## ACEY DEUCEY

STARTING FORMATION:
Ocean Waves (most common), TwoFaced Lines or other formations where there are ends that can circulate without becoming centers.
ENDING FORMATION:

THE ACTION:

From Ocean Waves, the result is waves; from Two-Faced Lines; from Ilnes facing out the result is Lines Facing In (ending position depends on starting position). Ends Circulate as Centers Trade (if centers are both facing the same direction this is a Partner Trade; if ends are both facing in the same direction they will usually pass someone).

## LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

The following is the second part of a partial reprint from June/July 1993 URDC Newsletter:
"LOOKING CIRCLES"

What if there are so many dancers taking Round Dance instruction that two dancing circles are needed? No problem.

Two dancing circles are formed for dancing and when instruction or viewing time-Looking Circle time--is called for, those dancing in the inner circle should return to the outer circle, forming the original "one dancer behind the other" Looking Circle, (By the way, when dancing is resumed after Looking Circle time, dancers should return to the DANCING circle they originally chose or were asslgned to.)

If, as often happens at larger conventions, a particular dance or clinician happens to be very popular, THREE dancing circles may be needed.

In this instance, when a Looking Circle is called for, those dancing in the outer circle nearest the wall and those in the inner circle nearest the center of the hall should join the middle circle of dancers to form the Looking Circle--that is to say those in the outer of the three circles would be moving in toward the center with those in the inner of the three circles moving outward.

There are times when a clinician wants only a quick span of time and will say "retain your places" or "don't form a Looking Circle, this will only take a moment". Dance parthers should immediately stand one in front of the other to allow more viewing space for those behind and around them. They should be careful not to form a solid wall of bodies.

October is the time for Halloween parties. Here is a finger food for which we never can have enough recipes.

## COCXTAIL REUBENS

36 slices cocktail rye bread, toasted
1/2 cup Thousand Island dressing
1 can ( 8 oz. ) sauerkraut, rinsed \& drained
1/4 lb. thinly sliced corned beef
16 oz . pkg. Swiss cheese slices,
each cut into 4 squares
Arrange 9 slices bread on paper towel lined plate. Spread each slice with about $3 / 4$ tsp. dressing. Add small amount of sauerkraut and corned beef to each slice. Top each with one square of Swiss cheese. Microwave at $70 \%$ power level for 1-1/2 to 2 minutes or until cheese melts, rotating plate once or twice. Repeat with remaining ingredients. Enjoy! ## Dance Suggestions for Singles

The following is adapted from an article by Paul Burke of the Washington DC area for contra dancers, but applies to square dancers as well.

Can we build community? Oldtimers: if you see a beginner couple, take another oldtimer and ask them both to dance. Smile and people will like dancing with you more. Once a month dance the opposite sex's part to see what it's like. Each evening it's good to dance with $a$. your favorite partner, $b$. a beginner and $c$. someone who's name you want to know. If you date a dancer and break up, discuss how to divide the dances so each of you goes to some.

Change partners after each dance. New dancers: learn by dancing with good dancers. When you find a good dancer in your square, compliment her or him and ask for the next dance. If you're sitting, ask as soon as the tip ends; Men and women ask; it doesn't mean romance. In counting the next dance, mixers and couple dances don't count.

Can we agree on twirls? Be sensitive to the other's veto. If her left hand presses down at all or is at her waist height or if he keeps their hands low, she won't twirl. If both agree and she twirls, his hand should be above her head and move very little so she can brace against it and twirl herself. Don't crank like a pepper grinder and don't twirl beginners.

Can we dance more to the music? If you tend to finish early or late analyze whether it is you or the caller. You should be taking one step for each beat of music. Figures like GRAND SQUARE require a specific pattern to be followed.

Can we decrease injuries? If you're hurt, say "ouch" and/or go limp. Don't just say it's all right. Admit that it did hurt. By saying something you protect yourself and others. If someone too rough or too strong asks you to dance, it's OK to say no. If you bump someone or step on feet twice at a dance, you may be tired. Think about sitting out or going home. If you're uncomfortable about how someone's holding you, say how you want to be held. Men: holding a stranger very close makes her feel uncomfortable and earns you a bad reputation. Women: if anyone's offensive to you and persists, ask someone in charge of the dance to tell him to stop or leave.

The following New Dancers Blll of Rights was developed by the CALLERLAB Education Committee and adopted by the general membership at the 1988 CALLERLAB Convention in Reno.

## NEW DANCERS' BILL OE RIGHTS

A new square dancer has the right:

1. To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.
2. To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors.
3. To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes, prior to graduation.
4. To receive advice and assistance in acquiring appropriate clothing for square dancing.
5. To instruction and practice using the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call. (Basic, Mainstream, Etc.)
6. To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance program.

As stated above, this "Bill of Rights" was approved by our entire membership. We encourage ALL callers and square dancers alike to help put the FUN and FRIENDLINESS back into square dancing!
