Serves 8. (Approximately 325 calories.)
