This will be the last column for a couple of months, as many clubs and the Promenader take their summer hiatus. But that doesn't mean that there won't be plenty of dancing at vacation spots or clubs with summer programs advertised in this issue. Most places say, "Casual Attire", in deference to the summer heat but part of the fun of square dancing is the outfit and one way to "dance cool" is to switch from regular square dance skirts with full petticoats and pettlpants to prairle or broomstick skirts. They are becoming to almost anyone, are easy to make, and still give the western feel.

All the pattern companies have several styles to choose from and they can be made up in chambray, light weight denim, calico, or even gauze.

If you want the broomstick style, a light weight poly-cotton works well. To broomstick or pleat the skirt, run it through the complete wash cycle and while damp, on a flat surface, accordion pleat the full length, keeping the heml ine even. Pull a nylon stocking over the pleated skirt and hang to dry. Store your skirt this way also--it helps keep the pleats in place.

Almost any style top works well with a prairie skirt but why not use some of the skirt scraps and make a pocket or short sleeves or a bias ruffle on a $V$ necked T-shirt-cool, easy and a good looking outfit.

If you are traveling this summer, be sure to check out new square dance shops for color trends, styles, and design details. Remember, anything they can sew, you can sew better, cheaper, and with the satisfaction of saying, "| made it myself."

Summer is here and so is $B-B-Q$ season. Have some frlends over and try this recipe on them.

## BUTTERFLIED LEG OF LAMB

16 Lb . leg of lamb, boned and butterflied
2 cloves sliced garlic
$1 / 2$ cup cider vinegar
1 tbsp. butter
$1 / 2$ cup mint jelly
$1 / 4$ cup brown sugar
1/4 cup granulated sugar
1 tbsp. lemon juice 1 tsp. grated lemon rind 1/2 tsp. dry mustard
$1-1 / 2$ tsp. salt to taste pepper
Wash lamb \& pat dry; sprinkle with salt \& pepper to taste, poke with tip of sharp knife all over and insert garlic slivers in slits. In a saucepan, combine vinegar, jelly, sugars, butter, lemon juice and rind. Bring to a boil. Add mustard \& salt. Pour over lamb and marinate 3-4 hours (or overnight), covered \& refrigerated. Before grilling, drain and reserve marinade. Grill over low coals, or medium to low setting on closed gas grill. If you have a rotisserie, place in flat basket and rotate. Grill for about 1 hour (or 3 martinis, whichever comes first.) Turn often and brush with reserved marinade--if using rotisserie, just brush with marinade. Don't let coals flare up. Let lamb stand 10 min. before carving in slices. Serve with potatoes and/or favorite vegetables. Yields 6 servings. Enjoy!

## LEADERSHIP AWARD BACKGROUND

The Leadership Award was established in 1977 by Frank Saivagio and John Fink in honor of their wives, Norma and Daphne. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIYE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OYER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round, or contra dancing. Leadership, service, and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may Include, but are not limited to, years of dancing or calling, membership, committee service, or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra Club, Rochester Area Federation, Promenader, Dance-0-Rama, NYS Association or National Assoclations; promoting the activity through calling or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the square dance activity. Finally, consideration Is given to the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the square dance community.

An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria.

Anyone in the square dance community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award. The Rochester area is blessed with many fine leaders and it would be helpful to those on the Selection Committee to receive input from the square dance community. If you know of someone you feel should be considered, please send a note identifying the individual or couple and their qualiflcations. Send the information to Elsie Epke, 36 Sweden Hill Road, Brockport, NY 14420-2542. Elsie will be serving on the Selection Committee for two more years, and would be happy to present candidates and their quallfications to the committee for consideration.
