

Here is a plan for a square dance skirt that doesn't need a pattern. It's the four tier skirt, flattering to everyone and depending on your choice of material and colors, very different each time it is made. It is especially attractive using four shades of one color, with the lightest at the top and the darkest at the hem.

These instructions are for 45" material and use 1/2" seam allowances.

For the bottom tier (#1) you will need 1 and 7/8 yards. Cut seven 9" x 45" strips. Sew the strips together into one long strip. Sew 1/2" hem at bottom edge and gather the top edge by zig-zagging over a cord.


For the next tier (#2) you will need 1 and 1/8 yards. Cut five 7" x 45" strips. Sew them together into a long strip and attach to the bottom tier, pulling up the gathers in the bottom tier to fit. Gather the unattached edge.

For the next tier (#3) you will need 5/8 yard. Cut three and a half 6" x 45" strips. Sew them together into one long strip and attach to tier #2, pulling up gathers to fit. Gather the unattached edge.

For the last tier (#4) you will need 3/8 yard. Cut two 5" x 45" strips. Sew them together into a long strip and attach to tier #3, pulling up gathers to fit. Gather the top edge. Sew the open side seam together and attach an elastic casing waistband. You'll find positioning the gathers will go much easier if you quarter or eighth each long strip, top and bottom, and distribute the gathers between the marks.

This will give you a 23" skirt. If you need a different length, add or subtract from each tier, not just from the bottom.




In January our new officers began their work on the executive board. They are: Co-


Glad to hear Ernestine is improving. She'll probably be back dancing by the time you read this.

CHEF'S CORNER

Well, here we are facing a new year. I hope you all had a

happy holiday season and I want to wish you all a very Happy New Year. Here is an easy one pan dish that is quick to prepare and is good for those cold winter nights.

BEEF-ZUCCHINI DINNER

1 medium chopped onion	1/4 cup water
2 tbsp. butter/margarine	1 tsp. salt
1 lb. lean ground beef	1/2 tsp. pepper
1-11 oz. can cream of toma	to soup
1 medium zucchini	
1 large halved tomato	

In large skillet, melt butter/margarine. Add onion; saute until soft. Add beef and brown. Stir to break up large pieces. Drain fat. Stir in soup, water, salt/pepper. Slice zucchini and tomato. Stir into meat mixture. Cover and simmer for 30 minutes. Serve with warm Italian or French bread.

NOTE: May be multiplied one to three times to ensure generous servings. If desired, you may add some chopped tomatoes to add body. Enjoy!
