be truly missed. We express our deepest sympathy to Gerry and the family—a loss we all share with them. **TECUMSEH SQUARES**




In his free time he loves to golf, or fish and play football with his sons.



DANCING OR FUN?

A while back--December 1992 actually--the American Squaredance Magazine quoted a letter from a caller that was printed in 1982. It said, "Recently, as I was calling a dance, one of the dancers noticed my little badge that has the letters L.P.T.D.B.I.S.D. on it. He asked what the letters meant and I said, 'It's for LET'S PUT THE DANCE BACK IN6 SQUARE DANCING.' He then replied, 'That's great, but I think even more importantly we should put an "F" in place of the "D" and let it mean LET'S PUT THE FUN BACK IN SQUARE DANCING.'"

Now, something about that has bugged me ever since, and I finally figured out what it was. It sounds like that second fella didn't think that square dancing is fun, and now what's bugging me is wondering what sort of thing he thought FUN was if it wasn't the dancing. For one thing, if the dancing isn't important, why bother with the music? It would make things a lot cheaper, because the callers wouldn't need to put money into a lot of expensive records, or pay the big copyright fees to ASCAP and BMI.

If the fun is the fellowship and partying, it doesn't make sense to pay a caller to come in and break up the gab sessions by making everybody get out on the floor and square up. If the fun is in having a common interest, there are a lot of interests that are common to a lot more people than square dancing, which after all is a pretty uncommon interest. Things like charities, excursion trips, hiking, gardening, you name it.

I guess the real answer is the exercise. Line Dancing is getting to be more and more like aerobic exercises every day, and we see a lot more rhythm and moving to the music in the Bally Club TV ads than in a lot of square dancing. The only thing missing is that the square dance clubs don't provide the little stools for the dancers to hop up on and down from.

KEVIN BACON MEMORIAL FUND

Kevin Bacon was a popular square dance caller from Texas who was murdered as an innocent bystander in the Food Court of Irving, TX on Dec. 27, 1993. He was with his wife and two daughters (ages

2 and 4) when a gang-related shooting began. He was killed instantly when a stray bullet hit him in the right temple.

Kevin did not have life insurance. To help his wife, Cyndi and their two daughters, a number of fund-raising square dance events are being planned. In addition, a "Kevin Bacon Memorial Fund" is being established. If anyone of you individually wishes to act, we are being requested to furnish the necessary information below.



CHEF'S CORNER

After bringing this Pate` to the Tecumseh Squares Holiday Party and the New

Year's Eve Party, I received many requests to share it in this column.

CHICKEN LIVER TERRINE

1 qt. boiling water1 celery stalk2 parsley sprigs1 cup soft butter6 whole peppercorns1 lb. chicken liver3/4 tsp. salt1/2 tsp. grated nutmeg2 tsp. dry mustard1/4 tsp. powdered clove5 tbsp. minced onion2 tbsp. cognac1/2 clove chopped garlic1 pinch cayenne

To the boiling water add the celery, parsley, and peppercorns. Reduce heat and simmer 5 min. Add the chicken livers and cook, covered, 10 min. Drain and grind all, using finest knife of food grinder or processor. Add salt, cayenne, butter, mustard, cloves, onion, garlic and cognac. Blend thoroughly. Pack the pate` into a tureen, bowl, or mold and chill thoroughly. Unmold and garnish, if desired, with sliced green olives or chopped hard-cooked eggs. Serve as a spread on buttered toast points or a variety of crackers. Enjoy!

DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD BACKGROUND

The Leadership Award was established in 1977, by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives, Norma & Daphne. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round, or contra dancing. Leadership, service, and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Years of dancing or calling
- 2. Membership, committee service, or officer role in n any of the following: Square, round, or contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; DanceO-Rama; NYS Association, or National Associations.
- 3. Promoting the activity through calling or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dancing activity.
- 4. Finally, consideration is given to candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community.

An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award. If you know of someone you feel should be considered, please send a note identifying the individual or couple and their qualifications. One of the most popular patterns for square dance skirts is the "eight-gore" skirt. If you like to create as well as sew, the eight-gore can be the basis of many distinctive outfits. For example: Cut 8 identical full-length gores or panels from your favorite solid color or one of the luscious new spring prints, add an elastic waistband and a machine hem: 3-1/2 yards + 45 minutes = one new skirt.

Let's invest a little more time and insert double-fold bias tape in a contrasting color, or narrow eyelet in each seam, or ribbon beading on each seam line. Or, fancier yet, cut 4 gores from a solid (maybe green for St. Patrick's Day), 2 gores from a corresponding print, and 2 gores from an eyelet. Place the eyelet center back and center front, one print gore at each side, and the 4 solid gores in between.

Or, cut about 4 inches off the bottom of the gore pattern piece and assemble the skirt in any combination of prints and solids. Then add a 4 inch ruffle to the bottom using one of the fabrics, or make a double ruffle using two fabrics. Or applique or fuse one of the new "cut-outs" on each gore; they range from Mickey Mouse to cats, dogs and hobbies of all sorts. What a great way to let your dancing friends know of your other interests!

By now I hope you can see some of the possibilities. This one little pattern piece has potential! And if you are like me, by the time you leave the fabric store with all your good ideas, you have more potential than

the time to sew them up!


Football and winter sports have come to an end. However, square dancing is a year-round activity. Come join the Circul-8-tors for some of that activity.
