CORNER CORNER ROCHEGYTER AREA FEDERATION ON October 6th, with Gary and Alice Bubel calling and cuing, was attended by dancers



Let's talk about holiday trimming. With all the special dances scheduled at this time of year it's nice to have a new outfit with a festive look. There are many holiday prints, but if your square dance clothing budget won't stretch to an outfit dedicated just to one season, think about Basics and Trimming. Make a plain dress or blouse/skirt combo in red, green, white, or black--and then the fun begins.

1. Baste, using a long stitch on the machine, a holiday colored lace along the skirt bottom, top edge of bottom flounce, along gore seam lines, around sleeves, neckline-anyplace it looks appropriate. When the season is over, it's easy to remove that long stitch and the holiday trim and you are back to your basic outfit, ready to be used for Valentine's Day, Spring dances, etc., etc..

2. Or how about silver or gold lace and trim on black—very chic and perfect for New Year's Eve dances. There are lots of metallics around right now, and with a black background they are elegant.

3. If your dress is red, make a vest from a holiday print and line it with green—very festive.

4. The lame's this year are beautiful. A vest of the pastel multicolored lame' would be lovely over a white or cream dress. Lame' is easier to work with if you fuse a very lightweight knit interfacing to it before you cut it out.

5. Gold or silver lace by the yard is available and a short unlined vest takes only about 1/2 hour to cut and make.

Basics and Trimming use little money, little time but give big results.


AN EXCLUSIVE FROM THE DESK OF YOUR 'ALMOST MISSED THE DEADLINE'' ROVING REPORTER



Second call that the caller barked out was 'CROSSFIRE' and four guys hit the deck!! It was all downhill from there. These callers got to find different names."

An attractive lady added her thoughts to the meeting. "The second call I ever learned was 'CROSS-TRAIL THROUGH,' and that was right after class began. I never heard that call again through Plus class, A1 class, A2 class, and six months of Challenge dancing. Then right in the middle of the New York Dance Championship the sadistic caller piped up with 'cross-trail through' and our whole square fell apart." She was too filled with emotion to continue.

The meeting continued with more stories of confusion and woe. I had to leave to meet this deadline, but the feeling I left with is that LINGUA VERITAS—*truth in language* is here to stay. December is a month of special holidays for many of us. Here is an interesting treat for which we thank our Jewish friends.

SOOFANIYAH

4-1/2 cups white flour	1 tsp. baking powder
1-1/4 cups sugar	1/4 tsp. nutmeg
1 cup fruit juice	1 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. salt	2 eggs
1/4 cup vegetable oil	jelly
vegetable oil for deep-fry	ing

Sift together flour, salt, sugar, baking powder, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Beat together till smooth eggs, oil, and fruit juice (raspberry juice is great, apple juice will do). Add to the flour mixture and stir to make a soft dough. Form dough into flat cakes (about 3 dozen). Place 1/2 tsp. of jelly (again, raspberry is wonderful, but any jam or jelly can be used) in the center of each cake and roll dough to cover jelly, forming a ball.

Deep fry balls in hot (380F) oil for 4-5 minutes. Drain on paper towels. Dust with powdered sugar. Enjoy!

It was nice to see so many of you at the State Square and Round Dance Festival in October. The round







Circul-8-tors

Drivers Need Proof of Insurance

If you are planning to drive to the 1994 National Square Dance Convention in Portland, you will need to be aware of the state and local requirements for vehicle insurance. Oregon requires that all vehicles be insured. In addition, the city of Portland, and other Oregon cities require that a certificate of current insurance be carried. This is an assurance to other motorists that the vehicle insurance has not been canceled or lapsed since the last certification with the Motor Vehicle Division. Police officers may ask for proof of insurance and have the discretionary power to have a vehicle towed from that spot if the driver is in violation of the city ordinance. Pendulum Clock: A Convention Center Crowd-Pleaser

One of the most-asked-about pieces of art in the Oregon Convention Center is not only a work of art; it's a working pendulum "clock" that charts the rotation of the earth. Named <u>Principia</u>, the pendulum's hypnotic motion is a favorite with young and old alike.

Principia consists of a 750-pound hollow brass ball suspended 95 feet above the floor. The ball swings back and forth in arcing motions, influenced by the Earth's rotation. As it swings, it flips up pairs of golden rods, constructed of fishing pole material, which chart the earth's motion by corresponding with the fanciful "map" on the terrazzo floor below. Look for this sculpture at the northwest end of the lower hallway in Concourse A at Oregon Convention Center.




